JUNIOR YEAR (2004-05) — Played in 29 games, starting 16...named V Foundation Comeback Award winner for her comeback to play collegiate basketball after suffering a cardiac arrest epsiode on New Year's Eve, 2002...also nominated for the ESPY Award for "Best Comeback"... Everett Herald Woman of the Year in Sports...co-captain...garnered Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention honors...WBCA BTI Classic All-Tourney Team selection...enters her senior season ranked eighth on UW's career list for three-point FG percentage (35.6)...led team in scoring (9.6 ppg) and assists (2.9 apg), free-throw percentage (75.8) and free-throws made (69)...ranked second in steals (44), behind only Emily Florence (50)...ranked fourth on the team in three-point percentage (.333)... second on the team in three-point field goals made with 44, behind only Kristen O'Neill (46)...ranked third on the team in total minutes played (686)...scored in doublefigures 13 times including two 20-point games...tallied a career-high 23 points at Arizona (2/26), scoring 17 in the second-half to spark a 19-0 run that led UW back from a 15point deficit to defeat UA...shot 6-of-9 from downtown versus the Wildcats, both career-highs...named U.S. Bank Pac-10 Player of the Week for averaging 14.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg and 3.0 apg during that trip to the desert...scored 20 points at UCLA (2/3)...made at least 10 free-throws in three games, including a perfect 10-for-10 performance from the line vs. Stanford (1/27)...went 12-for-14 from the line at Utah (12/ 4)...shot 8-of-13 at Oregon (1/13)...ripped a career-high six steals vs. Oregon State (2/10)...presented the Big Dawg Award, Most Inspirational Player, Coaches Award and Lion's Club Assists Leader awards

**REDSHIRT YEAR (2003-04)** – Served as student assistant coach...underwent further medical tests for her heart condition and tested negatively for Long QT Syndrome...granted permission by the university to rejoin the team on Aug. 17, 2004...along with her parents, signed a release form under which they assumed all risks associated with playing basketball and fully released UW from responsiblity for the consequences that could arise from participation in intercollegiate athletics.

SOPHOMORE YEAR (2002-03) - Started first 10 games of the season...suffered cardiac arrest on New Year's Eve, 2002... UW teammates came to her rescue, performing CPR until paramedics arrived at the scene...was hospitalized for one week...had defibrillator implanted in the right side of her chest which will shock her heart back to normal rhythm should another abnormality occur...at the time was diagnosed with Long QT Syndrome which led to her initial retirement from basketball...was a student assistant coach for the rest of the season...led the Pac-10 in three-point shooting percentage (.538) and assist-turnover ratio (3.42), before Dec. 31...averaged eight points and 3.7 rebounds...team's assists leader in four games, rebounding leader in one game...reached double-figures three times including season-high 13 points vs. Boise State...best allaround performance came vs. lowa State with 11 points, career-high eight assists and seven rebounds...Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention selection...named team's Most Inspirational Player.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2001-02) – Played in 24-of-31 games and averaged 5.6 points per game...missed seven games in December with a stress fracture but made an immediate impact upon her return...had a string of three straight games in double figure scoring (UCLA, USC, at ASU), with a teamhigh and season-best 18 (7-of-11) versus UCLA...at ASU, led UW in in scoring with 15 points on 4-of-6 from the field, moving her season field goal percentage mark to nearly 49 percent (21-43/.488) at that point...added a perfect 7-of-7 from the free throw line, a team season-best mark...pulled down a season-best seven rebounds in win at California...passed out five assists in win at Oregon


