## Deep Lineup Paying Dividends for Huskies

After Paige Mackenzie dropped in a birdie putt to complete Washington's sixth-place finish at the 2004 NCAA Championships, veteran Husky coach Mary Lou Mulflur had an interesting thought.

"The fact that we were there with two freshmen and two sophomores and a senior when we walked off that golf course we knew we could do a lot better," Mulflur says.

Based on the team's performance this fall, Mulflur was right.

Ranked fourth by Golfweek entering the spring portion of the schedule, the Huskies have turned in three second-place finishes this season and one third-place showing in tournament action. That list of accomplishments includes a runner-up showing at the Fall Preview. That type of play has generated some high expectations, exactly what Mulflur wants for her veteran team.

"They want the bar high," Mulflur says. "They are the ones that set where the bar is

and they know that we have an opportunity to do something really special. Everything that we do is taking us down that path."

The Huskies certainly have the returning veterans to successfully navigate the road back to the NCAA Championships. There are six letterwinners back from last year's team, including second-team All-American Paige Mackenzie and honorable mention All-American Sung Ea Lee. Sophomores Amber Prange and Ashley Bickerton participated at the NAAs while classmates Amy Wang and Courtney McCracken both saw tournament competition.

The lone freshman, Kim Shin, could have the biggest impact on the team. She led Washington with a 73.25 stroke average in the fall and is ranked 19th in the nation entering the spring.

"This may be my deepest team ever," says Mulflur who is in her 22nd season at Washington. "We've had teams with good

players, but this team, I could throw any five with a school-record 74.09 stroke average. of them out there and we're going to be a back injury forced her to stop playing for successful and that is a great position to be in for months and cut short her sophomore season.

As a coach, Mulflur has a roster with seven players that you know can play for you is really comforting as a coach."

It is also a comforting thought that the Huskies, ranked fourth in the final Golfweek poll of the fall, do not have any seniors on the roster.

Mackenzie did not look like she missed a beat last season while leading Washington

An All-Pac-10 performer in 2004, she was seventh at the NCAA Regional and finished 11th at the NAAs, the best showing ever by a Husky Mackenzie posted six top-10 finishes during the season and picked up her first career victory. She enters this spring ranked 27th in the Golfweek standings.

"Paige's wedge game is really phenomenal," Mulflur says. "When she came back from her injury she was initially limited to putting and wedge play. All of that time has really made a difference and her short game has improved tremendously. Lee was second on the team last year with a 75.03 stroke average that helped her earn second-team All-Pac-10 honors. She was UW's top finisher in three events, including the Pac-10 Championships.

year. She shot 72 and a career-best 70 during the final two rounds of the NCAA's to contribute to UW's sixth-place finish.

McCracken was ninth at this year's Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational and has lowered her stroke average by six per round from her freshman campaign. She appeared in five tournaments as a freshman. ~~and~~ played in six tournaments as a freshman and had her best outing this fall with a 25th-place finish at the Ihlanfeldt Invitational.

Shin's start is one of the best ever by a Husky. She led Washington with an eight-place outing in her debut at the Fall Preview and topped the Huskies with a sixth-place effort at the Ihlanfeldt. Last summer she capped her junior golf career by reaching the second round of match play at the U.S. Amateur.

"She was easily one of the top five freshmen in the nation this fall," Mulflur says. "From the get go she has been steady. She's very tough mentally, she knows her game

Lee capped her fall campaign by finishing second at the Las Vegas Collegiate, her 11th top-10 performance. In 12 rounds she posted a 74.33 stroke average which has her on track to post her best season as a collegiate golfer.

"What impressed me the most about Sung this fall was in back-to-back tournaments she went deep under the par in the last round," Mulflur says. "She is capable of shooting those kinds of numbers. She works hard and is a good kid with a huge heart."

Prange was an honorable mention All-Pac-10 pick as a freshman after posting a 75.93 stroke average. She played her way into the top-10 three times and posted a pair of rounds in the 60s.

Bickerton, who is a member of Canada's National Amateur Team, came up big for the Huskies in postseason play last

very well; what she can and can't do. For the most part she sticks to those lines when she plays."

With the NCAA Championships scheduled for the Sunriver Resort in Bend, Ore., a course familiar to the Huskies, Mulflur hopes to find the right combination that will allow the Huskies to better last season's sixth-place finish.

"Certainly Paige, Sung and Kim solidified themselves as the top three. Our four through seven players, it is almost like you go four a, b, c and d. They are that close and they are all that good. It does not seem to matter which five, we played with different line-ups all fall and we still ranked in the top four in the country. Not a lot of teams can do that and be that productive consistently. I think we are all excited to get going in the spring."

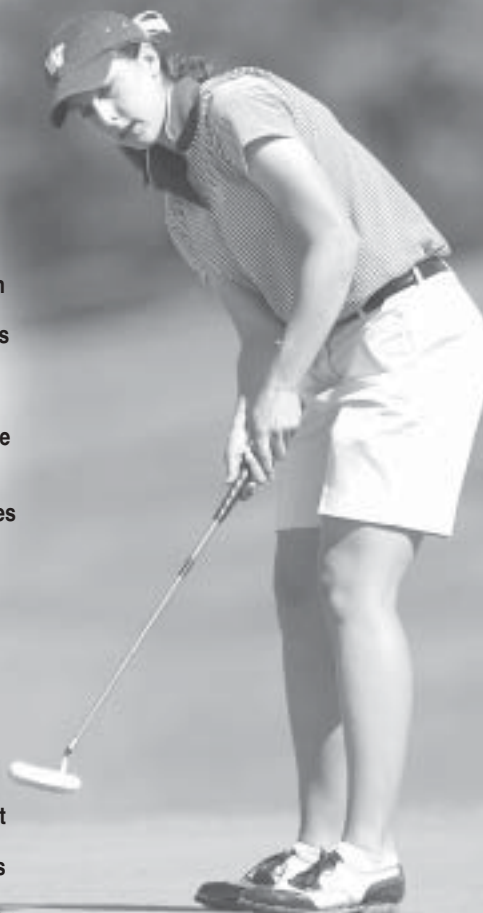

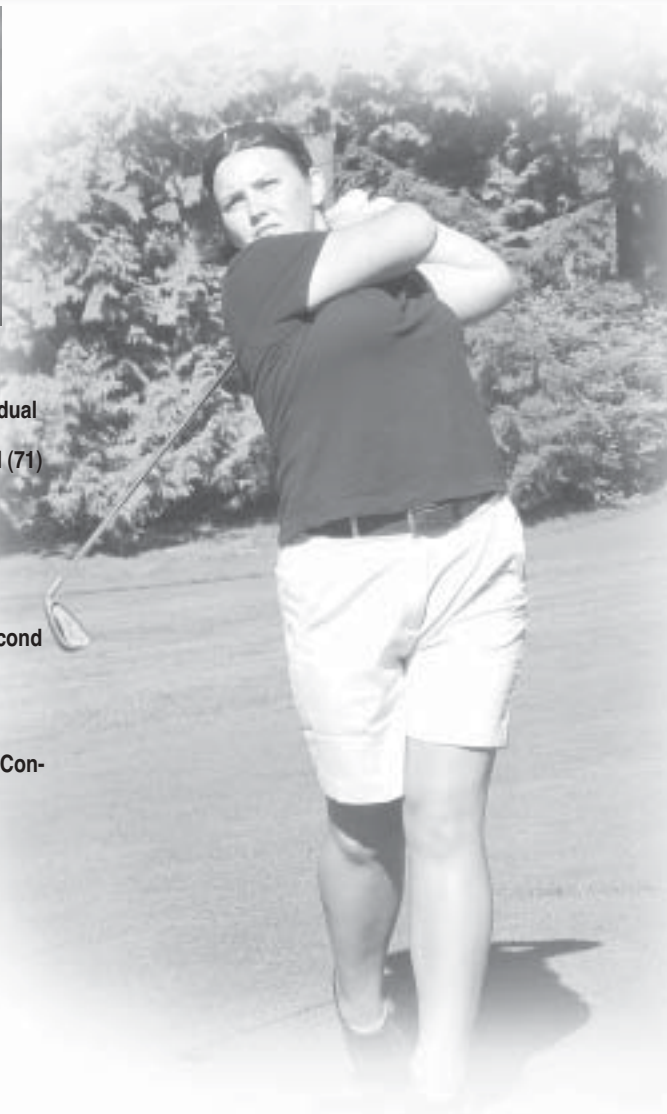

## Mary Lou Mulflur

### Head Coach 22nd Season

- Longest tenure of any current Husky coach in any sport
- Played in the U.S. Open in 1979 and 1980

- One of the first female student-athletes to receive an athletic scholarship from Washington
- Coached eight players who have earned All-Pac-10 honors
- Coached seven players who have been named NGCA All-Americans
- Had 12 players earn NGCA All-Scholar Athlete honors 21 times
- Coached UW to six NCAA Championships appearances
- Coached current California head coach Nancy Kessler-McDaniel and current assistant coaches Kelli Kamimura (Pepperdine) and Kari Sampson (Washington State)
- Inducted into the Portland Interscholastic League Hall of Fame in 2004

In the history of the Husky women's golf team, two individuals stand out as the cornerstones for the program. The first is Edean Ihlanfeldt, the namesake of the Huskies annual fall tournament. She was Washington's first coach. So dedicated to seeing women have an opportunity to compete on the intercollegiate level, Ihlanfeldt never accepted a paycheck for her efforts. She funneled her salary back into the program. The second is current head coach Mary Lou Mulflur, who is in her 22nd season directing the Huskies.

A player for Ihlanfeldt, Mulflur's passion and commitment to Husky golf makes her former mentor proud. Mulflur's dedication, teaching skills and fundraising abilities have allowed her to build the Husky program into one of the nation's most competitive teams on an annual basis.

Last season Washington experienced one of its greatest campaigns, finishing sixth at the 2004 NCAA Championships. It was the highest finish ever by a UW team at the NAAs. The Huskies were led by sophomore Paige Mackenzie, who placed 11th at the national championships and was named a second-team All-American. Classmate Sung Ea Lee was named an honorable mention All-American. They became the fifth and sixth Husky golfers under Mulflur to earn All-American honors.

Washington's success at the NCAA Championships has slowly been building the past few seasons. The 2004 season was the 12th consecutive year the Huskies have advanced to an NCAA Regional Championships.

In 2001 Mulflur led Washington to a 16th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. At the time, it was the best showing by a Husky team at the national championships. UW's

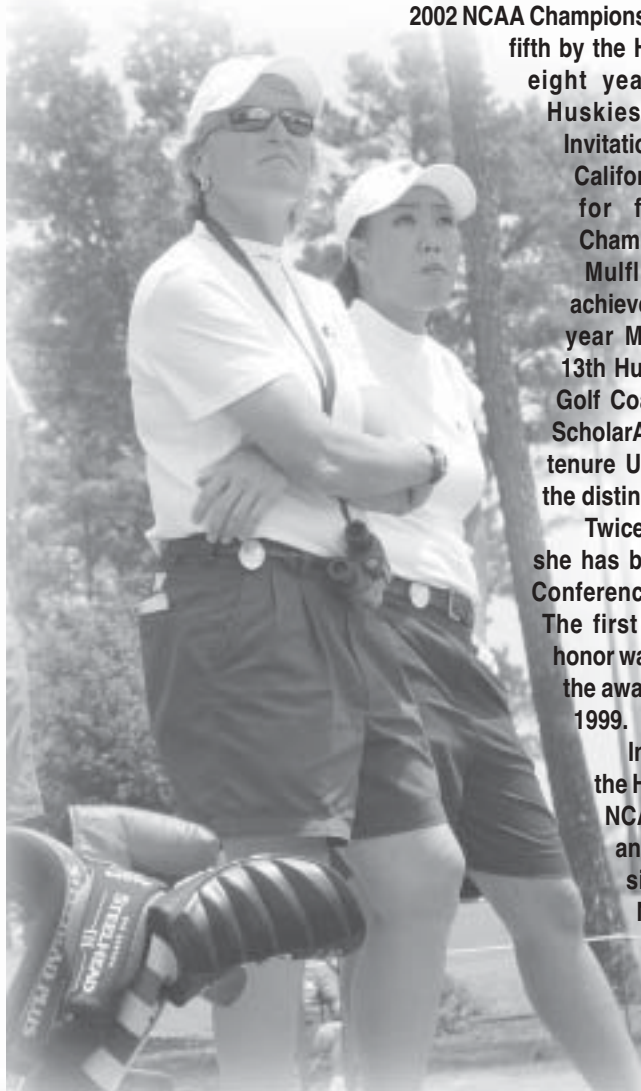
2002 NCAA Championships appearance was the fifth by the Huskies over a stretch of eight years. That season the

Huskies won Oregon Duck Invitational and the Peg Barnard California Collegiate and tied for fifth at the Pac-10 Championships.

Mulflur's players have also achieved in the classroom. This year Mackenzie became the 13th Husky to be named to the Golf Coaches Association's All-Scholar Athlete team. During her tenure UW golfers have earned the distinction on 20 occasions.

Twice during Mulflur's career she has been named the Pac-10 Conference's Coach of the Year. The first time she received the honor was in 1988. She picked up the award for the second time in 1999.

In 1995, Mulflur directed the Huskies to their first team NCAA Tournament appearance on the strength of a sixth-place finish in the NCAA West Regional. In 1988, the UW had its best Pac-10 finish ever, placing third in the conference tournament. That year brought







Mulflur her first Pac-10 Coach of the Year award.

Mulflur has coached several Husky players who have gone on to play professionally or coach. Nancy Kessler McDaniel, who played at UW from 1984 to 1987, went on to play on the LPGA tour and is now the head coach at California. Former Husky American Kelli Kamimura is an assistant coach at Pepperdine and Kathleen Sampson is an assistant at Washington State.

Mulflur regarded as one of the most successful golfers to come out of the UW came to Washington in 1976 and was one of the first female athletes to receive a scholarship at Washington. The Portland, Ore., native went on to earn four letters as a Husky.

Before her career was over, Mulflur won three regular-season tournaments, including the inaugural Ihlanfeldt Invitational in 1980 — a feat only surpassed by Kelli Kamimura.

While attending Grant High School, Mulflur won state high school titles in 1974 and 1975.

She also won the 1975 Oregon junior championship.

Mulflur added the Southern Oregon titles in 1980, 1982, 1995 and 1997 to her list of accolades. She achieved another milestone during her playing career in 1979 and 1980 when she competed at the U.S. Open Championship. In addition she competed in four National Collegiate Championships, and three U.S. Amateur Championships.

Mulflur graduated from Washington in 1980 with a degree in speech communications. She is former vice-president of the National Golf Coaches Association and served on the LPGA SAFECO Classic Advisory Board. She has appeared as a celebrity player in several local golf events and fundraisers.

In October of 2004, Mulflur was inducted into the Portland High School Hall of Fame.

# Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational

The 54-hole Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational is a Washington annual fall tournament held at Sahalee Country Club in Sammamish, WA. The event is named for the founder of the Washington women's golf program.

The 2004 Ihlanfeldt Invitational was the 23rd in the event's history. Oklahoma State swept the team and individual honors.

The eighth-ranked Oklahoma State Cowgirls won the 2004 title at 35-under 899. Washington and Oregon tied for second at 918. Oklahoma State was led by the one-two finish of Karin Sjodin and Annie Thurman. Sjodin's victory was her second straight after taking medalist honors at the Fall Preview. She posted a 2-under 70 for a three-day total of 3-under 213.

## Edean Ihlanfeldt

Edean Ihlanfeldt is the woman responsible for launching the women's golf team at Washington, and she never took a dime for the job she loved so much during her coaching career. When Washington expanded its athletic lineup to include women's sports, Kit Green hired Ihlanfeldt, one of the area's top players, to coach the Huskies. Armed with an envelope of names and addresses of women who signed up to play, she started the program in 1974 before retiring seven years later in 1981 at the age of 50. During her seven-year coaching career, Ihlanfeldt never accepted payment for her coaching duties. Instead, she donated her salary back for scholarships for three of her teams and five individuals qualified for the NW championships. During her tenure, Washington was the only Northwest team to qualify for the nationals. Ihlanfeldt was no stranger to championship golf. Her list of victories included five PNGA titles, six Montana State championships, three Washington State titles, four Seattle City championships, the trans-Mississippi title and the Canadian Open Championship. She was the only player to win the Seattle, Okla., Washington and PNGA tournaments in the same year. The Washington women's golf program named its fall golf invitational in her honor.

The Washington women's golf team crushed the school scoring record by 24 strokes to finish second to top-ranked Duke at the Stanford Intercollegiate.

Duke shot 285 on Sunday to win the tournament at 19-under 845. Washington carded a final-round score of 290 to finish five strokes behind the Blue Devils.

Washington's overall score of 850 bettered its previous best 54-hole total by 24 strokes. The Huskies set their old scoring mark of 874 at the Stanford Intercollegiate in 2001.

The 10th-ranked Washington women's golf team opened its spring season with a victory at the 14-team Bay Area Classic held at Boulder Ridge Golf Club in San Jose. The Huskies shot 629 over 36 holes to defeat New Mexico State by 15 strokes.

The fifth-ranked Washington women's golf team continued its streak of top finishes during the fall by placing third at the Stanford Intercollegiate. Washington shot 3-over 283 during the final round, the best third-round score ever by a Husky squad. Washington's 283 was the second-best single-round score of the tournament. The Huskies completed the 54-hole tourney at 21-over 861. It marked Washington's third straight top-three finish this season.

Arizona State, ranked ninth, took top honors at 12-over 852. Pepperdine placed second at 857 and fourth-ranked UCLA was one stroke behind Washington.

Washington junior All-American Paige Mackenzie posted the Huskies' best tournament score of the year finishing fifth at even-par 210. That score equaled her best gross score as a collegiate and ties as the second-best 54-hole score in UW history. Mackenzie carded her other 210 at the same tournament in 2003. Last year the Stanford Course played at par-71, but was shortened after last summer's renovation.

Mackenzie opened the tournament by shooting 3-under 67 to tie her career best single-round score. It also equaled Kelli Kamimura's record as the best first-round score in UW history. Mackenzie's finish was her 12th top-10 effort in her career, which ranked fourth on the Husky all-time list.

Junior Sung Ea Lee also posted a top-10 finish for Washington thanks to a career-best single-round score of 67 to tie her career best single-round score. She tied for sixth at 2-over 212. It was her 10th top-10 showing, ranking her sixth on the UW's all-time list.

Husky freshman Kim Shin shot 72 on Sunday to place 20th at 219. Courtney McCracken had a final-round score of 73 and was 61st at 229. Amber Prange placed 69th at 233.

For the third time in four outings this season the third-ranked Washington women's golf team posted a second-place finish in tournament play. The Huskies carded a school record for a third-round score, shooting 280, to climb up from fourth place at the Las Vegas Founders Collegiate at Anthem Country Club. Washington was led during the final round by junior Sung Ea Lee, who shot 68 to finish second overall.

The Huskies entered Wednesday's final round of play trailing tournament host UNLV by 12 strokes. Washington closed more than half of that gap by shooting 8-under 280 to pass Texas Tech and Stanford for its third runner-up finish of the season. The Huskies finished at 16-over 880 while the host Rebels won the tournament with an 8-over score of 875. UNLV shot 287 during the final round.

The Huskies' 280 was the best single-round score posted during the three-day event. It was also the best single-round score of the season by the team and ties as the best 18-hole score in school history.

Lee's 68 gave her a 54-hole total of even par 216. She missed tying UNLV's Hwanhee Lee for medalist honors by a single stroke. The finish equaled Lee's best tournament showing as a Husky. It marked the second consecutive tournament Lee carded a round in the 60s.

Washington freshman Kim Shin shot 2-under 70 to place ninth overall at 4-over 220. It was her third top-10 finish as a Husky. Junior All-American Paige Mackenzie carded a 1-over 219 and was 24th overall at 9-over 225. Sophomore Ashley Bickerton also finished the day 1-under and concluded the tournament in 35th place at 12-over 228. Her score equaled her best single-round of the season. Sophomore Amy Wang tied for 35th with a 4-over 76.

# Husky Golf Historical

## Judy Hoetmer

### Washington's National Champion

Before there was a women's varsity golf program at the University of Washington, the school produced a national champion in the sport. In 1961 Judy Hoetmer won the National Collegiate Golf Championship. A junior at the time, Hoetmer was a member of the University's golf club from 1959 to 1962. She was the Pacific Northwest Junior Champion in both 1957 and 1958. As a senior at Washington, Hoetmer finished second at the NCGC. In 1988 Hoetmer was inducted into Washington's Hall of Fame. She is one of a handful of inductees who never earned a varsity letter at Washington.



## Robin Walton

### The First Husky All-American

Robin Walton enjoys the honor of being the first NGCAA All-American in the Husky program's history. In 1977-78 she led the team with a 78.3 stroke average. It was during the postseason she excelled. Playing at the 1978 AIAW National Championships at the Grenelefe Golf and Racquet Club in Cypress Gardens, Fla., Walton helped the Huskies to a 14th place finish by placing eighth in stroke play. She carded rounds of 75, 79, 74 and 74 to top the Husky scoring effort.



## Kelli Kamimura

### Repeat All-American

Kelli Kamimura became the second Husky to repeat All-American honors. She was selected by the NGCA in 1999 and 2001. Kamimura was a three-time All-Pac-10 performer, earning that distinction for the 1999, 2001 and 2002 seasons. She was third at the 2001 Pac-10 Championships, the highest finish ever recorded by a Husky and placed 29th that season at the NCAA. The best showing by a UW golfer at the time. Kamimura led the Huskies in stroke average in 1999 (74.5), which established a single-season school record. She bettered that mark in 2001 when she posted an average of 74.3.



## The First Huskies

### Washington's 1975 Team

The first team in UW women's golf history was comprised of eight individuals and coached by Edean Ihlanfeldt. Their schedule included six tournaments, primarily playing against Northwest opponents. The Huskies defeated Oregon on April 22 in their first event led by Patty Marquette. Beth Thorlakson and Chris Aoki both received individual invitations to the 1975 AIAW Championships. After opening with back-to-back rounds of 79, Thorlakson advanced to the finals where she shot 82 and 72. The roster for the 1975 team included Aoki, a senior from Redmond; Thorlakson, a junior from Bellevue; Karen Denma, a senior from Monroe; Kathleen Freeman, a junior from Walla Walla; sophomore Janis Litton from Puyallup; Marquis, a freshman from Kent; Lisa Porambo, a sophomore from Bothell; and Janis Wellman, a freshman from Osburn, Idaho.



## Huskies Debut at NAAs in 1995

Following a sixth-place finish at the NCAA West Regional in Arizona, Washington qualified for the NCAA Championships for the first time in 1995. Played at the Landfall Golf Course in Wilmington, N.C., the Huskies tied Oklahoma for 16th in their inaugural NCAA tournament. Angie Burkett was Washington's top finisher, placing 33rd with a 72-hole score of 14-over 302. Dodie Mazzuca was 55th at 308 while Caroline Spiegelberg was 79th at 315. Meg Maedo shot 317 while Emily Martin posted a score of 319. Arizona State won the tournament by 26 strokes with a score of 1351.

# Husky Golf Historical

## Dodie Mazzuca

Heralded as the best player in Washington women's golf, Dodie Mazzuca was the first Husky to receive first-team All-America honors and compete in three different NCAA Championships. Mazzuca finished her career owning virtually every Washington women's golf record. The 65 she shot in the third round of the Edean Ihlanfeldt Invitational as a senior was not only a school record but was also the lowest score by a women's golfer in the country for the 1996-97 season. In addition to winning the Ihlanfeldt Invitational, Mazzuca claimed two other medals during the season, including a win at the NCAA West Regional to help the Huskies advance to their second NCAA Championship as a team. Mazzuca became the first Husky to lead the team in stroke average for four consecutive seasons, finishing with a school record 75.1 as a senior. Mazzuca was recognized as a first-team All-Pac-10 player as a senior after being named to the second team as a junior.



## Nancy Kessler

### Cal Coach Gets Start at UW

Current California head coach Nancy McDaniel (Kessler) was a four-year letterwinner at Washington from 1984-88. She played 109 career rounds for the Dawgs, averaging 79.3 strokes while winning two tournaments and finishing in the top 10 nine times. As a junior, Kessler played in the No. 1 position, again competing in all of Washington's competitive rounds while averaging 79.2 strokes. She had two top 10 finishes, including a second place at the Utah-Dixie Classic where she shot a four-over 223. The 1987-88 season was Kessler's most productive as she won two tournaments including the Edean Ihlanfeldt. Kessler also won the BYU Invitational, where she shot an opening-round 69, her career low. For the year Kessler finished in the top 10 in seven of 10 events.



## Greggain Finishes 44th at U.S. Open

Former Washington women's golfer Jennifer (Stapleton) Greggain shot 77 during the final round of the U.S. Open at The Orchards to place 44th overall. Greggain completed the 72-hole event at 9-over 293. A resident of Canada, Greggain turned in rounds of 73, 71 and 72 during the first three rounds of play. Greggain lettered at Washington from 1997-99. She earned second-team All-Pac-10 honors as a senior.



## National Championships Hosting the 2002 NAAs

For the first time in the program's history, Washington was the host institution for the NCAA Championships in 2002. The tournament was staged at Washington National Golf Club in Auburn. Washington finished 20th at the event behind the play of freshman Paige Mackenzie who completed the tournament in 25th place, the best showing ever by a Husky at the NAAs. Duke won the championship behind the play of medalist Anna Nirapongporn who shot 9-under 279.

# Washington National Golf Club

When Washington National Golf Club opened in August of 2000, it became the new home for the Husky Golf team. Thanks to a sponsorship agreement between Washington National and the University, the course features a distinctive Husky brand, from the golf carts, to flag sticks to its company logo.



Washington National was the brainchild of Orrin Vincent, president of O.B. Sports, a golf development and management company. Vincent is the father of former Husky men's golf coach O.D. Vincent. A Seattle native, he teamed with John Fought, the 1977 U.S. Amateur champion and the principal architect for the project to create a truly unique Northwest course. No two holes are alike, and, thanks to the terrain in the area and excellent drainage, the course features numerous native areas and large artistic sand traps.

Five sets of tees (Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior and Husky) stretch the course from 5,777 yards to 7,304 yards.

The golf carts are a combination of purple and gold and named for notable personalities in Washington athletic history. Other carts are named for the other Pac-10 schools. University faculty and students are entitled to special discounted fees at Washington National.

The course was selected for the site of the 2002 NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championships and the 2003 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Regionals. It will host the 2006 Women's Regionals.
