Lee capped her fall campaign by finishing second at the Las elgas Collegiate, her 1th top-10 performance. In 12 rounds she posted a 74.33 stroke average which has her on track to post he best season as a collegiate golfer

Prange was an honorable mentional-Pac-10 pick as a freshman after posting 75.93 stroke average. She played her way into the top-10 three times and posted a pa of rounds in the 60s.

Before there was a womes' varsity golf program at the Univeristy of Washington, the school produced a nationa champion in the sport. In 1961 Judy Hoetmer won the National Collegiate Golf Championship A junior at the time, Hoetmer was a member of the University's golf club from 1959 to 1962. She was the Pacific Northwest Junio Champion in both 1957 and 1958. As a senior at Washington, Hoetmer finished second at the NCGC. In 1988 Hoetmer was inducted into Washingtons Hall of Fame. She is one of a handful of inductees who never earned a varsity letter at Washington.

In addition to winning the Ihlanfeldt Invliational, Mazzuca claimed two other medals during the season, including a win at the NCAA West Regional to help the Huskies advance to their second NCAA



Championship as a team. Mazzuca became the first Husky to lead the team in stroke average for four consecutive seasofinsishing with a school record 75.1as a senior Mazzuca was recognized as a firsteam All-Pac-10 player as a senior after being named to the second team as a junior



## National Championships Hosting the 2002 NCAAs

For the first time in the prograsmistory Washington was the host institution for the NCA/Championships in 2002The tournament was staged at Washington National Golf Club Aruburn. Washington finished 20th at the event behind the play of freshman Paige Mackenzie who completed the tournament in 25th place, the best showing ever by a Husky at the NCA/As. # **Washington National Golf Club**

When Washington National Golf Club opened in August of 2000, it became the new home for the Husky Golf team. Thanks to a sponsorship agreement between Wishington National and the University the course features a distinctive Husky brand, from the golf carts, to flag sticks to its company logo.

Washington National was the brainchild of Orrindent, president of O.B. Sports, a golf development and management company. Vincent is the father of former Husky margolf coach O.D. Vincent. A Seattle native, he teamed with John Fought, the 1977 U.S. Amateur champion and the principal architect for the project ocreate a truly unique Northwest course. No two holes are alike and, thanks to the terrain in the area and excellent drainage, the course features numerous native areas and large artistic sand trap

Five sets of tees (Freshman, Sophomore, Juni6enior and Husky) stretch the course from 5,7 yards to 7,304 yards.

The golf carts are a combination of purple and gold and name for notable personalities in all hington athletic histor the carts are named for the other Pac-10 schools. University facustraff and students are entitled to special discounted fees als Mington National.

The course was selected for the site of the 2002 NCAA Division I Women's Golf Championships and the 2003 NCADivision I Men's Golf Regionals. It will host the 2006 Men's Regionals.







The theme at Washington National is all Huskies. From the personalized golf carts (above) to the special flag sticks and practice pins (right) to the "Block W" bunker on the 18th fairway, a Purple and Gold presence can be found throughout the course.
