Huskies Hope To Score Elusive NCAA Spot

To say the Washington gymnastics team went through highs and lows last year might be cliché, but it accurately sums up the Huskies' season.

The highs were numerous, as the team posted five of the top seven scores in the program's history, including shattering the school scoring record by posting a 198.025 in a three-way home meet. Washington also set scoring records on bars, beam and floor en route to a 12-10-1 season. One of those wins was over top-ranked UCLA, the second time in school history that UW knocked off the Bruins.

Despite all the success, what the team and Coach Bob Levesque remember most is the one meet that proved to be the low point of the season. The second-seeded Huskies finished a disappointing fifth place at the North Central Regional held in Denver, Colo. and failed to qualify as a team for the NCAA Championships.

"We had the worst meet of the entire year on the worst day to have it," says Levesque. "We had just come off of a school record team score, so we went into regionals riding high and thinking that we had a legitimate shot of making it (to the NCAA Championships)."

The Huskies struggled on their opening event, bars, recording the team's lowest score of the season and were never able to recover.

"That was very uncharacteristic of our team," says Levesque. "We ended our own season, it wasn't like anyone stepped up to bat and beat us. We have been soul searching and trying to figure out why."

Levesque is hoping to rally the troops and is confident that this year's team will finish their season on a higher note. One thing on the Huskies side is that the West Regionals are going to be held in Bank of America Arena at Hec Edmundson Pavilion on April 9, giving Washington the proverbial home-court advantage.

"Luckily we are hosting regionals this year," Levesque says with a sigh of relief. "If we make the Super Six, that's great. If we are national champions, that's great too. But, the number one goal for us right now is to make nationals as a team."

The Huskies have not been to the NCAA Championships as a team since 1998. In order to make it this year, the Huskies must fill some big shoes. Levesque has eight returning letterwinners and nine newcomers on the roster that will challenge for that elusive NCAA bid.

"The team this year is actually stronger than the team that we had last year," Levesque says. "We lost Emily Pritchard and Amy Metcalf, but we have people who have really stepped up."

Although Pritchard and Metcalf are gone, senior Carly Dockendorf, the lone Husky to compete at the 2004 NCAA Championships, is back. Dockendorf tied for 24th on the floor at the NCAAs and recorded two perfect 10s in the event during the season. She is the

team's leading returner with 31 individual event titles and will also be counted on to shoulder the team's leadership role.

"I think the kids really look up to Carly," says Levesque. "She makes a natural team captain. She is a great team leader and is always very vocal and upbeat in the gym."

As the team leader, Dockendorf will be counted on to pace the all-around. She has proven her ability on the floor time and time again and has also been a force on the vault and the bars, winning individual titles in both events. It is the beam that proves to be her greatest challenge. Levesque is confident that

Dockendorf, who is one of the top pole vaulters on the Husky track and field team, can conquer the beam.

"Beam is a mental event and it is tough," says Levesque. "Any sport she puts her mind to do, she does well."

Besides Dockendorf, the Huskies return three other seniors that will be expected to contribute in their final campaign.

Tacia LaBatte was a regular in the Huskies' vault, bars and floor lineup last year and will be counted on again in those events. She has battled through back problems her whole career, but hasn't let that hold her back. Not only did LaBatte have regular gymnastics workouts to attend during the fall, but was also a member of the Husky cheer squad.

"Tacia's back has been hurting since she came here," says Levesque. "She started out really well this year and we have the depth to rest her, so we will do that. We'll need her on vault and bars throughout the'whole season."

Another Husky that has battled through injuries during her career is senior Molly Seaman. The Alabama-native has been Washington's anchor on the beam and will be counted on to fulfill the same role this season. She ranked second in the nation on the beam last year and won six event titles on the apparatus. When healthy, Seaman will also be counted on contributing on the floor.

"It is her final season and we are really going to need her," Levesque says about Seaman. "As long as Molly is healthy, she is our stud on beam. She fights through things and has a positive attitude. Besides Carly, Molly is the team leader."

The fourth senior on the team is Kim Lewis. Lewis is a versatile performer who can compete on the bars, beam and floor. Lewis proved to be a consistent force in the Huskies' bar lineup, scoring 9.700 in five of





eight meets. Levesque will count on Lewis to continue leading by example and be a positive influence on the younger classes, as she is considered one of the team's hardest workers.

Another of the team's hardest and most focused workers is Kelly McDonald, the lone junior on the squad. McDonald had a dynamic sophomore season, setting the Husky all-around record score with a 39.825 against Arizona State and recording only the third perfect 10 on the vault in Husky history. She has struggled with a heel injury during fall workouts and will be counted on in the all-around if her injury does

not hold her back

The sophomore class is much improved from last year and will be counted on heavily this season. Chelsea Bakken should be the head of the class and has been identified by Coach Levesque and her teammates as the one member on the team who will be the biggest surprise this season.

"She is going to do really well on all four events," says Levesque about Bakken. "She came back in great shape and is really strong right now. Kids really look up to her now because she is really infectious as far as her attitude. She will be a real leader this year and into the future."

Returning sophomores Tori Quandt and Darcee Schiller could also factor into the lineup. Quandt figures to compete in the floor and vault all year, while Schiller will add depth in the bars and vault. Sophomore transfer Lily Le has been a nice find for the Huskies and will figure in the vault, floor and beam lineup. Le, who competed for Southeast Missouri State last season, could be called upon to score for the Huskies in the all-around.

Another second-year Husky, Nikki Waiss, competed in one meet as a freshman last year before utilizing a redshirt season. Waiss has struggled with a shin injury but will be a permanent starter in the vault and bars lineup when healthy.

Last but definitely not least, the Huskies will need several of their seven true freshmen to emerge and crack the lineup. That should not be a problem as Coach Levesque estimates what the group lacks in experience, they easily compensate for in talent.

Among the seven freshmen, Brittney Brabec and Raimey Iselin stood out in fall workouts. Brabec shined both on a talent level and leadership role. She is expected to make an immediate impact on the bars and beam and may be called upon to score in the all-around. Iselin also emerged as an all-around candidate and at the very least will contribute to the floor and bars lineup.

The other freshmen filling roles for the Huskies are Natalie Gillian, who emerged as a strong candidate on the floor and vault. Canadian import Julie Mederios will crack the beam and vault lineup, while Jessica Brown could make an impact on the beam if she can overcome off-season wrist surgery. Camille Primous is one of the strongest girls on the team and should be in the bars lineup, while Jennifer Chang has a chance to compete on the bars and beam for Washington.

As a whole, Levesque sees the team gelling together nicely. The strength of the squad should be on the floor and the beam, which is an about face from last season. Perhaps that's a good sign, as the Huskies top event last year ended up costing them a shot at the NCAA Championships.

"Last year one of our strongest event was bars,""Levesque remembers. "What's funny about each season and each event is that from year to year your strongest events may become your weakest events. This year we aren't going to struggle on bars, but it will not be our best."

The UW will have to perform their best this year if they expect to meet their ultimate goal of reaching the NCAA Championships. Their schedule is laced with top-caliber competition, but Levesque isn't worried about who is on the other side of the mat. He is more concerned about avoiding the highs and lows of last season and remaining consistent.

"We don't even look at the teams who we face," explains Levesque. "We are just going to do what we do. We don't have an offense or a defense, we do what we do period. It's not about win-loss records, it's about scores."





Nashington Coaches

Bob Levesque Head Coach

Under the guidance of Husky head coach Bob Levesgue, the Washington gymnastics program has become one of the most successful in the nation. NCAA appearances, All-Americans, NCAA competitors and top-20 finishes have become the norm under Levesque's tenure.

A highly-respected club coach in Oregon, Levesque accepted the challenge of heading up a college program in 1991. Over the past 14 seasons he has led the Huskies to NCAA Regional appearances every season while compiling a career record of 167-134-2.

Levesque has built the Husky program around local talent and national elite-level gymnasts. With the \$40 million renovation of Bank of America Arena at Hec Edmundson Pavilion, he now has a practice facility and topflight competition setting to further Washington's program.

The last eight years the Husky program has truly emerged on the national level. His teams have posted a combined 113-84-2 record, been nationally ranked, recorded victories against perennial West Coast powers UCLA and Oregon State, tied Utah, ranked in the top 20 in attendance and hosted a pair of NCAA Regional championships.

Levesque's efforts to revitalize the Husky gymnastics program have not gone unnoticed. In 1998 he became the first coach in the history of the Washington gymnastics program to lead the team to back-to-back NCAA Championship appearances. It was not Levesque's only repeat during the season. He was also honored as the Pac-10 and West Region coach of the year for the second consecutive season.

In 1998, Levesque guided the team to a 17-7 record and the program's first NCAA West Regional Championship. The Huskies finished the season ranked seventh in the nation and finished seventh at the NCAA Championships. Two Huskies, senior Klara Kudílková and junior Tiffany Simpson, earned All-America honors at the NCAAs. The 1998 NCAA appearance was the third by the team over a five-year stretch. Prior to that it had been seven years (1987) since the Huskies had appeared at the national championships.

A year earlier, Levesque took Washington to the NCAA Championships where the team placed eighth and four Husky gymnasts earned All-American honors in seven different categories. During the regular season the Huskies smashed their record book. Washington bettered its previous all-time score a total of 12 times during the year. It was appropriate that Levesque was recognized for his team's outstanding performances.


In ten of the 14 years he has been at Washington, Levesque has seen at least one of his gymnasts compete in the individual events at the NCAA Championships. He has a UW gymnast earn first-team All-America honors nine times.

Prior to taking the head coaching position at the UW, Levesque was the owner and director of the American Gymnastics Training Center in Eugene, Ore. He was named the Husky gymnastics coach on July 10, 1990.

Levesque, 54, a 1972 graduate of Fresno State University, had been associated with the American Gymnastics Training Center since 1985. In addition to coaching gymnasts from level eight through elite, he also handled event and meet scheduling and the hiring and training of staff members along with traveling with his athletes to national and international competitions.

Several Levesque-trained athletes have competed on the national and international level. Six of those were Olympians, including Tracee Talayera and Julianne McNamara from the United States. The others were Karen Kelsall (Canada, 1976 & 1980); Nancy Goldsmith (Israel, 1984); Tarella Javen (Finland, 1980) and Tatiana Fegieredo (Brazil, 1984).

He also coached Tanya Chaplin (formerly Tanya Service), currently the

head coach at Oregon State, and Leslie Pyfer, two gymnasts who competed in the world championships for the United States. Five other gymnasts tutored by Levesque were members of national teams, including former UW national champion Yumi Mordre. More than 20 athletes groomed by Levesque have competed on the Division I college level.

Prior to joining the American Gymnastics Training Center, Levesque was a staff member at the National Academy of Artistic Gymnasts in Eugene from 1977 until 1985 where he worked with Class I and elite gymnasts. He began his coaching career at the Fresno Gymnastics Club in 1972 and was on the staff until leaving for Oregon in 1977.

Levesque has also been a quest lecturer and teacher at numerous clinics on the West Coast and in the Northwest. He has done work with the United States Gymnastics Federation and was elected in 1989 as the Program Chairman of the Regional Elite Committee, which represented the six-state Western Region. As chairman of that group, he helped organize regional workshops and disseminate information to the states in his region along with attending national meetings.

He currently serves on the women's program committee and is a former vice president of the National Academy of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches for Women.

Levesque and his wife, Kathy, reside in Bothell. He is an avid golfer who recorded his first hole-in-one during the summer of 1998.

Mashington Coaches

Heidi Coleman **Assistant** Coach

Heidi Coleman is in her third season as an assistant coach at Washington. Prior to joining the Husky staff, she worked as the artistic director and assistant head coach for the Abbotsford Twisters Gymnastics Club in British Columbia. She oversaw the program's balance beam, vault, artistic preparation and choreography for the club.



Before working with the Abbotsford Twisters, Coleman was the competitive coach for the Surrey Gymnastics Society in British Columbia from 1998-1999. She was the competitive coach at Omega Gymnastics from 1996-1997, oversaw the Flicka Gymnastics Club from 1988 to 1992 and coached at Sport Seneca from 1984-1986.

In 2002 Coleman and her partner coach were named the High Performance Coaches of the Year for Canadian Gymnastics. The award is presented to the coaches of the highest achieving international athlete that year. She was honored for the accomplishments for Kate Richardson, a two-time Canadian Olympian and the 2002 Commonwealth all-around and balance beam champion. Richardson is a junior at UCLA this year.

Coleman was named a British Columbia Team Coach to the Canadian National Championships in 1991, 1992, 2001 and 2002. She was named a British Columbia Team Coach to the Western Canadian Championships in 1990, 1991, 1992 and 2000, 2001 and 2002.

Coleman is qualified to instruct Level 1, 2 and 3 gymnastics in Canada and is currently completing her Level 4 coaching certification, which is the highest level

As an undergraduate student at Seneca College, she was named the school's student of the year in 1986. She completed her bachelor of physical education from the University of British Columbia in 1992.

Frank Lee **Assistant** Coach

One of the most highly respected clublevel gymnastics coaches on the West Coast, Frank Lee is in his sixth season as an assistant coach for the Washington gymnastics team. Lee is a familiar figure to the University and Seattle area gymnastics communities.

In addition to assisting the Husky program, Lee is the owner of the Cascade Elite

Gymnastics Club in Montlake Terrace. He has operated the highly successful club since he graduated from Washington in 1989. Lee earned his undergraduate degree in zoology.

Since 1990, Cascade Elite Gymnastics has sent at least one gymnast to the Level 10 Nationals. Five different athletes have been members of U.S. National Teams. The club has also produced numerous state and regional champions.

In 2000, he coached current Husky sophomore Gharde Geldenhuys at the Summer Olympic Games in Sydney. Geldenhuys represented her home nation of Namibia at the Games.

Lee has had a pupil on the Junior Olympic National Team every year since 1996. He sent a competitor to the U.S. Championships in 2001 and 2002 and coached one gymnast at the World Team Trials and World Championships in 2002.

While attending the University of Washington, he was a member of the Husky men's gymnastics club team. Born in Seoul, South Korea, Lee grew up in Seattle and attended Cascade High School. Lee and his wife, Uyen, reside in Poulsbo with their daughter Jasmine.
