Joanne Bowers enters her third year at the helm of the Washington women's gymnastics program. Bowers took over as head coach of the Huskies in 2007 and has led the team to two straight NCAA West Regionals.

Last season, Bowers took her team to its second consecutive NCAA West Regional. The Huskies improved on their 2007 finish, earning fourth place with a score of 194.075 and ended the season with a team ranking of 27th in the country. Bowers also sent her second straight individual gymnast to the NCAA Championships when freshman Haley Bogart was selected to compete in Athens, Ga. Bogart scored a career-high on bars at nationals, finishing 20th overall in the all-around.

In 2007, Bowers guided the Huskies back to the NCAA West Regional, where they placed fifth, one year after missing the Regional for the first time in program history. Bowers also helped guide the individual efforts of Chelsea Bakken (Class of 2007), who became the first Husky to compete at the NCAA Championships since 2004. For her efforts, Bowers became the third UW coach - and just the third first-year coach in conference history - to earn Pac-10 Coach of the Year. She was also named West Region Coach of the Year at the 2007 NCAA West Regional.

Bowers, who leads the coaching for the Huskies on the floor and helps with the balance beam, will begin her third season with the goal of taking the whole team to the NCAA Championships.

"We have a lot of talent in the gym," said Bowers. "We have the potential to be a very good team this year, but we're also very young. It's exciting to see the level of talent and potential we do have."

Bowers was named the fifth Washington women's gymnastics head coach on June 7, 2006. She arrived in Seattle from Ann Arbor, where she had spent the previous five seasons as a highly-successful assistant coach at the University of Michigan. Bowers helped lead the Wolverines to a seventh-place finish at the 2006 NCAA Championships in her final campaign with the team.

During Bowers' five seasons with the Wolverines, Michigan went to the NCAA Championships every year and won four Big Ten Championships. Bowers, who focused primarily on floor exercise and balance beam for Michigan, coached six individual All-Americans on beam and seven on floor. In addition, she tutored individuals to Big Ten Championships on beam and floor four times during her tenure.

Prior to joining the Michigan staff, Bowers spent four years as an assistant at Kent State University, helping lead the Golden Flashes to a Mid-American Conference championship in 2001. For her efforts, she earned Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year honors from the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastic Coaches for Women (NACGC).

Bowers graduated from James Madison University with a physical education degree in 1982. She was a four-year letterwinner and two-time team captain of the women's gymnastics team while at JMU. Bowers went on to obtain her master's degree in education with a minor in administration and supervision from Austin Peay State University in 1985.

Following graduation, she coached various club teams in the Midwest and on the east coast and spent time as a gymnastics judge. From 1990-93, Bowers was the head women's gymnastics coach at Illinois State University, where she coached individuals to NCAA Regional berths. Bowers returned to coaching club teams and judging gymnastics before joining Kent State in 1997.

Bowers' husband, John, is the head football coach at Ballard High School. They have two sons, David and his younger brother, Ross.

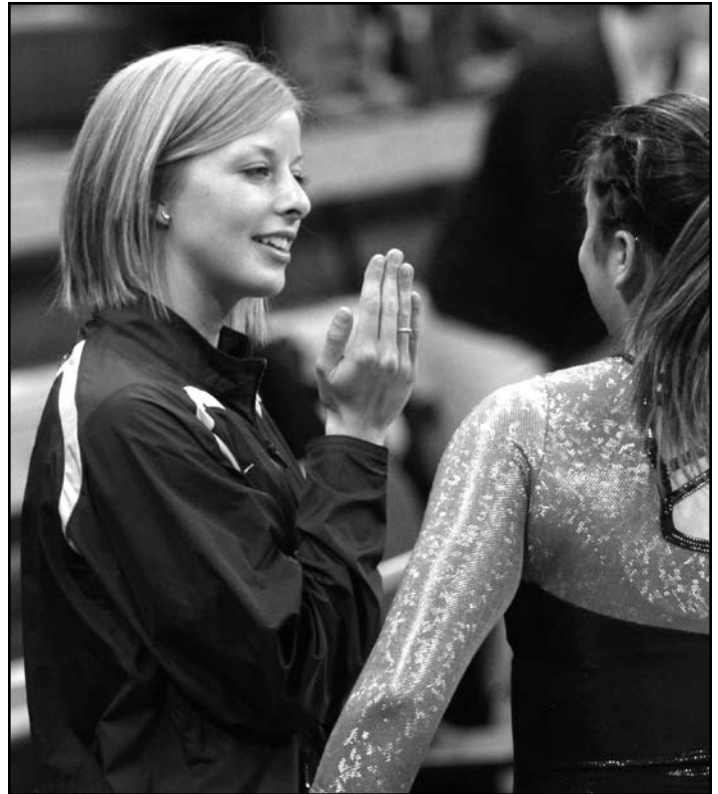
Assistant Coach Third Season

Assistant Coach Third Season

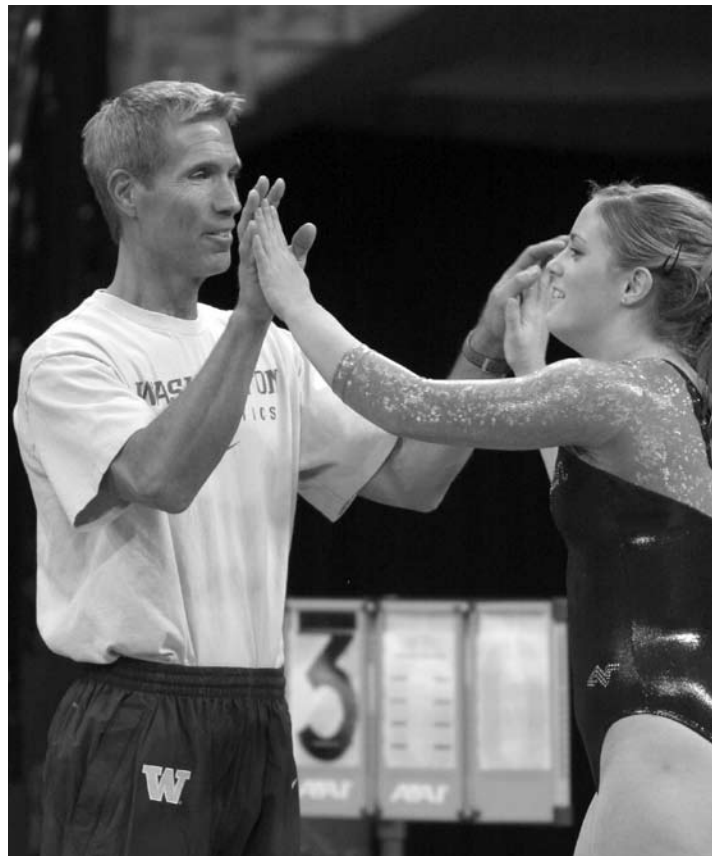

McCreary, who joined the Husky program on June 30, 2006, brought over 20 years of elite-level gymnastics coaching experience. Before his arrival in Seattle, he served as head coach and competitive team program director for the club Arizona Sunrays (2000-2005), which produced numerous collegiate gymnasts, including former Husky Jessica Brown. Prior to that, McCreary ran the program for West Valley Gymnastics in Campbell, Calif. from 1996-2000 and owned Gymagic Gymnastics in Sacramento, Calif., from 1987-1996. 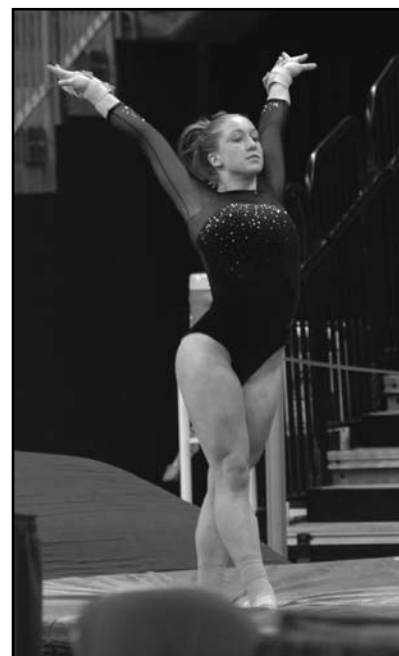

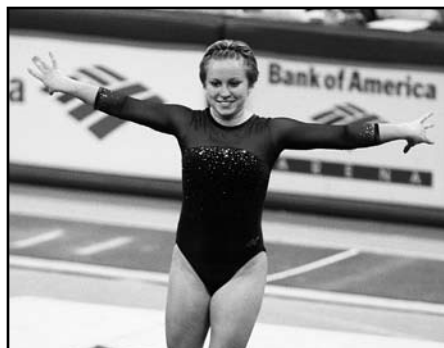

Already a Pan American Games gold medalist and a World Championships and U.S. Olympic Trials veteran by the time she arrived at Washington in 1984-85, Husky sophomore Yumi Mordre cemented her legend with an historic performance at the 1987 NCAA Gymnastics Championships, becoming first woman ever to win multiple individual event titles. Mordre's wins in the vault and beam were the high point of an outstanding collegiate career in which the Vashon Island, Wash., native earned eight All-America honors and was runner-up in the All-Around in 1987. Mordre was inducted into the Husky Hall of Fame in 1995.

Washington's Athletic Prowess

Not only is Washington annually ranked among America's top-five public universities, the Huskies' athletic teams consistently rank among the nation's best in the annual NACDA Director's Cup rankings of overall athletic prowess. In fact, the 2008 fall season saw UW's best overall mark in the director's cup standings.

In 2007-08 alone, 13 of Washington's 23 teams participated in national postseason tournaments. Since the start of the 2000-01 season, UW teams have combined for four national team championships, including 2001 women's crew, 2005 women's volleyball, 2007 men's crew and 2008 women's cross country crowns -- and have seen seven Washington student-athletes earn NCAA individual titles. Sixteen Husky athletes qualified in five different countries to compete in the 2008 Olympics in Beijing.

In addition, hundreds of UW student-athletes have enjoyed success in professional sports, including dozens in recent years alone. Washington athletes litter the rankings of the world's elite competitors, including 2008 National League Cy Young award winner Tim Lincecum (San Francisco Giants), 2006-07 NBA Rookie of the Year Brandon Roy (Portland Trail-blazers), 2006 NBA Slam Dunk Contest Champion Nate Robinson (New York Knicks), 2006 NFL Hall of Fame Inductee Warren Moon, top-10 U.S. Women's Open finisher Paige Mackenzie.

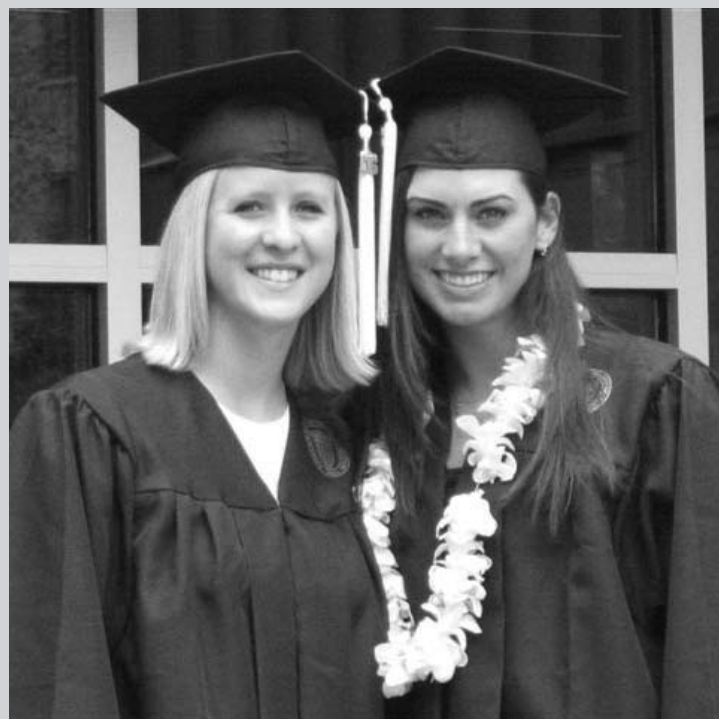
Student-Athlete Academic Services (SAAS) consists of academic counseling, academic coordination, a comprehensive tutorial program, learning resources and assistance for students with learning disabilities, a study skills program for all students, a comprehensive Life Skills program, and leadership and mentoring opportunities. We focus on the needs of each individual student-athlete and develop an individualized program to meet those needs. Integration into the larger campus environment is encouraged and facilitated through collaborative programs developed with a variety of UW programs and resources.

Four full-time academic advisors provide academic counseling support for student-athletes. Advisors assist students with course selection, major declaration, graduation planning, and career/internship opportunities through the use of individualized academic plans designed for each student.

Academic coordinators serve to assist students with the transition to university life and the University of Washington. They assist students with academic monitoring, tutorial scheduling, academic goal setting, time management and study skill development. One-on-one meetings are conducted with freshmen and students in academic difficulty on a weekly basis.

The Learning Resources unit is headed by a full-time learning specialist available to assist students with learning disabilities, study skills development, and academic success strategies. Under the direction of the

Tutorial Coordinator, approximately 70 highly trained tutors provide individual, small group, and review session tutorial services for student-athletes each quarter.

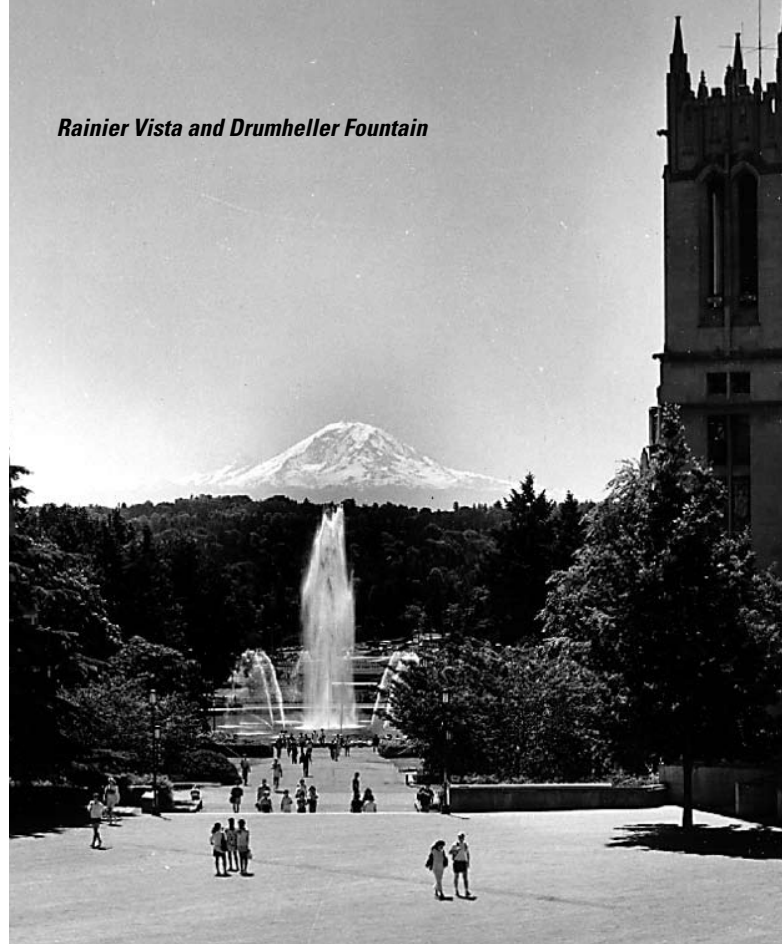

The UW Campus

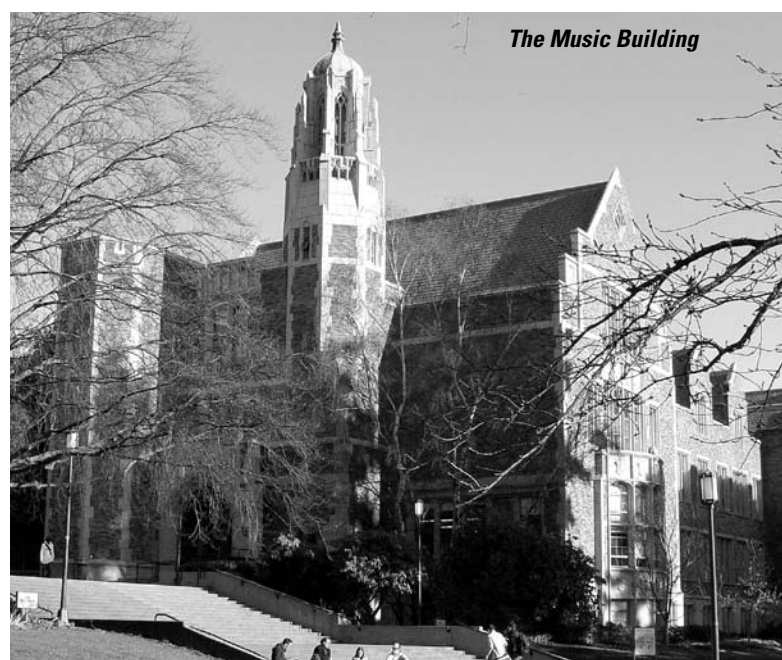
