Huskies Reflect On Historic Season Look To Promising 2012

"I thought we had a great season and am very proud of the body of work our team did all year," said head coach Joanne Bowers. "The preparation leading up to the season proved very effective during the season. The commitment of our team to improve each day was evident in practice and then paid off during the season. We took a very big step in consistency during the meet season and peaked at the end at Pac-10's and Regionals. Our team goal was to end in the top 18 and be seeded to a different regional site as one of the top seeds and we accomplished that goal. We have set ourselves up as an upcoming program and are ready for the next step to be a nationally ranked program next year."

"Floor was an event that was pretty consistent most of the season and we had some beautiful routines from Kristen Linton, Sam Walior, Ruby Engreitz, Lauren Rogers, Aliza Vaccher and Paige Bixler most of the season. Others who contributed when healthy were Haley Bogart, Hatsune Akaogi, Kylie Sharp and Phoebe Tham. We did a nice job of cleaning up the bonus dance and the landings on tumbling towards the end of the season and that really helped us. We are looking to improve the difficulty level of our tumbling next year to get even stronger on this event."

"Balance Beam is the event that usually makes or breaks the meet for you if you can stay on! We did not count a fall on beam all year until Regionals and that is a huge accomplishment. Paige was our lead off on beam and showed such poise most of the season. She then was followed by Aliza, Ruby and Meg Whitney who showed some ups and downs but really came through most of the time. Haley and Sam were pretty steady for us most of the season and showed great mental toughness at the end of the beam lineup all year. Others who helped out during the year were Kristen and Lauren. It was great having such depth on this event and always had many gymnasts ready to compete if needed."

Team Award Banquet

At Salty's on May 1, friends, family and staffed joined the UW softball team to remember the season and say one final goodbye to the senior class, Sam, Kristen and Haley. The 101 Club award for academics went to Sam. Phoebe was awarded the Fall 2010 Academic Achievement Award and Ruby was also honored for academics. For seven out of 11 quarters that the senior class was at UW, the gymnastics team won the small team GPA award. The coaches awards were presented to Sam "In Competition" and Phoebe was awarded for "In the Classroom" and "In Life." The "Senior Leadership" award went to the three senior captains. The event specialists were Amanda for vault, Ruby for bars and Kristen for floor. Aliza won the "Heart of a Champion" award and Haley was named "Top Dawg."

Engreitz Earns Academic Excellence Award

At the First Annual WSAAC WESPY awards, junior Ruby Engreitz was the gymnastics team recipient of the Provost Academic Excellence Award.

Vaccher Represents UW Well At NCAA Championships

Freshman Aliza Vaccher was the lone Husky competitor at the 2011 NCAA Gymnastics Championships in Cleveland, Ohio April 15-17. Despite being just a freshman and competing without her team, Vaccher hit all four events at the NCAA Championships to T-19th and just miss out on All-American honors. She posted a 39.075 in the all-around.

By finishing second in the all-around at the NCAA Norman Regional, Vaccher earned one of two automatic berths to the NCAA Championships. She posted a career-best 39.250 in the all-around with a 9.850 on vault, a 9.825 on bars, a 9.775 on beam and a 9.800 on floor.

Huskies Fall Just Short Of NCAA Championships

The No. 17 Huskies were so close to advancing to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1998 and upsetting No. 7 Utah for the first time ever at the Norman Regional. UW placed third in the meet with a 195.300. The Huskies started strong on floor, vault and bars and took a .250 lead over the Utes into the final rotation. However, the Huskies stumbled on the beam, falling off twice while Utah was perfect on bars. The third-place Regional finish was the best for UW since 2005, and the team score was UW's best at Regionals since 2003. Also at the end of the day, assistant coaches David McCreary and Shanna Hannan were announced as West Region co-Assistant Coaches of the Year, a very high honor in the loaded region.

Six Huskies Earn All-Pac-10 Academic Honors

The 2011 Pac-10 Conference Women's Gymnastics All-Academic teams have been announced and six Husky student-athletes are on this elite list. To be eligible for selection to the All-Academic Team, a student-athlete must have a minimum 3.0 overall grade-point average and be either a starter or significant contributor. Junior Ruby Engreitz, seniors Kristen Linton and Samantha Walior earned First-Team honors. Senior Haley Bogart and sophomore Lauren Rogers earned Second-Team honors and junior Amanda Cline earned Honorable Mention, respectively.

Four Huskies Earn All-Pac-10 Honors

Amanda Cline (vault), Ruby Engreitz (bars), Kristen Linton (floor) and Samantha Walior (beam & bars) each earned individual honors on their top event. With five total selections, this is the most for UW since the 2008 season. This is also the first time ever that the Huskies have put a gymnast on each of the four event teams. Cline, Engreitz and Linton each earned second-team honors, the first such honors for each of them. Walior earned first-team on the bars and second-team on the beam. She was named to the All-Pac-10 floor team in 2008 and 2009.

The All Pac-10 team is determined by a combination of 50 percent regional qualifying score (entire season composite) and 50 percent Conference Championships score. The All-Conference first team consists of the top six all-around competitors, plus the top three competitors in each individual event who are not among the all-around honorees. The second team All-Pac-10 consists of the top two all-arounders who were not named to the first team (as all-arounders or in an event), after such the top two gymnasts from each event who were not yet named to the first team or the second team would be selected to the second team.

Huskies Impressive At Pac-10 Championships

After a rocky start on the floor, the Huskies finished the meet with a 49.275 on the beam, their first 49+ score on the event this year to end the meet with a 196.025 and finish third at the Pac-10 Championships at UCLA. Oregon State won the meet with a 197.200. UCLA finished second at 196.750. UW beat No. 3 Stanford and snapped an 11-meet losing streak to the Cardinal. It was the second 196+ of the year for the Huskies and their highest score on the beam this season. UW has finished third at the Pac-10 Championships four previous times, the last in 2001. The 196.025 is the best team score by the Huskies since 2004 in the championships. Senior Samantha Walior tied with five others for the bars championship with a career-best 9.90. She is the first individual champion on any event for UW since 2007 and the third-ever bars champion. The Huskies got a 49.000 on bars. UW also got solid performances from Amanda Cline, Kristen Linton, Aliza Vaccher, Haley Bogart, Paige Bixler and Ruby Engreitz.

Seniors Honored In Final Home Meet

Seniors Bogart, Linton and Walior competed in their final meet at Alaska Airlines Arena on March 11, guiding the Huskies to two wins over Air Force and Seattle Pacific. UW posted a team-score of 195.475. On vault and bars the Huskies posted score of 49+. Vaccher won the all-around, tying her career-best score of 39.025. The Huskies placed at least one-through-three on every event as Cline won her fourth vault title of the season, tying her career-best for a third-straight week with a 9.925. Engreitz and Walior tied for the bars title with 9.875's. Walior also won the beam with a 9.825. Linton won yet another floor title, scoring a 9.875.

Return Home Gives Huskies Record Score

After being on the road for the entire month of February, the Huskies took advantage of competing in front of their fans on March 4 vs. Michigan State, posting their best team scores in seven years. UW scored a 196.075 and posted team-best scores on beam (48.775) and floor (49.150). Individually, a Husky won each event title, led by junior Engreitz who posted her second-best score in the all-around with a 39.200. She also won the floor, her first such event title of the year, tying teammates Bixler and Walior with score of 9.850. Cline won her four vault title of the year, tying a career-best with a 9.925. Walior also won the bars and beam with scores of 9.850.

Engreitz Has Career Day in Tempe

The Huskies competed in a Pac-10 Dual Meet at Arizona State, falling to the Sun Devils, 195.750-195.450. Washington was led by Engreitz who had her best career meet as a Husky, winning the all-around with a 39.350 and winning the bars. She also posted career-high marks on the beam and vault. Vaccher won her first career event title with a career-best 9.875 on the bars. She also posted a career-high 38.925 in the all-around to finish third. Bixler won her second vault title of the year with a season-high 9.825. Cline posted a career-best 9.925 on the vault to win the event. As a team, the Huskies posted a season-best 49.300 on the vault.

Pac-10 Gymnast of the Week

Engreitz was the first Husky to be named Pac-10 Gymnast of the Week this year for her performance at Arizona State, posting a career-best mark in the all-around and winning the bars. Vaccher was also named Gohuskies.com Student-Athlete of the Week on April 13 for advancing to Nationals.

Huskies Improve Overall Score With Good Mark At No. 3 Utah

The Huskies posted their second-best team score of the season of 195.475 at No. 3 Utah on Friday, arguably one of the toughest gyms to compete in in the country. With that solid score, the Huskies remain at No. 13 in this week's poll. Walior tied for second on the beam with a 9.825. Sophomore Lauren Rogers was the best Husky on the vault, tying for third with a 9.850. On the bars, Linton finished fourth with a 9.875. Engreitz tied for fourth on the floor with Walior with 9.775's. Engreitz also was third in the all-around with a 38.500.

Bogart, Walior Lead Huskies Over SPU

Bogart and Walior led the Huskies to their best team score of the season, a 195.800 in the win at Seattle Pacific. The Huskies were solid on every event as Bogart competed in the all-around for the first time since her freshman year, winning the event and scoring a 39.000. Walior won her first event title of the season, scoring a career-high on the bars of 9.900 with teammate Engreitz. Walior also won the beam with a 9.850. Kristen Linton won her third-straight floor title by scoring a 9.875 and Amanda Cline won her second vault title of the year with a 9.850.

Gohuskies.com Student-Athlete Of The Week

Walior was named the Gohuskies.com Student-Athlete of the Week for the week of Jan. 31-Feb. 6. It is first such honor for Walior and the gymnastics team on the year. She earned the honor for her performance at SPU, winning two events.

Huskies Give Valiant Effort Against No. 5 Oklahoma

Despite their second best team score of the season (195.100), the Huskies fell to No. 5 Oklahoma (196.175) on Jan. 28 in a dual meet at Alaska Airlines Arena. Engreitz won her first career all-around title in just her second attempt with a 38.625. Bogart and Linton both won individual events. Bogart won the vault for the first time this year with a career-high 9.9. Linton won her second-straight floor title with a 9.875. Seven Huskies earned personal bests on at least one event. UW posted season team-best scores on the vault (49.050) and on the beam (48.675).

Huskies Win All Four Events, All-Around vs. Cal

The Huskies posted their best team score in a dual meet victory over Cal, 195.475 on Jan. 21. UW also posted team-best scores on the vault (48.800), beam (48.600) and the floor (49.100). Four different Huskies won individual events and freshman Aliza Vaccher took the all-around with a 38.925. UW took 1-4 on the vault, led by Amanda Cline with a 9.825. Meg Whitney and Bogart tied for second (9.775) and Lauren Rogers tied for fourth with a 9.725. Washington continues to be dominating on the bars, finishing in the top six spots on the event. Engreitz won the bars for the second-straight meet, matching her career-high of 9.875. Linton was second (9.800), Vaccher and Rogers tied for third (9.775) and Cline and Samantha Walior tied for fifth (9.750). On beam, Paige Bixler won with a 9.800 and Walior finished a close second with a 9.775. Linton took the floor title with a 9.875.

Huskies Down Broncos For First Time In Seven Tries

In the 2011 home opener, UW snapped a six-meet losing streak to Boise State, posting its best team score of the year. Washington had a 194.825 to win the meet and defeat the Broncos, Illinois State and Seattle Pacific. Engreitz tied her career-high with a 9.875 on bars to win her second event title of her career. Rogers and Cline tied for third on the vault (9.800), Walior and Linton tied for second on the bars (9.800), Bixler was second on the beam (9.800) and Walior was third (9.775) and Linton was second on the floor (9.850). Vaccher competed in the all-around for the first time, placing second with a 38.625.

Huskies Fifth at First-Ever Pac-10 Showcase

Linton and Walior stepped up for the Huskies on bar at the Pac-10 Showcase as both earned career-best marks of 9.900, leading the Huskies to a second-place finish in the event. Washington finished fifth out of the seven Pac-10 teams with an overall score of 193.675. Engreitz also posted career-high on the bars with a 9.875. Whitney and Vaccher made their Husky debuts. Whitney was second on the team with a 9.750 on vault. Vaccher competed on vault, floor and tied for the team-high on beam with Engreitz with a 9.725.

Huskies in the Rankings

Washington opened the season in the top-25 for the second-straight season. UW was No. 21 in the coaches pre-season poll presented by GymInfo and moved up to No. 20 after opening weekend. After being 18 in week two the Huskies were No. 16 in week three, the highest ranking ever under head coach Joanne Bowers. The Huskies moved up to No. 14 the next week and were 13 for two-straight weeks. In the first RQS rankings, UW was No. 11. They were No. 15 for two weeks and then No. 17 for two weeks. The Huskies finished No. 23 in last year's final poll and 18th this year. In the final team standings the Huskies ranked in the Top 25 on all four events and improved their RQS ranking on the vault, bars and beam. They were 14th on vault (49.115), 16th (49.045), 22nd on beam (48.735) and 23rd on floor (49.005). Individually, Engreitz and Walior were tied for 20th on the bars (9.875).
