UW Heads to NCAA West Regional Gymnasts Make 21st Consecutive Appearance

The Meet: The Washington women's gymnastics team (7-13) will attempt to qualify for the NCAA Championships when the Huskies participate at the NCAA West Regional Championships. This year's event takes place on Saturday, April 6 at 6 p.m. at Oregon State's Gill Coliseum. Joining the Huskies and 13th-ranked Beaves will be No. 4 Utah, No. 9 Oklahoma, No. 24 Southern Utah, and Boise State. Individual competitors from San Jose State, Sacramento State, Seattle Pacific, and California will also compete. The two top team finishers will advance to the NCAA Championships, set for April 18-20 in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. In addition, the top two all-arounders whose teams don't advance will also qualify for nationals, as will any gymnast who wins an individual event title if her team does not advance.

NCAA Regional History: This year's NCAA West Regional appearance will be Washington's 21st consecutive trip to NCAA postseason competition. The Huskies placed fifth at last year's South Central Regional in Nebraska with a score of 194.450. Nebraska won the championship at 196.200 followed by Oklahoma at 195.225. Washington has won one NCAA Regional Championship, in 1998 when the Huskies hosted the event. Washington is looking to make its first trip to the NCAA Championships since 1998 when the Huskies placed seventh overall.

Last Meet: Washington placed fifth at the Pac-10 Championships with a score of 195.425 at Stanford on Saturday, March 23. Washington sophomore Emily Pritchard won the vault title. Pritchard scored 9.975, a career-high mark, to finish first on the vault. Pritchard becomes the fourth UW individual to win a Pac-10 title. Pritchard tied for fourth on bars with a score of 9.925. UCLA captured the team title with a score of 197.625. Arizona was second at 197.050, Stanford third at 196.150, Oregon State was fourth at 196.125, Arizona State was sixth at 194.125 and California was seventh at 189.700. Sophomore Tanya Powers finished seventh in the all-around with a score of 39.250. Pritchard was 10th in the all-around at 39.025 and freshman Carly Dockendorf was 14th at 38.425. Washington's team score was its second highest mark of the year. The Huskies had seven career-high marks set during the meet.

All Pac-10 Honors: Sophomore Emily Pritchard was named to the Pac-10's All-Conference Team. A native of Buckley, Wash., she was named all-conference performer on bars, vault and in the all-around. She was the only member of the All-Pac-10 squad to be named to three events.

Freshman First: Carly Dockendorf took first on the floor against top-ranked Utah, with a career high of 9.975. That was the highest score on the floor for a freshman in Washington history. Dockendorf came away with Washington's only first-place finish against Arizona, winning the bars 9.900. Dockendorf set a career high on the vault with a 9.850 at Arizona with Minnesota and Northern Illinois.

Sophomore Sensation In the Rankings: Washington's Emily Pritchard has moved from freshman phenom to sophomore sensation in 2002. Pritchard is currently tied for 20th on the bars with a season high of 9.950 against Utah. Last year she arguably had the best season ever by a Husky gymnast. An all-arounder, Pritchard competed in every meet for the Huskies, won the NCAA South Central Regional bars title (9.900) and finished second

in the all-around at that meet. Pritchard's top performance came during the Pac-10 Championships when he recorded career highs on bars (9.925), beam (9.850) and floor (9.825) for a season-best score of 39.500. Pritchard competed as an individual at the NCAA Championships. Her top finish was a 33rd-place showing on vault (9.775).

Powering Up: Sophomore Tanya Powers is seeing more time as an all-arounder. Powers was second in the all-around against Cal at 39.200. She also picked up her first event championship with first-place honors on vault with a career-best score of 9.900. Against Utah, Powers captured third in the all-around with a 38.775. Powers tied her career on the vault with a 9.900 against Arizona State. Powers also set a career high on the beam against Arizona State with a 9.900. Powers placed fourth on the bars against Michigan and Denver tying her career high score of 9.850. Powers tied that same score at Arizona with Minnesota and Northern Illinois. Powers set a new career high on the floor with score of 9.750 in the same meet.

First Timers: Washington has been able to count on several freshman to contribute during the 2002 season. Lauren Brooks has been a solid competitor on the vault and floor during the season. Brooks scored a career best 9.675 on the vault against Arizona State and Michigan and Denver. Brooks set a career high on the floor against Arizona State with a score of 9.775. Brooks tied that same score against UCLA and Seattle-Pacific. Courtney Canavan is also in the vault rotation, with a high score of 9.675 against Boise State and Oregon State. Canavan set a career high on the beam with a 9.675 at Oregon State. Canavan tied that same score against UCLA and Seattle-Pacific. Freshman Kimberly Lewis competed on the beam for the first time at Oregon State, scoring 9.325. Lewis set a career high on the floor with a 9.875 against Utah. Lewis then set a career high on the bars with a 9.700 against Arizona State.

Improving Her Mark: After missing the 2001 season due to an Achilles tendon injury, Allison Bruce returns to the Washington lineup this season as the team's lone senior. Bruce has competed on all four events during her UW career, but never once as an all-arounder. Bruce has already set one career high this season with a 9.775 on bars against Utah. She tied the same score with Arizona State and UCLA and Seattle-Pacific. Bruce scored a season high on the beam of 9.775 at Stanford. She tied the same score with California and UCLA and Seattle-Pacific. Bruce tied a season best on the beam with a score of 9.800 against Michigan and Denver.

Moving Up: Washington's score of 196.575 in a win over Arizona State was Washington's fifth best all-time score. Emily Pritchard's all-around score of 39.675 against Arizona State ties her for third all-time in Washington history. Carly Dockendorf's all-around score of 39.550 against Arizona State ties her for tenth all-time in Washington history.

Head Coach Bob Levesque: Washington head coach Bob Levesque is in his 12th season coaching the Huskies in 2002. Levesque owns a career record of 134-113-1. He came to Washington in 1991 after a career as a highly-successful club coach. He has taken the Huskies to the NCAA Championships three times (1994, 1997, 1998) and guided the team to one NCAA Regional championship (1998). Levesque was honored as the Pac-10 coach of the year in both 1997 and 1998. As a club-level coach, he tutored six future Olympians. He also coached Tanya Chaplin, the current head coach at Oregon State. Levesque is a 1972 graduate of Fresno State.

Injuries: Washington junior Stacy Wong will miss the entire 2002 season after suffering a knee injury during training on Jan. 11. Wong, UW's top performer, missed most of the 1999 season due to injuries and had to sit out the 2000 season due to an ACL injury in her right knee. Washington will also be without sophomore Daniela Medlin for the 2002 season. A series of foot surgeries will cause her to seek a medical redshirt for the year. Medlin competed on bars for Washington in 2001, recording a career-high score of 9.900 at the Pac-10 Championships. The Huskies have lost the services of sophomore Tacia LaBatte, who suffered a broken right foot on Jan. 21 during practice. Sophomore Molly Seaman suffered a season-ending knee injury during practice not even a week after winning the all-around for the Huskies against California.

Young Pups: This year's Husky team will be one of the youngest since Husky coach Bob Levesque took over the program in 1991. The active roster features just one senior (Allison Bruce), seven sophomores and five freshmen.

Local Ties: There is a distinctive northwest flavor to this year's Husky squad. A total of eight of Washington's 15 gymnasts hail from the state of Washington. Another, freshman Carly Dockendorf, is from British Columbia.
