UW FALLS TO TEXAS IN SUPER REGIONAL

Washington lost to third-ranked Texas in the Super Regional to miss out on the program's eighth Women's College World Series appearance. Texas won the first game, 1-0, and the second, 9-1.

HUSKIES SWEEP PROVO REGIONAL

The Huskies played in the Provo Regional and defeated Southern Utah, 8-0, and Kansas, 6-0 and 3-0 en route to its ninth regional championship. Freshman Danielle Lawrie was named the Regional MVP after earning all three wins for the Huskies in the circle and not allowing a single run during the tournament. The team out-hit the opposition, .408 to .086 and out-scored its competition 31-0 in 19 innings. Joining Lawrie on the Regional All-Tournament team were Dominique Lastrapes, Aimee Minor and Ashlyn Watson.

UW IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Huskies made their 13th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Washington has a 53-24 record in those games (39-8 Regionals/1-4 Super Regional/13-12 WCWS) and has advanced to the Women's College World Series seven times. UW was national runner-up in 1996 and 1999.

CONSECUTIVE NCAA APPEARANCES

Washington has made 13-straight regional appearances, which ties with Oklahoma for the fourth-longest active string in NCAA softball. Fresno State leads the way with 25 consecutive appearances, followed by California (21) and Arizona (20).

CHARTERS/LASTRAPES NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

Sophomore infielder Ashley Charters and junior second baseman Dominique Lastrapes earned third team All-America honors. The award marked the first for Charters and the second for Lastrapes who was also a third team selection in 2004. Washington has received 31 All-America awards over the last 14 years.

THREE NAMED TO ALL-PACIFIC REGION TEAMS

Three Huskies were named to the All-Pacific Region teams, including first team selection Ashley Charters and second team picks Sarah Hyatt and Dominique Lastrapes.

FIVE HUSKIES EARN ALL-PAC-10 ACCOLADES

Washington landed five players on the All-Pac-10 teams, including second team picks Ashley Charters, Dominique Lastrapes and Danielle Lawrie, and honorable mention selections Sarah Hyatt and Aimee Minor.

NOBLE NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Sophomore Caitlin Noble was named to the ESPN The Magazine All-District XIII first team, becoming the 13th Husky in UW history to receive the honor. Noble boasted a 3.38 grade-point average in History.

NOBLE/LAWRIE COMBINE FOR STRIKEOUT RECORD



Danielle Lawrie set UW records for strikeouts in a game (19) and in a season (387).

Sophomore Caitlin Noble (211) and freshman Danielle Lawrie (387) combined for 598 strikeouts to set the UW single-season record. The previous record of 517 strikeouts was set in 2000.

LAWRIE SETS TWO UW GAME STRIKEOUT RECORDS

Freshman Danielle Lawrie set two UW strikeout records within three days in April. She set the school record for most strikeouts in a game of any length when she fanned 19 UCLA Bruins on April 19 in 12 innings, and set the school record for most strikeouts in a regulation game when she struck out 19 Arizona State Sun Devils in seven innings. The previous record for most strikeouts in a game of any length was 18 set by Jennifer Spediacci vs. Oregon State on May 13, 1999 in nine innings. The mark was equalled last season by Ashley Boek who fanned 18 vs. Creighton on May 20 in 11 innings. The previous record for most strikeouts in a regulation game was 16 set by Caitlin Noble last season on Feb. 19 vs. Willamette in six innings.

LAWRIE SETS SEASON STRIKEOUT RECORD

Washington freshman Danielle Lawrie struck out 387 batters to set the Husky season record. The previous record of 316 strikeouts was set in 1999 by All-American Jennifer Spediacci. Lawrie and Spediacci are the only UW pitchers in program history to amass 300 strikeouts in a season.

UW FALLS ON WRONG SIDE OF ONE-RUN GAMES

Ten of Washington's 15 conference losses were by one run. Only three of its conference losses were by more than two runs.

CHASING CHARTERS

Sophomore Ashley Charters ranked third in the Pac-10 with 27 stolen bases last season. She has swiped 60 bases in her career (67 attempts), which ranks seventh on the UW all-time chart. Overall, the Huskies ranked second in the conference with 72 stolen bases.



Dominique Lastrapes had 67 hits and drove in 25 runs last season.

DYNAMITE DOMINIQUE

Junior All-American Dominique Lastrapes was one of Washington's most consistent players. She ranked second on the team in average (.353), runs (39), hits (67), doubles (12), RBIs (25) and steals (13).

HIT-HIT-HOORAY

Sophomore Ashley Charters led the team and ranked second in the Pac-10 with five triples. She also ranked fifth in the league with 75 hits, and seventh with a .368 average.

PLAY THE BEST TO BE THE BEST

The Huskies played 32 games against top-25 teams and accrued an 11-21 record. Washington tallied six wins over top-10 opponents, including No. 1 UCLA, No. 5 Stanford, No. 5 Oregon State, No. 8 Arizona State, No. 9 Michigan and No. 10 Louisiana-Lafayette. The Huskies were 6-17 against top-10 teams and 3-9 against top-5 teams.

HYATT CLIMBS HOME RUN LIST

Senior Sarah Hyatt finished her career with 42 career home runs to rank fourth on the UW all-time list.

FASTEST TO 200

Freshman pitcher Danielle Lawrie struck out 24 batters in two appearances against Stanford, April 1-2 to become the fastest pitcher in UW history to amass 200 strikeouts. Lawrie picked up her 200th strikeout in 134.2 innings. Sophomore Caitlin Noble had set the record last season, needing 138.1 innings to pick up 200 strikeouts. Two-time All-American Jennifer Spediacci, the only Husky to tally 200 strikeouts in three different seasons, ranks third on that list with 200 strikeouts in 148 innings in 2000.

MINOR CLIMBS HOME RUN CHART

Senior Aimee Minor hit her third home run of the season and 28th of her career on April 26 vs. UCLA. She closed out her career ranked sixth on the UW all-time list.

2006 Season Notes

TRIPLE-DOUBLE

Freshman Alicia Matthews belted three consecutive doubles vs. Stanford on April 2, tying the school record for most doubles in a single game. Matthews is in good company as she shares the record with All-Americans Jenny Topping and Michelle Church. Topping hit three doubles vs. South Florida on Feb. 18, 2000, while Church hit three doubles vs. Stanford on April 30, 1993.

"PITCHER" PERFECT

Freshman Danielle Lawrie threw a six-inning perfect game Feb. 26 vs. Utah Valley State, becoming just the third Husky to accomplish the feat. She notched a strikeout and two ground outs in the first inning before striking out the next 14 batters faced, sitting the Wolverines down in order in the second, third, fourth and fifth innings. Lawrie opened the sixth frame with two strikeouts before a foul out to the catcher ended the inning. The perfect game marked the first since Jamie Graves did it vs. Arizona State in a 3-0 victory on May 9, 1998. Nancy Wagner had Washington's first-ever perfect game on April 26, 1994 vs. Simon Fraser. The Huskies won that game 11-0 in five innings.

HYATT HITS THEM IN

Senior Sarah Hyatt led the team with 38 RBIs and ranks eighth on the UW all-time list with 150 career RBIs.

LEFTIES LEAD HUSKIES' OFFENSE

Left-handed hitters Ashley Charters, Dominique Lastrapes and Marnie Koziol headlined the UW offense with .368, .353 and .339 averages, respectively.

TYSON DOUBLES THE PLEASURE

Junior Dena Tyson made quite a return to the Huskies' lineup after missing the 2005 season with a shoulder injury. Thirteen of Tyson's 38 hits were doubles, which ranked fourth in the Pac-10.

NOBLE THROWS ONE-HITTER

Sophomore Caitlin Noble narrowly missed out on her second career no-hitter Mar. 12 when she gave up one hit vs. UCF in a five-inning mercy-rule victory at the Fresno State Bulldog Classic. Noble held the Golden Knights hitless until through 4.1 innings before Cici Alvarez hit a high chopper over Noble's head. Noble tossed a no-hitter in 2005 vs. Kansas on Feb. 26, becoming just the third UW freshman to do so.

GRAND SLAMS

Four Washington players hit grand slams last season, including senior Aimee Minor and freshmen Ashlyn Watson, Alicia Matthews and Brooke Woodward. Minor belted her third career grand slam vs. UCF on March 12. Watson hit a grand slam vs. Utah Valley State on Feb. 25 and Matthews hit a grand slam vs. Nevada on Mar. 22. Woodward hit a game-winning grand slam vs. Oregon on May 6. Washington players have hit 29 grand slams in the program's 14 years. Kathy Fiske (2002-05) holds the school record with five career grand slams, followed by Jenny Topping with four (2000) and Kim DePaul (1998-2001) and Minor with three apiece.

WASHINGTON IN THE POLLS

The Huskies finished the season ranked 15th in the final *USA Today*/NCAA Coaches Top 25 poll. The Huskies have been ranked in the poll for each of the last 166 datings. Washington's streak began with the team's No. 15 preseason ranking in 1994 and also included smaller streaks of 66 straight top-six rankings (2/28/96 - preseason 2001 poll) and 69 consecutive poll datings in the top-10 (preseason 1996 - 2/28/01).

LAWRIE NAMED PAC-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Washington freshman Danielle Lawrie was named the Pac-10 Softball Pitcher of the Week for Mar. 28-Apr. 3. Lawrie went 1-1 over the weekend with a tough 1-0 loss to Stanford on Saturday, despite allowing no earned runs. She struck out 12 batters in the complete game loss, allowing only three hits. In a six-inning, 8-0 run rule victory over the Cardinal on Sunday, Lawrie struck out 12 and allowed six hits, four of which were bunts. Stanford had not suffered a run-rule loss since May 1, 2005, and had not lost by more than three runs all season. She amassed a perfect 0.00 ERA and struck out 10 batters looking over the weekend.

TWO HUSKIES NAMED TO POTY WATCH LIST

Washington junior Dominique Lastrapes and freshman Danielle Lawrie were among 50 Division I players named to the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year watch list. Lastrapes was named to the list for the second consecutive year, while Lawrie was the only freshman on the list. The award, given out by the Amateur Softball Association, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country, and is considered one of the most prestigious honors in women's collegiate softball. Past winners of the award include UCLA's Stacey Nuveman, Florida State's Jessica Van der Linden and Texas' Cat Osterman.

AIMEE MINOR DRAFTED INTO THE NPF

Aimee Minor was drafted by the Connecticut Brackettes in the second round of the 2006 Senior College Player Selections. Minor was one of 30 athletes selected by seven National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) teams over four rounds.

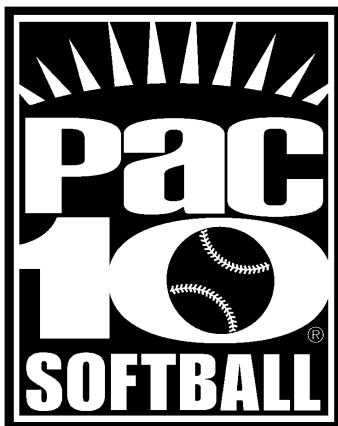
