THIS WEEK

Washington returns to Oklahoma City for the 2010 Women's College World Series, looking to defend its 2009 WCWS championship. The Huskies swept through their regional, beating North Dakota State and North Carolina (twice), and then took two of three from Oklahoma last weekend at Husky Softball Stadium. Washington, ranked No. 1 in both polls, but seeded No. 3 in the NCAA tournament, is the highest remaining seed as both No. 1 Alabama and No. 2 Michigan lost in the Super Regionals.

Washington will open play Thursday at 6:30 p.m. Pacific Time vs. Georgia. Last year, the Huskies also opened vs. Georgia, and then needed to the get past the Bulldogs to get to the championships series, which the UW did, losing the first and then winning the second semi-final game vs. Georgia. The winner of the UW-Georgia game will play the winner of the game between Tennessee and Arizona on Friday at 6:30 p.m. The losers of those two games will play Saturday at 11:30 a.m. The tournament continues through either June 8 or 9 (depending on the length of the championship series). All games will air on either ESPN or ESPN2 and all UW games will be broadcast by KKNW AM-1150 radio. You can also catch the games online at ESPN3.com or listen to the radio call at www.kknw1150.com.

WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES AT A GLANCE

The Women's College World Series, played at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City, Okla., gets underway with Thursday, June 3 with four games: Missouri vs. Hawai'i, UCLA vs. Florida, Arizona vs. Tennessee and Washington vs. Georgia. The Huskies' half of the bracket includes Georgia, Tennessee and Arizona. Each half of the bracket essentially operates in the same format as an NCAA Regional (double elimination). The winners of the two halves of the bracket then meet in the title series, which is a best-of-three June 7-8-9. Last year, the Huskies beat Georgia and Arizona State in its first two games. Needing to beat Georgia just once in two tries, the Huskies lost the first and won the second to move into the championship series. There, the UW swept Florida by scores of 8-0 and 3-2, to win the first NCAA softball championship in Husky history.

HUSKIES vs. THE WOMEN'S COLLEGE WORLD SERIES FIELD

Washington has played three of the seven other teams in the 2010 Women's College World Series this season. In total, the Huskies went 7-1 against Hawai'i, UCLA and Arizona. Here's a rundown of the Huskies' all-time record, postseason record and, where applicable, 2010 record, against the other teams in the 2010 WCWS:

#4 Florida – Washington is 3-0 vs. Florida, with all three meetings having taken place last year. In the regular season, the Huskies beat the Gators, 1-0, in nine innings in Palm Springs, Calif. Then the two teams met in the Women's College World Series championship series, which the Huskies swept, 8-0 and 3-2.

#5 UCLA – The Bruins lead the all-time series vs. the Huskies, 44-24, and UCLA is 5-1 against the Huskies in postseason play. Washington took two of three from then-No. 5 UCLA April 1 and 3 (rain forced a doubleheader on Sunday). The Bruins scored a run in the sixth to win the first game, handing Danielle Lawrie her first loss of the year. But on Sunday, the Huskies won two in a row, 3-1 and 7-2. In the first game, the UW broke the tie with two in the sixth as Shawna Wright doubled to drive in one and Jenna Clifton was hit by a pitch with the sacks full to force in another. In the nightcap, the UW scored two in the first (on an error and a Niki Williams RBI double) and never looked back. Lawrie worked 5.1 innings before getting a rest, allowing two hits and no runs while fanning eight.

#6 Georgia – Washington leads the all-time series vs. Georgia, 7-3, and the UW is 5-2 vs. UGA during the postseason. Notably, five of those 10 all-time meetings came last year – two in a tournament in Tuscaloosa, Ala., and then three more in the Women's College World Series. In Alabama, each team notched a 2-0 victory. At the WCWS, the Huskies opened play with a 3-1 win over the Bulldogs, but then had to face them in the semifinals. Georgia won the first game, 9-8 in nine innings, to force a second game, which the UW won, 9-3, to advance to the championship series.

#9 Missouri – The Huskies are 5-1 all-time against Missouri, with the series having started in 1999. The most recent matchup was in 2008, when the Huskies blanked the Tigers, 6-0, in a tournament in Albuquerque. The UW and Mizzou have never played one another in the postseason.

#10 Arizona — Arizona is 56-22 all-time against the Huskies, including 6-1 in postseason action. This season, Washington swept a three-game series from the then-second-ranked Wildcats April 9-11 at Husky Softball Stadium, winning by scores of 2-1, 7-0 and 9-3. A Hooch Fagaly RBI single scored the first run in the opener and Kimi Pohlman doubled and scored to make it 2-0. Danielle Lawrie struck out 14 in the win. In game two, Shawna Wright and Jerrin Fa'asua belted homers and Lawrie struck out 12 in a two-hitter for the win. The Huskies completed the sweep as Lawrie fanned 13 while Williams and Wright each drove in three runs.

#15 Tennessee – The Huskies are 2-2 all-time vs. the Lady Vols, with Tennessee winning games in 1998 and 2005 and the Huskies winning in 1999 and 2009. That 1999 game was an NCAA Regional game in Seattle, the only postseason matchup between the UW and UT. Last year, the Huskies opened the season with a 2-1 win over Tennessee in a game played in St. George, Utah.

#16 Hawai'i — Washington is 9-2 all-time against Hawai'i, including a 1-0 record in postseason play. The Huskies beat Rainbow Wahine twice this season in a pair of games at the Hawai'i in Honolulu. The UW won the first game, 1-0, in eight innings. With the score tied at 0-0 heading into the eighth, Jenn Salling was placed at second base on the international tiebreaker rule. A flyout moved her to third and, after a groundout, she scored on an error. Danielle Lawrie struck out 15 in the four-hit shutout. A day later, Washington beat UH, 8-4. An RBI single from Lawrie in the first opened the scoring, but Hawai'i scored two in the second to move in front. However, the Huskies posted seven in the fourth to put the game away. Maggie Wagner scored on an error to tie it and Jenna Clifton singled to drive in the go-ahead run. A fielder's choice and an error brought home two more and the UW capped the inning with another RBI single from Lawrie and a two-run homer from Niki Williams. Lawrie went the distance for the victory.

THREE-SEED MAGIC?

The Huskies earned the No. 3 seed for the NCAA Tournament, the same seed they earned for last year's tournament before going on to win the Women's College World Series. UW has been seeded No. 1 overall just once in their history, which came in 2000, but they went on to finish just fifth at the WCWS that year. The No. 3 seed equals the second-highest ranking for UW in school history, something they have done twice before and has brought them good luck each time. Besides last year's national-champion three-seed, UW was also picked third in 1999, going on to finish as national runner-up.

HOME SWEET HOME

UW hosted a regional two weekends ago for the first time since 2000 and then hosted just its second-ever Super Regional and first since 2007, when they defeated Alabama to advance to the Women's College World Series. Last year, the Huskies spent the entire postseason on the road, going from NCAA Regionals in Amherst, Mass., straight to Atlanta, Ga., for Super Regionals before flying directly to Oklahoma City for the World Series. This year, UW will spend the first two weekends at home before getting on a plane to OKC. Prior to Thursday's 6-1 loss to

With their 16-1 record at Husky Softball Stadium during the regular season, the Huskies completed the most successful home season in school history, just edging last year's squad which went 15-1. UW won their first five games in Seattle before falling to UCLA but went on to win their next 11 in front of the home crowd. With their 5-1 home record in the postseason, they are up to 21-2 overall. The Huskies' 13-game home winning streak was snapped in Thursday's loss to Oklahoma, so the longest home winning streak in school history remains a 15-gamer held by the 1996 team, which went 18-2 overall at Husky Softball Stadium en route to its first World Series appearance. UW averaged 1,399 fans per game at Husky Softball Stadium this year including back-to-back season highs their final regular-season weekend of 2,080 and 2,159.

LET THERE BE LIGHTS

After spending the final three weeks of the 2009 season on the road during the postseason because Husky Softball Stadium was not equipped with lights, the Huskies were lucky enough to get some generous donations from their supporters to install lights at the field for 2010. The Huskies, who cashed in on making themselves eligible for postseason by earning an NCAA Regional host site, played the first night game in the 15-year history of Husky Softball Stadium on Thursday, March 11 when they hosted Miami of Ohio in the first game of the Husky Softball Classic. The Huskies didn't disappoint their home crowd as reigning National Player of the Year Danielle Lawrie fired a perfect game to lead UW to a 3-0 win. All told, UW played 15 of its 23 home games this year under the lights.

HUSKIES IN THE RANKINGS

The Huskies retained the No. 1 spot in both of the final regular-season NFCA and USA Softball polls. They were the No. 1 team in both polls every week this season, the first time that has ever happened in the USA Softball poll since its inception in 2003. The Huskies were a unanimous choice on eight occasions in the NFCA poll and seven times in the USA Softball poll. No. 2 Michigan, No. 3 Alabama, No. 4 UCLA and No. 6 Arizona all received No. 1 votes during the season but never enough to shake the Huskies

The only rating in which UW did not rank No. 1 heading into the postseason was the NCAA's RPI, which takes strength of schedule into consideration. UW came in at No. 2 in that ranking behind Alabama. The Huskies started the season ranked No. 1 for the first time in school history. Seven of the eight Pac-10 teams finished the regular-season ranked, with four of those seven in the top 10 (Washington, Arizona, UCLA, Arizona State).

HUSKY POSTSEASON HISTORY

The Huskies are in the midst of their 17th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, missing out only during their inaugural season in 1993. Washington has a 77-32 record in postseason (50-12 Regionals/7-5 Super Regionals/20-15 WCWS) and has advanced to the Women's College World Series 10 times (1996-2000, '03, '04, '07, '09, '10), finally winning the National Championship last year with a 2-0 sweep over Florida in the best-of-three championship series.

The Huskies had previously advanced to the national championship game in both 1996 and '99. Their 17-straight tournament appearances are tied for the fifth-longest active streak with Oklahoma, while their 77 wins in the tournament are fifth-best in NCAA history. Additionally, UW's 10 WCWS appearances are fifth-most in history.

REPEAT?

After taking 17 years to win their first title, the Huskies will look to become the first team to win back-to-back titles since Arizona in 2006 and '07 and just the sixth team overall.

2009 IN REVIEW

The Huskies finally captured the program's first national championship in its ninth trip to the Women's College World Series, sweeping then-No. 1 Florida, two-games-to-none, in the best-of-three Championship Series. Led by WCWS Most Outstanding Player Danielle Lawrie, the Huskies blew the Gators away, 8-0, in game one before a dramatic 3-2 series-clinching victory. Lawrie, who was also named the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, went 5-1 with a 1.88 ERA in the World Series and All-American senior Ashley Charters capped her career by hitting .476 in the series.

The Huskies also got clutch performances from underclassmen in the final week, with freshmen Kimi Pohlman and Niki Williams and sophomore Morgan Stuart being named All-College World Series while sophomore transfer Jenn Salling started showing signs of her All-American form as the season progressed. UW's 51 wins were the fourth-most in school history and the championship was UW's first in its 17-year history. The Huskies also finished the Pac-10 season with a 14-7 record, finishing second to UCLA, their most conference wins and highest finish since 2000.

PAC-10 CHAMPS!

With a three-game sweep of Stanford in the second-to-last Pac-10 weekend, and with UCLA and Arizona each losing the same week, the Huskies clinched their third Pac-10 title in school history and first since 2000. UW then made sure it wouldn't have to share the crown when they won two-of-three from Arizona State over the final weekend, clinching its first outright title since 1996, the year the Huskies won their first conference championship and went on to finish as the NCAA runner-up.

The Huskies finished with a record of 17-4 in Pac-10, winning all seven series they played, three via sweep. Their 17 wins equaled the most by a Husky team since the conference shifted to a 21-game format in 2000. That year, the team also went 17-4 and shared the Pac-10 title with Arizona. The 1996 team won the crown with a 23-4 record. After taking two-of-three at Arizona State, UW joined the 2000 team as the only ones in school history to win every conference season series.

Pac-10 Coach of the Year

NCAA REGIONALS WRAP-UP

The Huskies waited a long time to host an NCAA Regional - 10 years to be exact - and they didn't disappoint the home crowd, winning three close games to advance to the NCAA Super Regionals. UW opened up with a 3-0 win over 2009 Super Regional participant North Dakota State, with Danielle Lawrie firing a four-hit shutout with 13 strikeouts while also providing the offense with a two-run home run. On Saturday, the Huskies used an unearned run to eek out a 1-0 win over North Carolina, with Lawrie breaking her own school record with her 22nd shutout, allowing just two hits and striking out 11. Then on Sunday, with UNC needing to win three games in one day including two over UW - the Huskies were able to escape the winner-take-all game when they won a 2-1 thriller in eight innings on freshman Shawna Wright's walk-off double down the left field line. Lawrie out-dueled Tar Heel ace Danielle Spaulding - who fired two no-hitters over the weekend - for the second time, allowing just one run on three hits and striking out 15, giving her 39 Ks and just one walk in 22 innings over the weekend.

NCAA SUPER REGIONALS REPORT

Washington faced a stern test in the NCAA Super Regionals as Oklahoma took the series to a third game. In the first of the three, the Sooners belted five home runs (three from Amber Flores) and knocked off the Huskies, 6-1, in front of a standing-room crowd at Husky Softball Stadium. However, with their backs against the ropes, the Huskies came out swinging the following day, posting back-to-back shutout wins over Oklahoma, 3-0 and 4-0. In the second inning of the first game, Niki Williams tripled and scored on a Taylor Smith double for the first run, and then got a bases-loaded walk to Hooch Fagaly and a groundout to score two more. Meanwhile, Danielle Lawrie threw a two-hitter, striking out 10. In the nightcap, freshman catcher Shawna Wright got things started with a three-run homer in the first and it was for than enough for Lawrie, who went the distance once more, fanning 17 in a five-hit shutout.

THE 50-WIN MARK

When the Huskies won their 40th game of the season, they reached that milestone for the 14th time in the 18-year history of the program and now at 50-7, have notched the eighth 50-win season in school history. The Huskies won 62 games in 2000 (62-9) to set the school record. At this point, the maximum number of wins the Huskies could record this season would be 55, which would be the third-highest total in school history.

THEY SAY DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS...

Perhaps overshadowed by Danielle Lawrie and a powerful offense, the Husky defense may be the most underrated reason why UW has been ranked No. 1 in the nation all season. As of the latest rankings, the Huskies lead the Pac-10 and rank seventh in the nation with a .976 fielding percentage, making just 36 errors in 57 games. They had gone a season-high nine games without an error recently before the streak was broken against Stanford. With at least two games remaining, UW is on pace to smash the school record for fewest errors in a season, set by the 2000 team which made 48 and also owns the highest fielding percentage in school history (.977). The Huskies have given up just seven unearned runs in 57 games this season after giving up 31 in 63 games last year.

AS STEADY AS THEY GET

As a team, UW has been as consistent as they come this year, losing just seven games all year and never dropping two games in succession. In fact, only once has UW lost games on consecutive weekends, which happened recently when the Huskies dropped a game at Oregon, then lost one to Cal on the road. UW lost its first game on Feb. 19 then won 18 straight before falling to DePaul. UW would win their next five before being up-ended by UCLA but they bounced back to win the next six conference games. They only slipped a bit on the road in conference play, dropping two in a four-game span, but they rebounded to win seven straight to clinch the Pac-10 title.

MERCY MI

The Huskies defeated Arizona State, 9-0, on the final regular-season weekend for their 16th mercy-rule victory this year. They had 14 last year, including four in Pac-10 play. This year, UW had five mercy-rule wins in five innings in conference play, breaking last year's mark for the most in school history. Three of those wins came against ranked teams as they took down Cal, Stanford and Arizona State all in five. UW also won five games via the run-rule in 2005, but two of those lasted six innings.

UNDERCLASSMEN PULLING THEIR WEIGHT

In last year's Women's College World Series, UW's offense was carried mostly by underclassmen and through most of conference play, the freshmen and sophomores were once again clutch down the stretch. Sophomores Kimi Pohlman and Niki Williams and freshmen Shawna Wright and Hooch Fagaly led the way for the Dawgs, with Pohlman leading the team in average (.418), hits (28), runs (20) and stolen bases (9) and Wright leading the team in doubles (7), home runs (4), RBI (24) and slugging percentage (.629). Williams ranked second on the team with 16 RBI while Fagaly drew a team-high 17 walks and led the team in on base percentage (.484).

SECOND TO NONE

With 12 strikeouts in the final regular-season weekend, Danielle Lawrie broke the Pac-10's career strikeout record, moving past Arizona great Alicia Hollowell in the final game of the weekend. In the first weekend of the postseason, Lawrie became just the fourth pitcher in NCAA history to go over the 1,800-K mark (she's now at 1,843) and she will end the season No. 4 on the all-time charts. The No. 3 spot all-time is held by Virginia Tech's Angela Tincher, who finished with 2,149, out of reach for the Husky senior.

AWARDS PILING UP FOR LAWRIE

At this rate, Danielle Lawrie is going to have to buy a house just for all the hardware she's earning this year. After going 3-0 against Stanford late in Pac-10 play, allowing one run and six hits in 20 innings with 34 strikeouts and a no-hitter while also going 4-for-9 with four RBI and a walk-off home run, the senior was named the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week along with both the NFCA National Player of the Week and the USA Softball National Player of the Week. The conference honor was her record-breaking seventh of the season, breaking her own mark set last year, and was the 17th of her career, extending another record. She won the award again in the final week of the season to give her eight on the year, including six of the last seven weeks, and 18 in her career. She ended the

Pac-10 season with a 17-2 record and 1.01 ERA with 212 strikeouts against some of the best teams in the country. In fact, her 212 conference Ks were exactly twice as many as the second-most by a pitcher in conference play, with Arizona's Kenzie Fowler fanning 106. She parlayed those numbers into being named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year for the second straight year.

Lawrie also made national history with her USA Softball Player of the Week honor, becoming the first player to ever win the award three times in a single season. Last year's USA Softball Player of the Year won the award following the opening week of the season - when she also won the NFCA POW as well - and earned her second honor after going 3-0 against then-No. 2 Arizona.

Of course, several major awards remain. Tuesday before the start of the Women's College World Series, the USA Softball National Player of the Year will be awarded, and Lawrie is one of three finalists. She won that honor last season and could become only the second woman ever to win it in consecutive seasons.

CHASING HERSELF

While she has no one else to chase in the Husky record books, Danielle Lawrie is doing a pretty good job of chasing down her own records, most of which she set last year. With 478 strikeouts on the season, Lawrie is second on the UW single-season charts and now owns the top four spots all time, setting the record with 521 last year, as well as ranking third with 457 in 2007 and fourth with 387 in 2006. Jennifer Spediacci is the only other Husky in the top five, striking out 316 in 2000. With two more shutouts in the first week of postseason play, then two more in the Supers to give her 24, Lawrie broke her own single-season mark of 21 set last year. She's also won five postseason games to give her 40 on the season, second on the single-season charts, behind her record 42 last year.

HEATING HE

Danielle Lawrie made as much noise in the preseason with her bat as she did with her arm, but once conference play started, the senior went into a bit of a funk. She went just 2-for-16 over the first two weekends with one RBI and was in the midst of a 2-for-17 funk with no RBI over her last six games going into UW's home weekend against Stanford. Lawrie then broke out by going 4-for-9 with four RBI against the Cardinal, including a two-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the seventh inning of the second game to give UW a 2-1 win. She then went 5-for-11 with eight RBI in UW's final regular-season series against ASU, hitting a home run in each of the first two games while going 3-for-3 with five RBI in the finale. She hit another two-run shot in a 3-0 win over North Dakota State to open NCAA Tournament play and since her 2-for-17 funk, Lawrie is batting .343 (12-for-35) with four home runs and 14 RBI in the last 12 games.

WALK AWAY

What has made Danielle Lawrie perhaps even better in 2010 than she was in her record-setting 2009 season is the lack of walks the pitcher has allowed this season. Lawrie has given up just 41 walks in 288.1 innings and 46 appearances this season, a 1.00 walks-per-seven innings ratio. By comparison, Lawrie walked 76 in 352 innings. Last year, she went into conference play with 28 walks. This season she had just seven walks heading into Pac-10 play before conference batters had a little better eye against her. Still, Lawrie has had 22 appearances without a walk this year after just 16 all last year in 52 appearances.

DON'T MAKE HER MAD

After giving up a season-high tying four runs in her third loss of the season against Oregon on April 17, Lawrie had been unbeatable, going 14-0 with a 0.57 ERA (seven earned runs in 85 innings) and 163 strikeouts in 94 innings prior to a loss to Oklahoma last Thursday in the first game of the NCAA Super Regionals. She allowed just two earned runs over her next 63 innings after the Oregon outing. After breaking the win streak in the loss to Oklahoma, she came back the next day by firing back-to-back shutouts, striking out 27 over the two games.

Lawrie threw 25-consecutive scoreless after the loss to Oregon before Oregon State scored a run in the first inning of their first game three weeks ago. She then threw another 26-consecutive scoreless innings before Stanford All-American and USA National Team player Ashley Hansen went yard against her three weekends ago. The longest scoreless streak of Lawrie's career came early last season when she went 64.1 consecutive innings without allowing a single run and also went 90.0 straight without allowing an earned run.

PERFECTION... AGAIN... AND AGAIN

Danielle Lawrie tied a Pac-10 record against Cal this year when she fired her third perfect game of the season. She now has four in her career, one shy of another conference record. Lawrie kicked off the season in style with her first-career seven-inning perfect game against Auburn in the season opener, then did the same against Miami of Ohio in UW's home opener. She struck out 16 of the 21 batters she faced in the 5-0 win over Auburn and fanned 14 against Miami, needing just 62 pitches to mow down all 21 hitters.

Lawrie is now tied for second in Pac-10 history with Arizona's Alicia Hollowell with four perfect games, one shy

of former Cal great Michelle Granger. Lawrie joins Marcy Crouch of Stanford in 1999 and Hollowell in 2005 as pitchers with three perfectos in a season. She also held Stanford hitless two weeks ago to give her eight no-hitters, tied for sixth in conference history in that category. The eight no-hitters also are a school record, ahead of Eve Gaw and Jennifer Spediacci who were each a part of six no-hitters, but both had four solo and two combined. All eight of Lawrie's no-hitters have been of the solo variety.

GOOD COMPANY

Freshman Shawna Wright's 12 home runs in her first year in Seattle are the most by a Husky freshman since four-time All-American Kristen Rivera hit 16 in 2002. Jaime Clark holds the record for a true freshman with 23 in 2000 while redshirt freshman Jenny Topping had 24 in the same season. Both ended up playing for the U.S. National Team and winning gold medals while Rivera was a three-time First Team All-American and UW's only four-time All-American.

WRIGHT HITS AT THE RIGHT TIME

Freshman Shawna Wright has shown a knack for getting her hits when it means the most. The rookie, who hit a game-winning, pinch-hit home run for her first career hit, still has more RBI (54) than hits (49) with her 54 RBI second on the team behind Danielle Lawrie. She had a career-high five RBI in a game against Stanford recently and has had three or more RBI in a game eight times to lead the team. The more runners are on base, the better Wright gets as she is hitting .258 with the bases empty, .317 with runners on base, .333 with runners in scoring position and .571 (4-for-7) with the bases loaded. Perhaps her biggest hit of the season came in the first weekend of the postseason, when she delivered a one-out, RBI double in the bottom of the eighth inning to give UW a 2-1 walk-off victory over North Carolina in the Regional Championship. She also had a big hit in the Super Regionals, when she belted a three-run homer in the first inning the decisive game three, a 4-0 Husky win.

Wright really picked up her game in conference play, leading the team with 24 RBI, which ranked second in the conference. Her first seven hits went for extra bases, as she ripped five doubles and hit two home runs over the first three weekends, and her seven doubles in conference games ended up tied for the lead. She had three doubles in the conference-opening series against UCLA - including a game-winning two-run double in a 3-1 win in the second game - then added two more doubles and a home run against No. 2 Arizona and had a three-run two-bagger recently against Stanford. Wright was last week named not just Second Team All-Pac-10 for her efforts, but also First Team All-Pacific Region, just the third Husky freshman ever to earn that honor, joining All-Americans and USA National Team members Jaime Clark and Kristen Rivera.

STEADY BACKSTOP

As impressive as she's been with the bat, freshman Shawna Wright has been equally as impressive behind the plate, where she's been working well with Danielle Lawrie and has been tough to run on. Earlier this season, Wright gunned down Purdue's Lianne Horiuchi to snap her streak of 63 consecutive stolen bases, which was the longest active streak in the nation and is the fifth-longest in NCAA history. The freshman has caught 12 of 29 would-be base stealers and has also picked five runners off the bases, to lead the Pac-10 Conference in both

On the weekend UW clinched the Pac-10 title against Stanford, Wright's defense made the difference in a thrilling 2-1 come-from-behind win. With a runner on first in the sixth and Ashley Hansen at the plate, Wright gunned down Stanford's runner trying to steal. While Hansen would then hit a home run to put the Cardinal up 1-0, that run saved proved to be a big one for UW. Then in the seventh, with runners on first and second and one out, Danielle Lawrie struck out a Stanford batter swinging and in one motion, Wright caught the ball and gunned it down to second from her knees, picking off the unsuspecting Stanford runner at second. The strike-em-out, throw-em-out double play gave UW the momentum and Wright led off the bottom of the inning with a single, setting up Lawrie's walk-off, two-run home run for the 2-1 win. The next week against ASU with UW leading, 5-4, in the bottom of the seventh and the tying runner on first, Lawrie and Wright executed a game-ending strike-em-out, throw-em-out double play to clinch the outright Pac-10 title.

WALK IT OUT

Jenn Salling has proven to be one of the most patient hitters in the college game, drawing 38 walks this season to lead the squad. She reached base in each of the first 14 games this season via either hit or walk and has reached base via either hit, walk or hit by pitch in 49 of 57 games overall. She drew a career-high three walks in the final game against Oregon State recently ranks ninth in UW history in single-season walks.

Overall as a team, UW has 184 walks this year. Should they reach their same number of games played this year as last year (63) and continue at that pace, UW would finish the season with 215 walks, which would rank as the third-most in school history behind the 2000 team, which drew 251 walks in 71 games, and the 1996 team, which had 218 in 68 games. The 2000 team averaged 3.53 walks per game while the 1996 team average 3.21, compared to this year's teams 3.41 walks-per-game average. On the flip side, UW pitchers have walked just 64 batters, 30 less than second-place ASU. The record for fewest walks in a season at UW is 71 by the 1999 staff.

THAT'S MORE LIKE IT

Husky fans are seeing the full range of talent they saw glimpses of in a half-season last year from Jenn Salling. The junior got off to an incredible start in her first full season with the Dawgs, hitting well over .400 throughout the non-conference schedule. While she "cooled off" a bit in conference play, hitting .291, she is still leading the team in runs (50), walks (38), triples (4) and on base percentage (.476) and is second on the team in average (.346), doubles (9) and stolen bases (13-13) and was named First-Team All-Pac-10 and First Team All-Pacific Region. Most important to her game this year might be the power and speed returning, two things she lacked last year as she worked her way back into playing shape. In 89 at bats last season, Salling failed to hit a home run but she has already blasted six this season. She is also a perfect 13-for-13 on steal attempts after stealing just two bases in 30 games last year.

Last year, the 2007 All-American joined the Huskies midway through the season in Pac-10 play after sitting out nearly a full year. While she started 0-for-14, the shortstop gradually got her timing back and when the Huskies needed her most in the postseason, she was back displaying the skills that made her a First Team All-American as a freshman. Salling went into the postseason batting .146 (7x48) but went on a tear at the NCAA Regionals in Amherst, Mass., leading the team with a .571 average (8x14). She hit .415 overall in postseason to raise her overall average to .270.

IT'S A TOSS UP

Heather Tarr has experimented with both Jenn Salling and Kimi Pohlman at the leadoff spot over the latter part of the season and it's pretty much worked out any way you slice it. If only the Huskies could somehow have both players leadoff an inning. Salling has been incredible as the first batter of an inning this year, reaching base on 24 of 38 (a scorching .632 mark). She has also been highly successful in advancing runners - a key for the No. 2 batter - moving runners over at a .577 clip (56-for-97), the best on the team. Pohlman, meanwhile, has been no slouch at leadoff either, where she has appeared 44 times in 57 games. The sophomore has reached in 40 of 80 innings she's led off.

COMING INTO HER OWN

After an outstanding freshman campaign, in which she earned Second Team All-Region and All-Pac-10 honors, Kimi Pohlman is showing no signs of a sophomore slump, leading the team with a .356 average, 68 hits, four triples and 22 stolen bases (22-for-25), while also ranking second on the team in runs (47). Pohlman really got on a roll in Pac-10 play, batting a team-high .418 with 20 runs, 28 hits and seven stolen bases, hitting safely in 17 of 21 conference games. That stretch included a career-high 10-game hitting streak, during which she batted .500 (17-for-34) with five multi-hit games. Overall in conference play, she had nine multi-hit games and she was rewarded last week when she was named not only First Team All-Pac-10, but also First Team All-Pacific Region.

Pohlman had some moments of inconsistency early in the season, hitting just .160 (4-for-25) over an eight-game stretch, which included four-straight games without a hit. But since then she has hit safely in 33 of 43 games. She had a hit in 10 of 11 between the Bank of Hawaii Invitational and the Husky Softball Classic, during which she hit .515 (17-33) with 11 runs scored. She also continues to be near-automatic on the base paths, swiping 22 in 25 attempts, making her an impressive 42-for-46 in her career.

STARTING TO CLICK

Niki Williams came to Washington as a heralded recruit out of California and while it took her a little while to get things going, now that she has she appears to be headed for quite a career. Williams made a name for herself at last year's Women's College World Series, belting three home runs and setting WCWS records for RBI in a game (7) and series (10) while leading the Huskies to the national championship. But it wasn't always that easy.

Williams went into the postseason batting a solid .291 but had just two home runs and 22 RBI in 51 games. In the 63 games since the World Series started, Williams has hit 14 home runs and driven in 53 runs. She didn't get off to a great start this season, going 0-for-7 over the first couple games, but since then she has hit safely in 40 of 55 games, including a career-best 12-game hitting streak, during which she hit .541 (20-for-37). With 11 home runs so far this season, she has more than doubled her total from her freshman year in which she hit five in 57 games. She was named the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Week earlier this season after hitting .588 with four home runs and 11 RBI in the Cathedral City Classic. She had some big games in conference play as well, finishing third on the team with 16 RBI, with one noteworthy stretch when she collected at least one hit and one RBI in five straight games, hitting .545 (6-for-11) with seven RBI and seven runs scored in those games.

A WALK IN THE PARK

Freshman Hooch Fagaly has proven to have a keen set of eyes, particularly over the last couple months. Fagaly drew 17 walks in 21 conference games this year, which ranked third in the league. She drew at least one walk in each of the first six games and going back to the end of non-conference play, Fagaly had an eight-game walking streak before she was not walked against Oregon. She then got back on track, drawing four walks in three games against Cal and three against OSU. Fagaly has drawn two walks in a game six times this year, including her second-career game back in February. Overall, the rookie has drawn 31 bases on balls this year to rank second on the team and she also ranks second with a .456 on base percentage. When she is pitched to, Fagaly has proven to be a solid hitter, batting .283 with five doubles, two home runs and 19 RBI. Things started to click for her in conference play, where she ranked fifth on the team with a .289 average and fourth with eight RBI. She hit safely in seven of eight games and in 10 of 12 after going hitless in her first three career Pac-10 games.

NO AVERAGE SMITH ANYMORE

With a name like Smith, it's easy to blend in but Taylor Smith did anything but in the Judi Garman Classic, making a name for herself with a record-setting weekend. A part-time starter for the Huskies, Smith's weekend got off to a slow start as she went 0-for-2 in a pair of pinch-hitting appearances over the first three games. But Heather Tarr penciled Smith's name into the starting lineup on Saturday against Utah and she made the most of her opportunity, having what was at that point a career day, going 3-for-3 with a pair of two-run home runs and a career-high five RBI. It marked her first career three-hit game, first two-home run game and the five RBI were easily a career best.

As if that weren't impressive enough, Smith exploded on Sunday for two grand slams against Purdue to tie the UW school record for RBI in a single game with eight, a record set back in 1993. She became the first Husky to ever hit two grand slams in a game and her 13 RBI is also a two-game record. For her efforts, Smith was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week. Smith has added three more home runs since then, including jacks in consecutive games in the final regular-season weekend. Despite starting just 22 of 57 games this year, Smith is fourth on the team in home runs (8) and fifth in RBI (25). She is also slugging a team-best .647. Eight of Smith's 19 hits this season have been homers.

TAKING ONE FOR THE TEAM

While Morgan Stuart's stats may not indicate she's had a great offensive season, the junior is finding ways to contribute and help her team win games. As always, Stuart is leading the team in times hit by a pitch, getting plunked 10 times this year which leads the conference. That mark also ranks tied for fifth on the UW single-season charts, nine shy of the record set by Kim DePaul in 2000 and two shy of Stuart's career high of 12 set last year, which placed her third in the single-season record book. The junior has now been hit by a pitch 29 times in her career, just one shy of breaking into the NCAA's all-time top-25. Stuart is also fourth on the team in doubles (6) and is fifth in walks (16) along with playing solid defense at the hot corner.

SETTLING IN

Senior Amanda Fleischman has long been one of the Huskies top utility players throughout her career, appearing everywhere on the field except the pitcher's circle. But it seems she has finally found a permanent home on the field at second base as the Woodinville, Wash., native has stepped up in conference games, taking advantage of her opportunity to play every day. After batting just .200 (5-for-25) over the first 29 games of the season in a platoon role with freshman Jerrin Fa' asua, Fleischman has picked things up since then, hitting .323 (20-for-62) with nine runs and nine stolen bases. She started 19 of 21 conference games and after going 4-for-6 over the final weekend against ASU, she bumped her conference average up to .310, third on the team. Another solid weekend in NCAA Regionals (3-for-8, two stolen bases) and Super Regionals (2-for-8) bumped Fleischman up to .287. She has been steadily climbing over the last few weeks, going from .238 on May 8 to .287 now by going 10-for-her-last-24 (.417) with three multi-hit games.

STENSON STEPS UP

After starting her senior season off a little slowly, going just 1-for-13 over the first 11 games, Bailey Stenson went on a tear over a two-week span to get herself back in the lineup. Things turned around for Stenson in the Bank of Hawaii Invitational when she had a pair of multi-hit games - including one in which she had two hits in one inning - and batted .400 with three runs and three RBI. Stenson continued her hot hitting in the Husky Softball Classic, going 5-for-13 with three runs, an RBI and two stolen bases. After her 1-for-13 stretch, Stenson hit .458 (11-for-24) over the next 11 games to raise her average from .077 to a season-high .324.

HARD TO BEAT

Before No. 5 UCLA handed Danielle Lawrie her first loss of the season - and first since May 31, 2009 - in the opening Pac-10 game, the senior was able to put together a 21-game winning streak dating back to the Women's College World Series. Her 21-consecutive victories put her in a tie for 14th in NCAA history for most consecutive wins. Arizona's Jennie Finch holds the record that may never be broken, winning 60 consecutive games over three seasons, including a perfect 32-0 record in 2001.

NO. 2 NO MATCH

Danielle Lawrie was named both the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week and the USA Softball National Player of the Week for the second time this year after shutting down then-No. 2 Arizona - which boasts the nation's highest-scoring offense - three times. She allowed just four runs in 21.0 innings, striking out 39 and walking just four. She threw one shutout and held Arizona scoreless for 12 consecutive innings over the three games at one point, shutting down the Cats in the final inning Friday, throwing seven scoreless Saturday and holding Arizona without a run through the first four innings on Sunday. The Langley, B.C., native struck out at least 12 in every game, including a high of 14 on Friday before backing it up with 12 on Saturday and 13 on Sunday, while not walking a batter in the final game.

BAT WOMAN

With all the focus on her pitching in the past, Lawrie is now starting to get some attention for her bat. She got off to a blistering start at the plate this year and has belted a team-high 15 home runs with 57 RBI, both of which would have led the team last year as Ashlyn Watson finished with 11 home runs and Morgan Stuart with 37 RBI in 63 games. Lawrie has already surpassed her previous career-highs of 10 home runs set in 2007 and 31 RBI last year and now has 34 home runs in her career, moving her into a tie for fifth in Husky history. She also recently passed the 100-RBI mark in her career, the 17th player in UW history to reach the century mark.

CENTURY MARK

With two wins in the Campbell Cartier Classic, Danielle Lawrie reached the 100-win mark, breaking UW's career wins record. Jennifer Spediacci previously held the record, having won 100 games between 1997-2000, but Lawrie earned wins No. 100 and 101 against UC Santa Barbara and San Diego State. Lawrie has now broken three UW career records this season. With two starts in San Diego, she reached 129 in her career, passing the previous mark set by Ashley Boek from 2002-05 of 127. More recently, she broke the career appearances record to give her seven of the 10 career pitching records at UW.

QUITE AN OPENING STATEMENT

Danielle Lawrie made quite a statement over the opening weekend that she's not ready to relinquish her title of College Softball Player of the Year. All Lawrie did was go 3-0 with a save and 21.0 shutout innings, striking out 45 batters while walking just one. To top things off, one of her wins was a perfect game, the first seven-inning perfect game of her career and just the second in Husky history. Lawrie was also a menace at the plate, belting four home runs - including a grand slam - and driving in nine runs. The only game she didn't pitch in, Lawrie hit two home runs and drove in a career-high six runs, all of which ended in her being named the National Player of the Week by both USA Softball and the NFCA for the second time in her career

HOT START

The Huskies went into Pac-10 play having completed one of the best non-conference slates in school history. Their 28-2 record is the third-best 30-game start in school history and also marks the second-fewest losses heading into Pac-10 play in UW history. The 2000 team started a program-best 29-1 through 30 games while the 2003 team started 28-1-1. That 2003 team went into conference play with a 31-1-1 record, the best preseason record in school history. Both teams went on to play in the Women's College World Series. Last year's national championship-winning team went into conference play with a 27-3 mark before going 14-7 in Pac-10 for a second-place finish.

GOING STREAKING

The Huskies' 28-2 start to the season included an 18-game winning streak, the fourth-longest in school history. This year's streak trailed only the 19-game win streaks of last year's national championship-winning team as well as the 1996 team - which finished second in the nation - and the 2000 team, which won 23 in a row early in the season and got off to a 32-1 start, the best in school history. HUSKIES REACH PROGRAM MILESTONE

With two wins in a three-game series at Oregon, the Huskies reached a program milestone with win No. 800. The Husky program began in 1993 with a 31-27 record and since then, UW has made 17-consecutive NCAA postseason appearances, winning at least 40 games in 14 of those campaigns. The Huskies won a school-record 62 games in 2000 and won 51 in their national-championship winning season last year, the sixth 50-win season in program history. UW has already reached 45 wins this season, matching the program's average wins per season.

TARR REACHES MILESTONE

Head coach Heather Tarr picked up two wins in the Campbell Cartier Classic earlier this year to reach a big milestone in her career. UW's win over San Diego State was her 200th career victory as a head coach, all at her alma mater. The former All-Pac-10 third baseman for the Huskies, Tarr led the Huskies to 51 wins last year - her first 50-win season - and the program's first national championship. She has a career record of 243-110-1, good for a .688 winning percentage.

SEASON DEBUTS

With its win in their season-opening game against Auburn, the Huskies have now won four consecutive season openers. UW has opened each of its 18 seasons with a multiple-team tournament, accruing a 69-17-1 record. The Huskies have gone undefeated in six of those tournaments (1996, 2000, '02, '03, '09, '10), including a 5-0 mark in this year's Kajikawa Classic. UW is now 14-4 in season openers all-time after defeating Auburn, 5-0.

WILLIAMS, WRIGHT NAMED TO FUTURES TEAM

Washington sophomore Niki Williams and freshman Shawna Wright were named to the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America's 18-player 2010 USA Softball Women's Futures National Team. The squad, which includes both USA Softball rookies and those with program experience, consists of athletes who currently play or have played at 13 schools in six Division I conferences.

The Futures Team will kick off the season with exhibition games against the 2010 USA Softball Women's National Team in Canton and Ashland, Ohio, June 16-17. They will also compete against the National Teams of Canada, Japan and the USA at the 2010 World Cup of Softball, July 22-26, at the ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City, Okla. Members of the Futures Team will also fill spots on the USA team competing at the Canadian Open Fast Pitch International Championship, July 7-11, in Surrey, B.C. and exhibition games in Whitehorse, Yukon, July 13-14. Futures players will also be included on the rosters for the Japan Cup, August 3-9, in Sendai City, Japan. Wright has already been confirmed to play in the Canadian Open Fast Pitch International Championships along with former Husky and three-time All-American Ashley Charters. Charters has also been confirmed to compete in the Japan Cup.

HUSKIES PICKED TO WIN PAC-10

The Huskies were picked to finish first in the Pac-10 conference in a vote of league coaches, receiving the maximum seven first-place votes, and they proved the coaches right by winning their third title. Arizona was picked to finish second while UCLA, last year's Pac-10 champ who received the only other first-place vote, finished third but edged Arizona for second in the final standings. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team to win the conference. Arizona State, the 2008 national champion, and Stanford tied for fourth while California, one of five Pac-10 teams with a World Series title, was picked sixth. Oregon and Oregon State rounded out the vote in seventh and eighth, respectively.

UW was picked to finish third last year before finishing second to UCLA with a 14-7 mark. The Pac-10 has won 22 of the 27 NCAA Division I softball championships, including the last four straight, and will look to add to that mark in 2010.



Sixth Season Alma Mater: Washington (1998)

Heather Tarr is currently in her sixth season at the helm of the Husky Softball team in 2010 after leading the Huskies to the program's first National Championship in 2009, with her squad defeating then-No. 1 ranked Florida, two-games-to-none, in the Women's College World Series Championship Series.

After leading the program to its 16th consecutive postseason berth in 2009, Tarr and her team gutted out the longest game in program history in the NCAA Regional final, defeating UMass 6-1 on the Minutewomen's home field in 15 innings. The Huskies then swept through the best-of-three Super Regionals over Georgia Tech in Atlanta before the three-week road trip continued in Oklahoma City. In their ninth Women's College World Series appearance and second in Tarr's five seasons, the Huskies dominated the Gators to bring home the title.

The Huskies finished the 2009 season atop both the NFCA and ESPN.com polls for the first time in program history. Their 51 wins equaled the fourth-most in program history and the most for a Tarr-led Husky team. Following the season, Tarr and her staff were not only named the Pacific Region Coaching Staff of the Year, but also the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year.

Individual honors also came pouring in, as Danielle Lawrie was named the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year and the Honda Award winner, the first Husky softball player to ever earn such honors. Lawrie and senior Ashley Charters were named First Team All-Americans.

Tarr's team peaked at the right time in 2009, with their offensive prowess on display at the World Series in addition to Lawrie's outstanding pitching which led to her being named the Women's College World Series Most Outstanding Player. Husky players set several College World Series records, with Niki Williams breaking records for most RBI in a game (7) and series (10) and Morgan Stuart breaking the record for most doubles in a series (4). Five Huskies were named to the All-Tournament team, including freshmen Kimi Pohlman and Niki Williams, and sophomore Morgan Stuart along with Lawrie and Charters.

The Huskies showed signs of what was to come early in the season when they jumped out to a school-record 18-0 start to take over the No. 1 spot in the ESPN.com/USA Today polls, the first No. 1 ranking for a UW team since 2000. After finishing the pre-season at 27-3, UW embarked on the Pac-10 campaign, finishing second in the conference with a 14-7 mark, their highest finish in the league since 2000. They also closed out the regular season with a 41-10 record, their most regular season victories since 2003. UW then went 10-2 in the postseason to end the program's 16-year championship drought.

The 2009 season was a stark contrast to the 2008 season when UW was without Lawrie and Charters due to redshirt seasons. Tarr still managed to lead the team to its 15th consecutive postseason appearance and a 30-25-1 season to advance to the NCAA Regionals before falling to host Houston.

In 2007, Tarr led the Huskies back to the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2004. Washington finished tied for third in the Pac-10 and went on to win the Lincoln, Neb., regional before sweeping Alabama in the Super Regionals in Seattle to advance to the WCWS for the eighth time in school history.

The Huskies defeated DePaul, 3-1, to open the WCWS as the sophomore Lawrie pitched the 16th no-hitter in WCWS history and the first since 2003. UW followed that up by defeating Northwestern, 9-0, as Lawrie threw a one-hitter. Washington then ran into eventual national champion Arizona and lost two games to the Wildcats to finish tied for third in the country.

The Huskies finished the season with a 42-19 record and had three players earn All-America honors. Lawrie and senior first baseman Dena Tyson both were named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA First Team, while Charters was a second team selection.

The trio of players were also named to the WCWS All-Tournament team, marking the first UW players selected to the team since 2000, and earned All-Pacific Region honors. In addition, Charters, Lawrie, Tyson and three other UW players earned All-Pac-10 honors.

In 2006, Tarr and the Huskies swept through the Provo Regional as a No.1 seed with tournament MVP Lawrie not allowing a run in three starts. The Huskies advanced to the Austin Super Regional where they fell to Cat Osterman's Texas Longhorns to just miss out on the WCWS berth.

Junior second baseman Dominique Lastrapes and Charters each earned third team All-America honors and five players received All-Pac-10 honors.

Washington finished the season with a 35-25 overall record and a No. 15 national ranking. The Huskies tallied 11 wins over opponents ranked in the top-25, including victories over No. 1 UCLA, No. 5 Oregon State and No. 5 Stanford.

In Tarr's first season at the UW, she led the Huskies to the Super Regional where they fell one game short of advancing to the WCWS. The Huskies' season came to an end when they lost a three-game series to eventual national champion Michigan in Ann Arbor and finished the year with a No. 14 national ranking.

Seven Huskies earned All-Pac-10 honors, including Kristen Rivera, who was named Co-Pac-10 Player of the Year. Rivera also became the Huskies' first-ever four-time All-American, earning first team honors as a catcher. Three Washington players earned All-Pacific Region honors and three were named to the Pac-10 All-Academic team for their successes in the classroom.

Washington finished the season with a 35-22 record and finished sixth in the Pac-10 Conference with a 10-11 mark after four teams log-jammed in a tie for first place with 13-8 records.

The Huskies tallied 13 wins over opponents ranked in the top-25, including victories over No. 1 Michigan, No. 3 California and No. 4 Stanford.

Before taking over the Washington program, Tarr had a sixyear stint at Pacific, starting as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in April of 2004. During her six seasons at Pacific, the Tigers posted a 232-124 (.652) overall record and 90-44 (.672) mark in the Big West Conference.

In 2004 Tarr guided the Tigers to a top-20 national batting average. In 2001, she and Pacific head coach Brian Kolze were named the 2001 NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year after guiding the Tigers to within one win of the Women's College World Series and a No. 18 final national ranking. That team also finished the season with a .973 fielding percentage, ranking second-best in the country.

Tarr joined Pacific prior to the 1999 season after an outstanding career as a Husky. As a four-year letterwinner, Tarr helped lead the UW to a second place finish at the Women's College World Series in 1996 and a third place finish in 1997.

She earned various honors while playing softball at Washington. A three-year member of the Pac-10 All-Academic team from 1994-97, she was named to the Pac-10 All-Conference team from 1995-97 and the NFCA All-West Region team in 1996 and 1997.

Tarr also worked at Washington as an undergraduate assistant coach during the 1998 season, helping the Huskies to a third-place finish at the 1998 Women's College World Series.

In addition to her collegiate experience, Tarr brings experience from the professional level as she spent the summer of 1997 as a member of the Women's Professional Fastpitch Softball League's Tampa Bay Fire Stix. She was the league leader in fielding percentage for first basemen and also led the league in walks.

Tarr earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Geography from Washington in 1998. She completed her Masters Degree in Education at Pacific in the fall of 2003. Tarr, 34, is a native of Redmond, Wash., and is a graduate of Redmond High School.



It was her first home run since March 14, a span of 19 games and 60 at-bats after she'd hit seven home runs in her first 68 at-bats of the year... Hit her second home run in three games against Oregon State on May 1, one of a season-high four Husky long balls in the game... Batted .571 (4-for-7) in the series with two runs and five RBI... Drove in two runs in each of the first two games, giving her six in her last three games... Reached base all three times she came to the plate in the first game, going 1-for-1 with two walks and two RBI, lacing an RBI single and drawing a bases-loaded walk.. Went 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI in the second game, launching a two-run home run and adding a double... Two days later, had a record-setting day against Georgia in the semifinals, going 2-for-5 with seven RBI, hitting a three-run home run in the second inning and a game-tying grand slam in the fifth... The grand slam was just the third in World Series history... Added her 10th RBI of the series in the second game of the day against Georgia, going 1-for-2 with a walk and a stolen base as well... Her World Series performance raised her season average to .288, sixth on the team... Finished with five home runs, 32 RBI and 25 runs scored in her freshman campaign... Third on the team with eight doubles... Fourth on the squad in runs, RBI and walks (19) and also fourth with six stolen bases in six attempts... Appeared in 57 games, making 51 starts.
