THIS WEEK

The No. 3 Washington Husky softball team continues its three-week road trip at the final stop on the journey, the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla. Just eight teams remain with one goal in mind: a National Championship. The Huskies are making their ninth trip to the Women's College World Series and their second in the last three years after sweeping the Atlanta Super Regional over No. 14 Georgia Tech last weekend. UW will look to bring home the program's first national championship.

The Huskies' first opponent will be No. 6 seed Georgia, whom the Huskies split a two-game battle with early in the season. The game will serve as the World Series opener on Thursday, May 28 at Noon CT in Oklahoma City and will air live on ESPN. Georgia is making its WCWS debut while UW is tied with Michigan for the second-most appearances of the eight competing teams. Arizona leads the way with 21 appearances and eight national titles. Arizona State is the defending champion and made it back to the Series for the fourth season in a row.

TOURNAMENT AT A GLANCE

The Huskies are one of seven seeded teams left and they are the second-highest seed remaining behind No. 1 Florida. No. 4 Alabama and No. 5 Michigan round of the top-eight seeds that advanced. No. 9 Arizona and No. 10 Arizona State also advanced while unseeded Missouri earned its first WCWS berth after stunning No. 2 UCLA on its home field Sunday to complete the tournament field. The eight-team field consists of three Pac-10 teams and three SEC teams along with a Big-12 and Big-10 school in Missouri and Michigan, respectively. The Pac-10 has won 21 of the 27 college softball national championships and has had at least three teams advance to the World Series in 11 consecutive seasons.

A LONG, STRANGE TRIP

The Huskies are at stage three of their whirlwind around-the-country road trip as they left Seattle on May 13 bound for Amherst, Mass., and have been on the road since. The Huskies will have logged a total of 6,899 miles by the time they return to Seattle, whenever that may be. The journey started with a 2,963-mile trip from Seattle to Massachusetts for the NCAA Regionals, followed by a 1,087-mile trip to Atlanta for the NCAA Super Regionals. They will log 848 miles from Atlanta to Oklahoma City and another 2,001 back to Seattle where Husky softball players will be greeted with finals week.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Huskies are one of two World Series teams who have not played at least one round of the NCAA Tournament on their home field. Florida, Alabama, Michigan and Arizona State each hosted both Regionals and Super Regionals while Missouri hosted the Regionals before traveling to UCLA for Supers and Georgia traveled to North Carolina for Regionals but hosted the second round. Arizona had to travel to Louisville for their Regional round before making the short trip to California to face Stanford in Palo Alto.

UW was able to escape from a difficult regional in Amherst, Mass., where they had to overcome a tough UMass team on their home field, which featured three-time All-American pitcher Brandice Balschmitter. UW beat the Minutewomen twice in three games, including a deciding 6-1 win in 15 innings in which Danielle Lawrie struck out 24. The Huskies had an easier time in their Super Regional match-up in Atlanta with Georgia Tech, sweeping the Yellow Jackets in two games by scores of 7-0 and 7-1.

LAST WEEK

After a grueling opening Regional round, the Huskies made quick work of No. 14 Georgia Tech on their home field, sweeping the best-of-three series with wins of 7-1 and 7-0. Danielle Lawrie won both games in the circle, allowing just seven hits and one run in the two games combined while striking out 18. She was also the leader at the plate for the Huskies, batting .571 (4x7) with six RBI and two home runs, both of which came in Sunday's deciding game. Lawrie hit two towering two-run shots for her first career multi-home run game and Ashlyn Watson and Alicic Blake also went deep as UW tied a single-game postseason school record with their four long balls. Ashley Charters also blasted a home run in UW's 7-1 win on Saturday while Morgan Stuart drove in three runs as the Huskies 23 racked up hits in the two games in Atlanta.

NCAA REGIONAL RECAP

The Huskies had a tough road to the Super Regionals, having to travel east to play a very talented No. 21 UMass team in Amherst, Mass., and it took a monumental performance by Danielle Lawrie for the Huskies to escape. After cruising in the opening game against Sacred Heart with a 9-1 five-inning victory, UW had their first showdown with the Minutewomen and their ace, Brandice Balschmitter. UW escaped with a huge victory to advance to the championship round, getting a 12-strikeout performance from Lawrie and a 3-for-4 effort from Ashley Charters to earn a 3-1 win, getting two runs in the bottom of the sixth to decide the game.

On Sunday, the Minutewomen got to Lawrie for two home runs - the only team all year to hit two long balls in a game off the junior - to force an if-game with a 5-1 win. That "if game" turned out to be one of the greatest games in recent NCAA postseason history with the teams dueling for five hours and 13 minutes. After UW scored in the first and UMass answered in the fourth to tie the game at 1-1, Balschmitter and Lawrie threw 10 straight scoreless innings each. After robbed home runs, plays at the plate and key strikeouts by both All-Americans, the Huskies finally broke through for five runs - all with two outs - in the 15th inning and Lawrie held off the middle of the UMass lineup to give UW a thrilling 5-1 victory in the longest game in both UW and UMass' history.

Lawrie struck out a school-record 24 in the game while Balschmitter sat down 14 Husky hitters. The 38 combined strikeouts marked the fifth-most in NCAA history. Lawrie became just the third Pac-10 pitcher and 15th in NCAA history with at least 24 Ks in a game. She struck out UMass' leadoff hitter and Atlantic-10 Player of the Year Carly Normandin six times in the game.

HUSKY POSTSEASON HISTORY

The Huskies are making their 16th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, missing out only during their inaugural season in 1993. UW has also advanced to the Super Regionals in four of the last five years since the field expanded in 2005 to include a second round.

Washington has a 67-30 record in postseason (47-12 Regionals/5-4 Super Regionals/15-14 WCWS) and has advanced to the Women's College World Series nine times (1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2009). The Huskies advanced to the national championship game in both 1996 and 1999. Their 16-straight tournament appearances is tied for the fifth-longest active streak with Oklahoma, while their 67 wins in the tournament are fifth-best in NCAA history. Their nine WCWS appearances are tied for the fifth-most in history with Michigan, and they also are tied with Oklahoma for the fifth-best all-time streak of consecutive WCWS appearances (1996-2000).

THEY'VE SEEN IT ALL... ALMOST

The Huskies played perhaps the most difficult schedule in the nation this season, playing 32 of their 57 games against ranked teams, meaning 56% of their games were against top-25 teams in the country. They own a 23-10 record against ranked teams this season. UW has played six of the other seven teams in the World Series and defeated all of them, going 8-4 against the World Series field. The only team they have not played among the eight is Missouri.

No. 6 Georgia Bulldogs

Series vs. UW: Washington leads, 5-2

About Georgia: The Bulldogs advance to their first-ever Women's College World Series by sweeping their best-of-three Super Regional with Ohio State by scores of 7-6 and 6-4, both of which were come-from-behind wins. Georgia finally got over the hump in their third Super Regional after falling just shy last year against UCLA. The Bulldogs boast one of the top power hitters in the nation in sophomore Alisa Goler who has 23 jacks and 79 RBI on the season to go along with a .464 average. They are also led by their scrappy duo of Taylor Schlopy and Kristin Schnake, who are batting .431 and .333, respectively, with Schlopy blasting 13 home runs of her own. The two have combined for 36 stolen bases and have set the table all year for Goler at the top of the order. In the circle, the Bulldogs get solid pitching from a pair of arms in Chirstie Hamilton (24-8, 1.65, 149 Ks) and Sarah McCloud (17-2, 2.62, 58 Ks). Georgia's defense is also a strength as they lead the nation with .980 fielding percentage.

Series History: UW leads the series 5-2 after the teams split a pair of games early in the season in the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge in Tuscaloosa, Ala. The Huskies and Danielle Lawrie shutout the Bulldogs, 2-0, in the first game with Ashlyn Watson blasting a pair of solo home runs and Lawrie allowing just two hits and striking out 10. The Bulldogs came back the next day, however, and handed Lawrie her first loss of the season and broke her string of 90.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run when they scored two runs on six hits off the Husky ace to earn a 2-0 win.

The Huskies and Georgia have recent postseason history as UW knocked the Bulldogs out of the 2007 playoffs in the NCAA Regionals en route to their last World Series appearance. The teams went to three games, with the Huskies advancing with a 1-0 victory on Alicia Blake's walk-off single. Danielle Lawrie held the Bulldogs to just four hits in the contest. The Huskies won the first two meetings between the teams in 2001 (7-4) and 2004 (3-1), the latter of which also came in the NCAA Regionals to send UW to the Women's College World Series.

HUSKIES IN THE RANKINGS

UW is the No. 3 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, thanks to a strong RPI. They were also No. 3 in the final regular-season NFCA poll and No. 4 in the ESPN.com rankings prior to the NCAA Postseason. The Huskies were in the nation's top-5 in each of the last 12 weeks of the season since being ranked No. 7 in the NFCA poll on Feb. 17.

The Huskies spent two weeks at the top spot in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 earlier this season after going 5-0 in the Cathedral City Classic, including a 1-0 win over current No.1 Florida. That performance gave the Huskies their first No. 1 ranking since the 2000 season. It was also the first time the Huskies have ever been ranked No. 1 in the ESPN.com poll, which has been in existence since 2003.

40-40 VISION

With two wins over the final weekend of the regular season, UW picked up its second 40-win season in the last five years, the last coming in 2007 when they won 42 games en route to the Women's College World Series. With 46 wins now in 2009, Heather Tarr has established a new career high in her five-year tenure as the head coach at Washington, topping the 42 wins by the '07 team.

The 46 wins also mark UW's most since they picked up 47 in 2003, a season in which they advanced to the Women's College World Series.

NO BAD LOSSES

Of UW's 11 losses this season, 10 have come against top-20 teams and all but two have come at the opposing team's home field. Their only loss to a non-ranked team came at the hands of Cal-State Fullerton on their home field, a team which advanced to the 2009 NCAA tournament. UW lost twice at No. 2 UCLA and No. 5 Stanford and once each at No. 6 Arizona and No. 9 Arizona State. UW also fell to No. 4 Alabama and No. 8 Georgia in Tuscaloosa, Ala. Their only loss at home this season came to No. 14 Cal, 1-0. UW suffered their 11th loss at UMass in the NCAA Regionals before bouncing back to take the deciding game.

UW has been shutout in eight of their 11 losses this season and Danielle Lawrie has borne the brunt of UW's occasional offensive doldrums, as five of her seven losses came in games when UW was shutout by the opposing team's pitcher. Lawrie has received a total of three runs of support in her seven losses.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

With a 14-7 record in conference play and a second-place finish, UW had their best Pac-10 season since the 2000 team won the school's second conference championship with a 17-4 record. UW earned its most victories and posted its highest finish in 2009 since then.

CLOSE CALLS

The Huskies have shown a knack for winning the tight ball games this year as they are 7-2 in extra inning games, most recently a 6-1, 15-inning victory at UMass in the Regionals, the longest game in UW history by innings (15) and time (5 hours, 13 minutes). UW also has five 1-0 wins this season and they are 9-3 in one-run games.

MERCY ME

With their 11-3, five-inning win over Cal during the last weekend of the regular season, UW set a school record with their fourth five-inning mercy-rule victory in Pac-10 play. Three of those came against ranked teams with UW mercy-ruling No. 14 Cal twice and No. 9 Arizona State once. UW had previously won three games in five innings in 2005, a year UW a record five games via the run-rule, two of which were called after six innings.

COMEBACK DAWGS

The Huskies continued to show their never-say-die attitude recently when they came back from a 2-0 deficit to defeat Oregon State, 5-2, for their 11th come-from-behind win of the season.

UW earned the Comeback Dawgs moniker in the Judi Garman Classic, when it won one of the craziest games in Husky history, scoring eight runs in the final two innings to defeat Penn State, 14-13. The Huskies fell behind early as Penn State jumped out to leads of 5-1 after one inning and 7-1 after two. While the Dawgs chipped away, Penn State kept extending their lead and took a 13-6 lead into the sixth. But UW scored five in the sixth and three in the seventh to win the game on Niki Williams' game-tying triple and Alicia Blake's game-winning single.

LET'S GET IT STARTED

UW is in pretty good shape if they get off to a fast start, going 37-0 this season when they score first. They are also undefeated when they score in the first inning, going 22-0 when they jump out of the gates early.

FLEXING THEIR MUSCLES

After hitting just 29 home runs in 2008, the Huskies have the pop back in their bats this season, and have already gone well past that mark. With five home runs in last weekend's Super Regionals, UW now has connected for 45 home runs, with 10 different players going deep, including four freshmen. Ashlyn Watson leads the team with a career-best 11 home runs, while leadoff hitter Ashley Charters is second with a career-high eight home runs. Danielle Lawrie blasted two last Sunday to give her six for the season and sophomore Morgan Stuart has heated up lately and has five on the campaign.

UW is 19-1 this season when they hit at least one home run. The Huskies' four home runs last Sunday against Georgia Tech tied a UW postseason record.

TRIPLE YOUR PLEASURE

The Huskies did not have a triple in 56 games last season, the first time in school history UW went an entire season without a three-bagger. Senior Ashley Charters made sure the Huskies wouldn't repeat the effort when she picked up a three-bagger against UC Santa Barbara in the opening game of the Campbell Cartier Classic. UW now has a total of 10 three-baggers on the season, led by Charters' five. Freshmen Felecia Harris, Kimi Pohlman and Niki Williams each have one while Morgan Stuart has two triples.

HOME SWEET HOME

With their 15-1 record at Husky Softball Stadium this season, the Huskies completed the most successful home season in school history. UW won their first 14 games in Seattle for the best home start in school history, besting the 2005 team, which started 8-0 at home. The 14-game home winning streak finished one shy of the longest home winning streak in school history, a 15-gamer held by the 1996 team. That team went 18-2 overall at Husky Softball Stadium en route to its first World Series appearance.

GOING STREAKING

The Huskies' 18-game winning streak to start the season ended when No. 4 Alabama handed UW a 6-0 loss in the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge. The 18-game winning streak is the third-longest in school history, trailing the 2000 team, which won 23 in a row, and the 1996 team which won 19 in a row. It does, however, mark the most consecutive wins ever to start a season in UW history. The following is a look at the longest winning streaks in school history:

WHAT A START

With their win over No. 1 Florida in the Cathedral City Classic, the Huskies improved to 11-0, breaking the school record for best start to a season. The previous best start was put together by the 2002 team, which kicked off the season 10-0. The 2009 team extended the record by winning their first 18 games of the season.

LAWRIE NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FINALIST

Washington junior pitcher Danielle Lawrie was named one of three players last week as finalists for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award, the most prestigious honor in Division I softball. Lawrie, who joins Florida's Stacey Nelson and Arizona State's Kaitlin Cochran, boasts a 37-7 record, a 0.84 ERA and 472 strikeouts facing some of the toughest teams in the nation all season long. The only non-senior of the three finalists, she has 19 shutouts and two no-hitters this season. Lawrie made her case last weekend by dominating at the plate as well as in the circle, going 2-0 with a 0.50 ERA and 18 strikeouts while batting .571 (4x7) with two home runs and six RBI in UW's Super Regional sweep of Georgia Tech.

Both Lawrie and Ashley Charters were on the initial 50-player watch list and were also both on the list of 25 players recently released.

24K GOLD PERFORMANCE

Danielle Lawrie put together one of the most courageous pitching performances in NCAA history in the NCAA Regionals, willing her team to win in a 15-inning, winner-take-all Regional final game. After throwing 144 pitches in a losing effort to UMass in Sunday's first game - in which she struck out eight batters - Lawrie came right back and threw 251 pitches and established a new career high with 24 strikeouts to lead UW to an incredible 6-1 win in 15 innings.

All told, Lawrie threw 395 pitches over seven hours and 49 minutes in the two games Sunday. She struck out 32 UMass batters in the two games and allowed just 14 hits in 22 innings. She is one of 15 players in NCAA history with at least 24 Ks in a game and one of just three Pac-10 pitchers. Just one other pitcher has ever struck out as many as 24 in a postseason game.

LAWRIE MAKES NCAA HISTORY

With her no-hitter of UCLA a month ago, Danielle Lawrie added to her lengthy resume as she became the first pitcher in NCAA history to no-hit both UCLA and Arizona in the same season. In fact, no pitcher has ever no-hit the two national powers in a career. Lawrie's no-hitter over the Bruins marks just the second time UCLA has ever been held hitless in a Pac-10 game in their illustrious history. The only other time was on May 9, 1998 by Arizona's Nancy Evans. The Wildcats, meanwhile, have been no-hit just four times now in Pac-10 play, including Lawrie's gem earlier this season. They had last been no-hit by any team in the 2000 Women's College World Series by Southern Mississippi's Courtney Blades. Prior to that, Washington's Eve Gaw and Heather Meyer combined to hold the Wildcats hitless in 1996 and they were also held hitless in 1992 and 1988.

Lawrie, who has four no-no's in her career now, is also the first pitcher to throw two no-hitters in Pac-10 play since UCLA's Keira Goerl in 2003 when she held Cal and Stanford hitless. While the feat has happened nine times in Pac-10 history, only Lawrie and Goerl have done it since 1996. Between 1988 and 1995, six different pitchers threw at least two no-hitters in Pac-10 play with Michelle Granger doing it in two different seasons, including 1993 when she threw three in conference games. Dee Dee Weiman also threw three in 1994.

SHUT 'EM DOWN

Danielle Lawrie's no-hitter of UCLA was her 17th shutout of the season which broke UW's single-season record. She now has 19 on the season and 39 in her career, just one shy of tying Jennifer Spediacci's all-time record at UW. Lawrie's 19 shutouts ranks third nationally.

She broke two more single-season records last weekend, striking out 10 in the opening game against Georgia Tech to surpass her own single-season strikeout record of 457, which now stands at 472. She also picked up two wins last weekend to give her 37 on the season, breaking the single-season record of 36 previously held by Tia Bollinger. Lawrie ranks fourth in the country in both wins and ERA and her 472 Ks are the most in Division I.

MORE MILESTONES

Danielle Lawrie reached another milestone recently with an 18-strikeout performance against Oregon as she went over the 1,200 mark in career Ks, becoming just the 25th pitcher in NCAA to eclipse the mark. Lawrie will go into her senior season as the only active pitcher with at least 1,200 career Ks. She went over the 1,300-mark last weekend with another 18 Ks and her 1,316 strikeouts ranks fifth in Pac-10 history and 15th in NCAA history.

Her single-season marks also rank high in Pac-10 history, putting her at No. 7 as of now but within reach of the record of 522 set by Arizona's Taryne Mowatt in 2007. Her 37 wins are also the seventh-most, five shy of the Pac-10 single-season record. Lawrie needs 13 more strikeouts to break into the NCAA's top-20 single-season marks.

MORE ON LAWRIE

It's easy to lose track of how many accomplishments Lawrie has this season. To sum up, she has two no-hitters, four one-hitters and 10 two-hitters... She has 19 shutouts, 13 of which have come against teams ranked at the time... Among the team's she has shutout: No. 1 Florida, No. 2 UCLA, No. 4 Alabama, No. 5 Stanford, No. 6 Arizona, No. 7 Michigan, No. 8 Georgia, and No. 11 Ohio State... Of those shutouts, four have also been extra-inning wins over ranked teams at the time (Florida, Ohio State, Baylor, Fresno State)... Lawrie has won a Pac-10-record six Pitcher of the Week awards... She's been named the NFCA and USA Today National Player of the Week... She's broken the UW career and single-season strikeout marks this season... She's gone over the 1,000, 1,200 and 1,300 career marks this season... She's broken single-season records for wins and shutouts in addition to strikeouts... She had a 64.1 scoreless innings streak and streak of 90.0 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run... She has 26 double-digit strikeout performances including a school-record setting 24-strikeout performance (UMass, 5/17) and two 18-K games, one in seven innings (vs. Oregon) and one in 11 innings (vs. Fresno State).

SEASON TO REMEMBER

UW senior All-American Ashley Charters has made her senior season her best, posting career-highs in average (.443), hits (86), runs (60) and home runs (8) and tying her career high in doubles (9), triples (5) and stolen bases (36). Her average currently ranks as the third-best single-season mark in UW history while her five triples this season rank tied for third all time.

UP THE CHART(ER)S

With two hits over the weekend, Ashley Charters moved closer to UW's all-time hits record with 305 in her career, 14 shy of the all-time record held by Sara Pickering. She had eight hits in the NCAA Regionals, two of which were triples, giving her 15 in her four years, one shy of that record as well. Charters also inched closer to the all-time runs record with two last weekend, giving her 210 compared to all-time leader Jaime Clark, who crossed home 223 times in her career. Already the career steals leader, Charters swiped one base last week to give her 36 this season which moves her up to No. 5 on the UW single-season list where she appears three times. Her career mark of 132 puts her in fifth in Pac-10 history, one shy of the fourth spot.

DANIELLE LAWRIE

In just her third season in the Purple & Gold, Danielle Lawrie has re-written the Husky pitching record books. She has already broken single-season records in 2009 for strikeouts, wins, shutouts, complete games and innings pitched. CONFERENCE FEAST

Usually, players see their batting averages slip come conference play but Ashley Charters was nearly impossible to slow down in Pac-10 play. The senior batted .479 (34x71) in one of the nation's toughest conferences, hitting safely in 16 of 21 games with 13 of those being multi-hit games. In fact, three of the five games Charters did not get a hit in were against UCLA as Megan Langenfeld held Charters hitless in eight at-bats. Minus those three games, Charters hit .540 (34x63) against the other six Pac-10 teams. She hit .524 (11x21) against the Arizona schools and an incredible .667 (14x21) against the Oregon schools and .429 (9x21) against the Bay Area schools.

With a .443 overall average, Charters has been threatening to break UW's long-standing single-season average record of .472, set by Angie Marzetta in 1993. She is second in the Pac-10 in overall average and ranks 12th nationally while also finishing as the Pac-10 leader in conference-only average. The two-time All-American had a career-high 16-game hitting streak earlier this season, which included a stretch of nine consecutive multi-hit games.

PUTTING IN LONG HOURS

While Danielle Lawrie got all the attention for throwing 395 pitches in two games against Massachusetts in the NCAA Regionals, senior catcher Alicia Blake's performance can't be overshadowed as she squatted 395 times, caught 395 fire balls from Lawrie and made 395 throws back to the pitcher's circle. Blake was rewarded for her efforts by moving one putout shy of the UW all-time record, which she broke last weekend as she now has 1,922. She set a UW single-game record with 24 putouts in the 15-inning Regional-clinching victory. Blake has been a quiet but steady force behind the plate for UW this season and throughout her career, calling all the pitches for Lawrie while throwing out a Pac-10-leading 15 runners attempting to steal and picking three runners off the base paths.

WATSON HEATING UP AGAIN

After going homerless in 21 straight games, Ashlyn Watson is heating up again just at the right time. The senior belted three home runs in the final five Pac-10 games and blasted another last weekend to give her 11 home runs and 36 RBI, both of which are career-highs. Despite the home run drought, Watson never lost her consistency at the plate. She's second on the team with a .363 average and has hit safely in 39 of 55 games she's played in, including 13 of 21 Pac-10 games. She went into postseason play on fire, hitting safely in five of her last seven games, going seven-for-16 with four runs and six RBI.

Watson now has 24 home runs in her career which places her into 10th all-time at UW. She also has five sacrifice flies this season which ties for fifth on UW's single-season charts, two shy of the all-time record, and the mark also ties for the conference lead and ranks tied for third nationally.

It's been a breakout season for Watson - a career .219 hitter before this year - who is making the most of her first healthy season. She has risen to the occasion against some of the toughest pitching in the country, batting .438 (7x16) in the Cathedral City Classic, including a 2-for-4 effort against All-American Stacey Nelson of Florida. In the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge against three ranked teams, Watson hit safely in every game, batting .533 (8x15) with two doubles, two home runs and two RBI along with three multi-hit games. Both of her home runs came in UW's 2-0 win over No. 6 Georgia.

POHL POSITION

Kimi Pohlman continues to impress in her first season with the Huskies, proving to be one of the more consistent hitters in UW's lineup this season. With speed and power to boot, Pohlman has solidified herself in the No. 2 spot in UW's lineup and has been a mainstay in the outfield. The freshman is batting .357 on the season, which ranks third on the team. Pohlman has yet to be caught stealing this season, going a perfect 19-for-19 on her attempts. She has also shown some pop in her bat, belting three home runs, including a grand slam for her first career long ball.

Pohlman hasn't backed down against the toughest competition either as she hit a robust .361 in conference games. Earlier this season, Pohlman showed her clutch ability when she provided the game-winning single in UW's 1-0 victory over current No. 1 Florida, notching the single against All-American Stacey Nelson. She also came up with a huge clutch hit two weeks ago, ripping a three-run, game-winning double off Megan Langenfeld to hand the Bruin her first loss of the season.

GETTING HER SEA(TT)LEGS

Newest Husky Jenn Salling is finally rounding into form after taking some time to get her timing back due to a long layoff after the 2008 Olympics. The Canadian superstar has made a big impact in the UW lineup, drawing 14 walks, scoring 16 times while driving in 11 runs in 24 games. After her timing was off her first few weeks back, Salling showed signs of getting her rhythm back in the last week of Pac-10 play, belting two doubles off the wall in straight-away centerfield at Husky Softball Stadium.

This postseason, Husky fans are finally seeing the skills that made Salling a First Team All-American at Oregon her freshman year. She batted .571 in the UMass regional, going 8-for-14 and reaching base safely in 11-of-17 plate appearances with three walks. She went 3-for-4 in the opening 9-1 win over Sacred Heart to set the tone for her big weekend. She had another solid weekend in the Atlanta Super Regional to put her postseasn totals at .526 (10x19) with seven runs, four RBI and five walks. She is currently riding a nine-game hitting streak.

Salling batted .481 with 14 home runs en route to being named Pac-10 Newcomer of the Year in 2007. She was the only freshman who was on the Top-10 list of finalists for the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award. Salling then teamed up with current UW teammate Danielle Lawrie on the Canadian National Team, batting clean-up and playing shortstop in every game in Beijing, leading Canada into the medal round. She spent a semester at North Seattle Community College getting her AA degree before becoming eligible to play for the Huskies on April 2.

CENTURY CLUB

With her second sacrifice fly of the season three weeks ago, Lauren Greer became the third Husky senior this season to reach 100 career RBI. Ashley Charters reached 100 recently and now sits at 106 while Alicia Blake also picked up career RBI No. 100 a few weeks ago. Just 16 Huskies have ever accomplished the feat, including the senior trio, who are all chasing Dena Tyson for the No. 10 spot all-time at UW as she collected 127 in her career.

HURTS SO GOOD

Morgan Stuart was hit by a pitch in the regionals for the 12th time this season, which ranks third on the UW single-season charts. While that's a lot of sacrificial bruises, she's still got a long way to go to tie Kim Depaul's all-time record of 19 in 2000.

Lately, it's been Stuart who's been putting the hurtin' on opposing pitchers. The sophomore has heated up down the stretch, driving in at least one run in five of the last six regular-season games and compiling nine RBIs total in that stretch. She also posted three multi-hit games in the last six, going six-for-14 (.429) with two home runs. In the final three Pac-10 games, she hit .667 (4x6) and reached base in seven of nine plate appearances, hitting two home runs and driving in a career-high five runs in a 7-0 win over Stanford. For her efforts, she earned her second career Pac-10 Player of the Week honor.

BRIGHT FUTURE

Despite losing seven seniors when the 2009 season ends, the Huskies have much to look forward to with their freshman class having made a huge impact this season. Kimi Pohlman started strong and never looked back, emerging as one of the top freshmen in the conference. Niki Williams has also swung the bat well this season, ranking fifth on the team with an .291 average and driving in 22 runs. Both were named to the Pac-10 All-Freshman team while Felecia Harris was named Honorable Mention All-Freshman. Harris has been a factor both at the plate and in the circle, driving in 19 runs while going 7-2 in the circle with an 3.12 ERA. Also seeing significant time for rookies have been Jenna Clifton and Taylor Smith.

ALL GOOD THINGS MUST END

Danielle Lawrie had an incredible streak of 90 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run earlier this season until No. 6 Georgia plated two runs in a 2-0 victory over the Huskies in the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge. Although the NCAA only recognizes streaks of innings scored upon - earned or unearned - Lawrie's streak of 90 consecutive innings without an earned run is easily a school record.

Within those 90 innings, Lawrie had a streak of 64.1 consecutive scoreless innings which ended in the Husky Softball Classic. The streak ties Cat Osterman for the 16th longest in NCAA history. In the Pac-10 annals, it ranks as the seventh-longest streak behind such names as UCLA's Lisa Fernandez and Cal's Jocelyn Forest. During the streak, Lawrie went 11-0 with eight complete-game shutouts and struck out 119 batters while walking just 11. During the 90 innings, she went 14-0 with 10 shutouts and 142 strikeouts.

A K OF Ks

Lawrie reached another milestone in the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge when she became the first Husky pitcher ever to go over the 1,000 strikeout mark in her career. She struck out eight in a 6-0 win over No. 2 Alabama to become just the second active Division I pitcher with 1,000 Ks, joining Stanford senior Missy Penna.

QUEEN K

Danielle Lawrie came into this season already holding UW's single-season strikeout record and just two weeks into the season she became its career leader as well. Going into the Campbell Cartier Classic, Lawrie needed just 14 strikeouts to equal Jennifer Spediacci's career school record and she nearly broke it in the first game of the weekend. Lawrie struck out 12 UC-Santa Barbara hitters to get within two, then tied the record with two Ks in the first inning against San Diego State. One inning later, she broke the record, becoming UW's all time leader with 895 strikeouts.

WOMAN OF THE WEEK

Danielle Lawrie picked up an impressive trifecta after the Cathedral City Classic, sweeping the National Player of the Week awards along with earning Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week. Lawrie earned her second consecutive Pac-10 honor and also added the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week award and the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I Player of the Week. It marked the first National POW award for Lawrie in her career and her sixth Pac-10 honor. She is the first Husky to sweep the awards and the first to earn any national POW honor since Dena Tyson in 2007.

Lawrie went 3-0 in the Palm Springs tournament without allowing an earned run in 23 innings while striking out 43 batters and allowing just five hits. She threw three shutouts, two of which were in extra innings against ranked teams, including one against one of the most powerful lineups in the country in Florida. Her week started with a nine-inning, two-hit shutout of Florida in which she struck out 12 and allowed just two bunt singles. Against Nebraska, the junior allowed a leadoff single then retired the next 21 batters, just missing her second career perfect game. She struck out 15 to set a season high, then topped herself with 16 Ks in a two-hit, eight-inning shutout of Ohio State.

JUDI GARMAN CLASSIC RECAP - 3/12-3/15

The Huskies had a successful weekend at the prestigious Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif., compiling a 4-1 record in one of the toughest tournaments in the country. UW earned victories over No. 22 Florida State, No. 8 Michigan and No. 25 Fresno State along with a 14-13 slugfest over Penn State. Danielle Lawrie earned all three of the victories over ranked teams, allowing just one run and five hits in 27.1 innings while striking out 47 batters. She allowed just two hits against Florida State, with Ashlyn Watson again

provided the clutch game-winning hit in a 4-1 win. After UW outslugged Penn State in a wild game - with the Huskies overcoming deficits of 7-1, 11-4 and 13-6 to win in the bottom of the seventh - the Huskies won a much different ball game, 1-0 over Michigan. Lawrie allowed just one hit and struck out 13 while Morgan Stuart's home run provided all the offense. Lawrie came back the next day to allow just two hits in 11 innings while striking out 18 as the Huskies outlasted Fresno State, 3-0. Ashley Charters provided the game-winning hit to give UW its fourth extra-inning win of the season.

EASTON SEC/PAC-10/BIG 12 CHALLENGE RECAP - 3/5-3/8

The Huskies picked up three big wins in the Easton SEC/Pac-10/Big 12 Challenge in Tuscaloosa, Ala. In what was arguably the best four-team tournament in the country all season, the Huskies defeated then-No. 1/3 Alabama on their own field in front of a record 3,012 fans to snap the Tide's 23-game home win streak. UW also won games against No. 11/12 Georgia and No. 24 Baylor. Lawrie earned all three of UW's victories, all via shutout, first a 1-0, eight-inning win over Baylor. After Alabama stopped UW's 19-game winning streak to start the season, Lawrie came back Saturday and threw back-to-back shutouts over Georgia (2-0) and Alabama (6-0) as the Huskies avenged their only loss. On Sunday, Georgia finally solved Lawrie and scored the first runs off the ace since Feb. 7 and handed Lawrie her first loss of the season, 2-0, in UW's final game of the weekend.

HUSKY SOFTBALL CLASSIC RECAP - 2/27-3/1

The Huskies made their home debut, hosting the fourth annual Husky Softball Classic. UW went 3-0, defeating Seattle, 8-0, and Portland State, 11-1, by the mercy rule while earning a second victory over Portland State on Sunday, 8-2, in a game shortened to five innings due to rain. UW's final game against Boise State was rained out. UW had seven players hit over .400 on the weekend, led by Morgan Stuart, who batted .714 (5x7) with a run and three RBI, along with seniors Alicia Blake (.625, 5x8, 4 R, 7 RBI), Ashley Charters (.600, 6x10, 5 R, 1 HR) and Ashlyn Watson (.444, 4x9, 4 R, 2 RBI). The Huskies also got contributions from their freshmen, as Felecia Harris went deep twice over the weekend - including a grand slam - and Kimi Pohlman also went yard. The Huskies twice hit back-to-back home runs and batted .417 as a team. Danielle Lawrie earned all three wins in the circle, allowing no earned runs and just four hits in 14.0 innings while striking out 26.

CATHEDRAL CITY CLASSIC RECAP - 2/20-2/22

The Huskies went 5-0 in the prestigious Cathedral City Classic, including an exciting 1-0 nine-inning win over No. 2 Florida. UW also earned victories over Long Island, Mississippi, Nebraska and No. 23 Ohio State, the latter of which was also an exciting 1-0 game which the Huskies won in the bottom of the eighth inning.

UW opened the weekend holding off a pesky Long Island team, 7-3, with Felecia Harris getting the complete-game victory and Ashlyn Watson and Ashley Charters each providing home runs. The Florida showdown more than lived up to the hype as the No. 2 Gators and No. 3 Huskies stayed scoreless until the ninth with All-Americans Danielle Lawrie and Stacey Nelson dueling in the circle. The Huskies finally got the victory on freshman Kimi Pohlman's ninth-inning RBI single and Lawrie fanned 12 Gators and allowed just two hits to win the duel. After an 8-2 win over Ole Miss on Saturday, Sunday was the Danielle Lawrie show as she struck out 31 batters in two games, pitching back-to-back shutouts over the Cornhuskers and Buckeyes. She threw a one-hitter in the 6-0 win over Nebraska with 15 Ks and followed with an eight-inning, two-hit shutout with 16 Ks over Ohio State. Ashley Charters came through with the game-winning, walk-off single in the bottom of the eighth.

CAMPBELL CARTIER CLASSIC RECAP - 2/13-2/15

The Huskies came out swinging the hot bats in San Diego and it resulted in a 4-0 record. UW outscored their four opponents (UCSB, Utah State, San Diego State and Long Beach State), 38-4, batting .409 as a team and banging out six doubles, three triples and four home runs. The Huskies won two games by the five-inning mercy rule, including a 16-3 route of Utah State, the most runs by a UW team since a 22-1 outburst against Nevada in 2005. In the final game of the weekend against No. 25 Long Beach State, the Huskies tied a season high with 15 hits and used an 11-run third inning to breeze to a 4-0 record in the tournament. Danielle Lawrie was named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week after the weekend, going 3-0 without allowing a run in 18.1 innings and striking out 28 batters.

RED DESERT CLASSIC RECAP - 2/6-2/8

In the Huskies first weekend of action in St. George, Utah, they were reminded just how much they missed their three stars who missed the entire 2008 season for various reasons. UW started the season 5-0, which included a 2-1 season-opening victory over No. 12 Tennessee. Junior All-American pitcher Danielle Lawrie went 3-0 in the circle with a 0.64 ERA, striking out 36 batters in 22.0 innings while allowing just eight hits and two earned runs. Senior two-time All-American Ashley Charters led the team with a .429 (6x14) batting average, six runs scored and four RBI - including a grand slam - while senior All-Pac-10 outfielder Lauren Greer was right behind Charters with a .417 average (5x12), three runs and four RBI, including a game-winning three-run jack against LMU.

UW PICKED THIRD IN PAC-10

Pac-10 coaches showed UW plenty of respect by picking Washington to finish third in the conference after the Huskies tied for fifth last season. The Huskies received two first-place votes and 36 total points to finish just behind 2008 Women's College World Series participant UCLA and defending national champion Arizona State. UCLA was picked to finish first with 43 points, followed by Arizona State, which received 41. Washington followed with 36 points, ahead of Arizona (34), Stanford (31), California (19) and Oregon and Oregon State, which tied for seventh with 10 points each. As it turned out, UW did one better by finishing second in the conference, just behind UCLA who proved the conference coaches to be quite sentient.

Head Coach Heather Tarr

Fifth Season
Alma Mater: Washington (1998)

Heather Tarr is in her fifth season at the helm of the Husky Softball team after leading the Huskies to their 15th consecutive postseason berth in 2008. In just four seasons, she has led Washington to the Super Regionals and a top-15 national ranking three times, including a No. 3 finish in 2007.

The 2008 season saw Tarr lead UW to its 15th consecutive postseason appearance despite the loss of All-American pitcher Danielle Lawrie, who redshirted the season to compete in the 2008 Olympic Games with Canada, as well as All-American Ashley Charters and Lauren Greer, who took the season off due to injuries. The Huskies compiled a 30-25-1 season - their 15th consecutive 30+ win season - advancing to the NCAA Regionals before falling to host Houston.

UW finished tied for fifth in the Pac-10, a conference which sent seven of its eight teams to the postseason. UW had two wins over No. 1 ranked teams during the season, including a 3-0 victory at eventual national champion Arizona State. UW also knocked off national semifinalist Alabama in its own Husky Softball Classic when the Crimson Tide were ranked No. 1. At the conclusion of the season, the Huskies landed six players on both the All-Pac-10 and All-Pac-10 Academic Teams, the latter of which marked the most Huskies honored since 2000.

In 2007, Tarr led the Huskies back to the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2004. Washington finished tied for third in the Pac-10 and went on to win the Lincoln, Nebraska regional before sweeping Alabama in the Super Regionals in Seattle to advance to the WCWS for the eighth time in school history.

The Huskies defeated DePaul, 3-1, to open the WCWS as sophomore All-American pitcher Danielle Lawrie pitched the 16th no-hitter in WCWS history and the first since 2003. Washington followed that up by defeating Northwestern, 9-0, as Lawrie threw a one-hitter.

Washington then ran into eventual national champion Arizona and lost two games to the Wildcats to finish tied for third in the country.

The Huskies finished the season with a 42-19 record and had three players earn All-America honors. Lawrie and senior first baseman Dena Tyson both were named to the

Louisville Slugger/NFCA First Team, while junior shortstop Ashley Charters was a second team selection.

The trio of players were also named to the WCWS All-Tournament team, marking the first UW players selected to the team since 2000, and earned All-Pacific Region honors. In addition, Charters, Lawrie, Tyson and three other UW players earned All-Pac-10 honors.

The Huskies tallied 14 wins over opponents ranked in the top-25, including a win on the road at No. 3 Arizona and a pair of wins over No. 2 Alabama in the Super Regionals. Washington also swept the season series with Oregon, which was ranked No. 10 during the two teams' first match up and No. 16 during the final two games, and picked up wins over No. 7 Arizona State, No. 8 Texas, No. 12 UCLA, No. 15/16 Stanford and No. 16 Oregon State. The Huskies also swept a pair of games from No. 6 LSU.

In 2006, Tarr and the Huskies swept through the Provo Regional as a No. 1 seed with tournament MVP Danielle Lawrie not allowing a run in three starts. The Huskies advanced to the Austin Super Regional where they fell to Cat Osterman's Texas Longhorns to just miss out on the WCWS berth.

Junior second baseman Dominique Lastrapes and sophomore utility Ashley Charters each earned third team All-America honors and five players received All-Pac-10 honors.

Washington finished the season with a 35-25 overall record and a No. 15 national ranking. The Huskies tallied 11 wins over opponents ranked in the top-25, including victories over No. 1 UCLA, No. 5 Oregon State and No. 5 Stanford.

In Tarr's first season at the UW, she led the Huskies to the Super Regional where they fell one game short of advancing to the WCWS. The Huskies' season came to an end when they lost a three-game series to eventual national champion Michigan in Ann Arbor and finished the year with a No. 14 national ranking.

Seven Huskies earned All-Pac-10 honors, including Kristen Rivera, who was named Co-Pac-10 Player of the Year. Rivera also became the Huskies' first-ever four-time All-American, earning first team honors as a catcher. Three Washington players earned All-Pacific Region honors and three were named to the Pac-10 All-Academic team for

their successes in the classroom.

Washington finished the season with a 35-22 record and finished sixth in the Pac-10 Conference with a 10-11 mark after four teams log-jammed in a tie for first place with 13-8 records.

The Huskies tallied 13 wins over opponents ranked in the top-25, including victories over No. 1 Michigan, No. 3 California and No. 4 Stanford.

Before taking over the Washington program, Tarr had a six-year stint at Pacific, starting as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in April of 2004.

During her six seasons at Pacific, the Tigers posted a 232-124 (.652) overall record and 90-44 (.672) mark in the Big West Conference.

In 2004, Tarr guided the Tigers to a top-20 national batting average. In 2001, she and Pacific head coach Brian Kolze were named the 2001 NFCA West Region Coaching Staff of the Year after guiding the Tigers to within one win of the Women's College World Series and a No. 18 final national ranking. That team also finished the season with a .973 fielding percentage, ranking second-best in the country.

Tarr joined Pacific prior to the 1999 season after an outstanding career as a Husky. As a four-year letterwinner, Tarr helped lead the UW to a second-place finish at the Women's College World Series in 1996 and a third-place finish in 1997.

She earned various honors while playing softball at Washington. A three-year member of the Pac-10 All-Academic team from 1994-97, she was named to the Pac-10 All-Conference team from 1995-97 and the NFCA All-West Region team in 1996 and 1997.

Tarr also worked at Washington as an undergraduate assistant coach during the 1998 season, helping the Huskies to a third-place finish at the 1998 Women's College World Series.

In addition to her collegiate experience, Tarr brings experience from the professional level as she spent the summer of 1997 as a member of the Women's Professional Fastpitch Softball League's Tampa Bay FireStix. She was the league leader in fielding percentage for first basemen and also led the league in walks.

Tarr earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Geography from Washington in 1998. She completed her Masters Degree in Education at Pacific in the fall of 2003. Tarr, 34, is a native of Redmond, Wash., and is a graduate of Redmond High School.
