## **2003 SEASON REVIEW**

One For The Record Books: The 2003 season saw the Washington women's tennis team finish the year with its highest final national ranking in the program's history. The Huskies opened the year at No. 21 and moved up to No. 6 by season's end. Washington also racked up an overall record of 19-4, the second-most wins under head coach Patty McCain and the third-highest win total in school history. The Huskies' second-place finish in the Pac-10 standings also matched its highest ever finish established in 2001. For good measure, UW had four singles players listed among the final individual national rankings, the most ever for a Husky squad. Dea Sumantri ranked 29th, Claire Carter ranked 43rd, Darija Klaic ranked 60th and Erin Boisclair ranked 61st. Only the 2001 season saw three Huskies earn final rankings: Kristina Kraszewski (No. 9), Carter (No. 32) and Klaic (94). Washington also made its seventh-straight postseason appearance and the sixth-straight under McCain. "I think everyone was pretty excited about the season and the way it went," McCain said. "It was exciting the whole road. The team was a very strong team, they definitely worked well together. There was a lot of shouting and excitement between the courts last year which was something we wanted to do from the time they all started. It was exciting to see all that come to fruition."

The Untouchables: Only four teams were able to defeat the Huskies in 2003, including just three during the regular season. Washington won 12 of its first 13 matches of the season, falling only to 39th-ranked Harvard, 4-3. The only other opponents to defeat Washington were secondranked Stanford (7-0) and fourth-ranked California (5-2). Handing the Huskies their final loss of the season was No. 11 UCLA in the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships. The Bruins just edged the Huskies, 4-3. UW had defeated the Bruins earlier in the season.

There's No Place Like Home: The Huskies went 11-0 at home last year, with nine of those wins coming against nationally ranked opponents. Whether in the Nordstrom Tennis Center or on the Quillian Courts, Washington dominated its home turf. The Huskies' good fortune at home included hosting the NCAA Regional. UW's route to Gainesville went through Seattle, as the Huskies downed unranked Southern 4-0, before following that up with a 4-0 sweep of No. 25 Illinois.

Streaking Huskies: Washington put together winning streaks of 10 and seven matches during the season. In its 10-match winning streak, UW held eight of those 10 opponents to one point or less including sweeps over No. 75 Marshall (7-

0), No. 49 BYU (5-0), and No. 42 Washington State (7-0). UW's closest match was a 4-3 win over Oregon at home. After a pair of uncharacteristic losses, the Huskies rebounded with a seven-match winning streak, which included five wins over Pac-10 opponents and two in the postseason. UW had shutout its last three-straight opponents (No. 52 WSU, 7-0; Southern, 4-0; No. 25 Illinois, 4-0) going into its NCAA Round of 16 match with UCLA in Gainesville.

UW Downs USC For First Time In School History: Included among Washington's outstanding team accomplishments in 2003 was its first-ever win over USC in the program's history. Until last year, the Women of Troy had defeated the Huskies nine times without meeting defeat. But the tides turned, with Washington pulling a commanding 6-1 victory over No. 2 USC. Not only was it the first win by a Husky team over a USC team, it was a win over the secondranked team in the nation. Instrumental in the team upset was an individual upset by Dea Sumantri at No. 1 singles over the fifth-ranked player in the nation, Jewel Peterson, 6-1, 6-2. The win by Sumantri clinched the match for Washington, making history for the Huskies. The win was especially memorable for the Huskies' six seniors, who had committed to finding that elusive victory. "Our seniors were committed to that," McCain said. "That was one of their big goals to beat USC before they graduated. I believe for our graduating seniors, the only team in the Pac-10 they didn't beat before they finished was Stanford which is a pretty good record."

Pac-10 Championship Wrap Up: Riding an outstanding team finish to the regular season, the Huskies entered the Pac-10 Individual

Championships in Ojai, Calif., with much optimism. Washington had four players competing in the main draw singles portion of the championship in Claire Carter, Darija Klaic, Erin Boisclair and Dea Sumantri. Carter and Klaic both suffered defeat in the opening round matches, with both Boisclair and Sumantri earning wins in the first round. In the second round, Boisclair took care of UCLA's Susi Wild in straight sets, while Sumantri fell to Stanford's Erin Burdette in straight sets. Boisclair advanced to the quarterfinals, eventually being ousted by Oregon's Daria Panova in straight sets. On the doubles side, Washington had two pairs advance all the way to the semifinals. Colleen Gray and Dea Sumantri, along with Claire Carter and Darija Klaic were two of the final four teams left standing. Both fell in the semis, with Gray and Sumantri falling to Fusano and Kops-Jones from California and Carter and Klaic falling to Mlakar and Scribot from Arizona.

Huskies Sweep Their Way To Gainesville: Following the Pac-10 Championships, it was time once again to turn their attention to team play. Granted the opportunity to host the first and second rounds, the Huskies made the most of their home courts advantage. Washington swept its way to Gainesville, shutting out both its opening round opponents in Southern (4-0) and No. 25 Illinois (4-0).

Bruins Edge Huskies In NCAA Round of 16: The Huskies headed to Gainesville, knowing they would face a familiar opponent in UCLA, an opponent they had already defeated once before that season. What they didn't know would shock them when they arrived. "We were really looking forward to the matchup and happy with our draw," McCain said. "Then we had the

unfortunate circumstance of the British players all being declared ineligible at the tournament when we got there. It was a bit of a shock and we were definitely impacted the most of any team that was there because Claire Carter was playing so high in our lineup (No. 1 doubles, No. 2 singles). Having to reorder our doubles teams really put us at a huge disadvantage." Carter, who was reinstated after the season, sat on the sidelines and watched as her teammates still nearly defeated the Bruins. UCLA won the doubles point, but the Huskies climbed back with some big singles wins. Darija Klaic upset No. 20" Jackie Carleton at No. 2 singles and Erin Boisclair upset No. 50 Susi Wild at No. 3. Dinka Hadzic, coming into the No. 6 spot at last minute notice, defeated Anya Loncaric in a hard fought three-set battle. But it wasn't enough, as Washington fell to the Bruins, 4-3.

Sumantri Advances To NCAA Singles Sweet

**16:** Sophomore Dea Sumantri pulled off a pair of upsets to advance to the Round of 16 of the NCAA Singles Championship held following the team portion of the competition. Sumantri, ranked 34th, upset No. 11 Alice Barnes of Stanford in the first round, 7-6(5), 6-3. She followed that performance with another straight-set upset over No. 30 Candice Fuchs of William & Mary, 6-1, 6-4. Sumantri didn't have enough to overtake the No. 3 player in the nation, Agata Cioroch from Georgia, in the Round of 16, falling 6-2, 6-4. But by advancing to the Sweet 16, Sumantri earned her first career All-America honors and became the fourth All-American in the UW women's tennis program. She followed in the footsteps of previous Husky All-Americans Kristina Kraszweski, Claire Carter and Darija Klaic. Sumantri was the third UW player to advance to the Sweet 16. Only Kraszweski advanced further in postseason play, making it to the NCAA Quarterfinals in 1998.

Three Huskies Earn All-America Accolades:

In addition to Sumantri's All-American performance, Claire Carter and Darija Klaic also earned doubles All-America honors for the second-straight year via their final 10<sup>th</sup>-place ranking. Due to Carter being declared ineligible just prior to the start of the championships, the longtime duo did not have a chance to compete in their final NCAA Championships. Last year marked the first time a total of three players earned All-America acclaim for Washington.

McCain Named Pac-10 Coach of the Year:

The Husky players weren't the only individuals awarded for excellence last year, as UW head coach Patty McCain was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year for the second time in three years. McCain also earned the honor in 2001 after guiding her Huskies to a 21-8 overall record and a second-place tie in the Pac-10. Washington made a vast improvement in Pac-10 play from 2002 to 2003. In 2002, Washington finished in a tie for eighth-place, before turning around finishing in a second-place tie in 2003.

More UW Records: The 2002-2003 season saw many Husky players etch their names in both the single season and career record books. With 26 wins by the doubles pair of Carter and Klaic, the duo set a new Husky record for doubles wins in a single season. They bested their teammate Erin Hoe, who had 25 doubles wins in 2000-01. Dea Sumantri also notched 30 singles wins, just two shy of tying Carter's record of 32 set in 2000-01. Not far behind Sumantri was Erin Boisclair, with 29 singles wins good for fourth place on the all-time list. Sumantri's 76.9 winning

percentage (30-9 record) in singles also ranked 10th on the single season list. Three graduating seniors also left their mark on UW career records. Klaic set the UW career record for doubles wins with 84, while Colleen Gray finished her career tied for ninth with 59 doubles wins. Gray also finished in sixth-place on the career singles wins list with 72. Boisclair ended her career in ninth-place on the UW singles winning percentage list with a 69.7 clip (46-20).

Thanks For The Memories: Washington said goodbye to six seniors at season's end: Amy Allen, Erin Boisclair, Kathy Chi, Andrea Coulter, Colleen Grav and Darija Klaic. All six players were instrumental in making the Washington program one of the tops in the nation. Before 2000, a Husky team had never advanced past the first round of the NCAA Championships. In the last four years, UW advanced to the second round at least three times including trips to the Sweet 16 (2003) and the NCAA quarterfinals (2001). The last four years also saw Washington post an overall record of 66-33. In two of those four years, the Huskies also finished in a second-place tie in the Pac-10 standings. Since 2000, Washington has seen its final national ranking improve from No. 30 in 2000 to No. 6 in 2003.



### LLOYD NORDSTROM TENNIS CENTER



Located just north of Husky Stadium, the Lloyd Nordstrom Tennis Center is one of the Northwest's most modern indoor tennis facilities. The doors of the indoor facility at the University of Washington were opened with dedication ceremonies on June 1, 1989.

The tennis center, sporting six courts, was made possible by a \$2.5 million donation from the family of the late Lloyd Nordstrom. Mr. Nordstrom played on the Husky varsity tennis team from 1930–1932 and was noted for his love of the game and his loyalty to the University. Illsley Nordstrom, his wife, said, "My family is proud to honor the memory of Lloyd W. Nordstrom with the presentation of this indoor tennis center to the University of Washington . . . we feel he would be honored and delighted."

All six courts at the Center have been renamed by Husky tennis donors. In 1999, Court Two was renamed Sosnowy Court in honor of the family that donated the first fully endowed scholarship for women's tennis. LaGayle and John Sosnowy established the Sosnowy Family Endowed Tennis Scholarship in recognition of their daughter and former Husky, Kori Sosnowy.

Then later in the summer, the Sosnowy's dedicated Court One to UW's athletic director, naming it Barbara Hedges Court. John, LaGayle and Kori Sosnowy also established the Barbara Hedges Endowed Women's Tennis Scholarship.

The Sosnowy's also dedicated Court Three to UW senior associate athletic director, Marie Tuite. They also established the Marie Tuite Endowed Women's Tennis Scholarship.

Court Four was named the Sedlock Family Court in recognition of the Thomas J. Sedlock Endowed Men's Tennis Scholarship established by Tom and Greta Sedlock.

Court Five was named "Sidney Pinch Court" in August 1990, in recognition of the \$100,000 donation made by Pinch to the Washington tennis program. Pinch, a long-time Seattle

businessman and Tyee Club member, made the donation to fund, in perpetuity, one tennis scholarship each year.

The last court to be named was Court Six in 2003, named for Neal Dempsey in recognition of the Neal Dempsey Endowed Scholarship.

In addition to the six courts, the complex includes seating for up to 278 spectators, locker rooms, a snack bar and space for other support activities.

The Lloyd

Nordstrom Tennis Center aids the Huskies in recruiting the nation's top competitors to Seattle. Prior to the opening of the tennis center, Husky tennis teams rented indoor courts for use during periods of cold and inclement weather.

In September of 1989, the Nordstrom Center was


In September of 1989, the Nordstrom Center was selected by the USTA's Technical Committee as one of the outstanding tennis facilities for 1989.

The USTA Facility Awards Program, now in its 20th year, was established to stimulate high standards in the construction industry and then to recognize facilities which make such a positive statement about the vitality of the game.

The tennis facility is used primarily as a competition and practice site for the Husky varsity men's and women's tennis teams. The center has also been made available to UW students, staff and faculty as scheduling permits.

Lori Pursley is in her 11th year as manager of the Nordstrom Tennis Center, performing a variety of duties. Along with scheduling times for use of the courts, Pursley also is the event manager, supervises the front desk staff, provides support for the varsity programs, and is responsible for the overall operation of the facility.





### BILL QUILLIAN STADIUM

Bill Quillian (pictured at left) has long been associated with tennis at the University of Washington, as a player, a coach and a member of the Husky Hall of Fame. His legacy was honored years ago when the University of Washington tennis courts were named in his memory. With renovation, and the possible expansion of Quillian Stadium this year, the Husky tennis teams make their outdoor home on those courts.

Quillian began his stellar tennis career at Washington in 1952 and advanced to the

quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship as a freshman with Don Fly. That duo had won the U.S. National Juniors Championship in 1951. Quillian also earned a berth in the NCAA Singles Championships all four years, finishing runner-up in 1955. He is the only Husky to have represented the United States in the Davis Cup, doing so in 1958.

As coach, Quillian compiled a 63-39 record from 1966 to 1973. His winning percentage of .618 and his win total both rank fourth among all Husky tennis coaches.

### WHAT THE HUSKY COACHES SAY ...

### Patty McCain:
