2007-08 (Sophomore): Washington's No. 4 singles player was 12-8 in that spot and 14-13 overall in singles ... held the No. 1 doubles spot in every match along with Tara Simpson,

going 10-11 in dual matches and was 15-14 overall in doubles ... posted a six-match win streak from Jan. 27 to Feb. 17 ... came through in two 4-3 Husky victories, defeating Illinois' Shivani Dave, 6-2, 6-4, and outlasting Arizona State's Micaela Hein, 6-2, 5-7, 6-2, to even the score at 3-3 in Washington's upset of the Sun Devils ... was 2-0 against Washington State, defeating Bianca Selaru and Aleksandra Cekić ... was up one set to none against Morgan Frank in UW's NCAA match against Texas A&M when the Aggies clinched ... went to three sets against Stanford's 46th-ranked Whitney Deason, and lots a third-set super-tiebreak to UCLA's Yasmin Schnack, also ranked 46th at the time ... earned ranked win in doubles with Simpson, defeating ASU's 28th-ranked Nadia and Laila Abdala, 8-6 ... challenged the eventual NCAA Doubles Champions, Tracy Lin and Riza Zalameda of UCLA, taking the Bruin team to 9-7 down in L.A. ... got the season off on the right foot by winning the San Diego State Fall Classic #2 doubles title in the fall, defeating SDSU's Bagshaw and Krausova, 9-7, in the final ... was named honorable mention Pac-10 All-Academic, and received an Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar award for work in the classroom.

2006-07 (Freshman): Played in every dual match for the Huskies and was the only player with a winning dual singles record at 11-10 playing mostly at No. 2 and 3 singles but also briefly at Nos. 4 and 5 ... was an impressive 5-3 at No. 2 singles ... 16-14 singles record overall, leading the team in wins ... was Washington's No. 1 doubles player in all but two matches, going 4-11 at No. 1 with Mathilde Cor, and 1-3 at No. 1 with Victoria Brymer ... was 9-19 in doubles with three different partners, most often with Mathilde Cor, the two of which posted an overall 7-14 record ... earned singles wins in both of UW's two conference wins over WSU and Oregon ... had a three-set win over Illinois' Shivani Dave at No. 3 singles in UW's 4-3 win, its first of

the season. Also won at No. 1 doubles with Cor to help the Huskies to a 2-1 doubles point win ... 6-3, 7-6 win over Arizona's Kasia Jakowlew at No. 3 singles was one of UW's two points in the loss ... fell to 2006 NCAA Champion Susie Babos of Cal in the first round of the Pac-10 Championships, 6-2, 6-3, but defeated WSU's Ekaterina Burduli in the back draw ... reached the Round of 32 after two wins at the ITA Regionals in the fall.

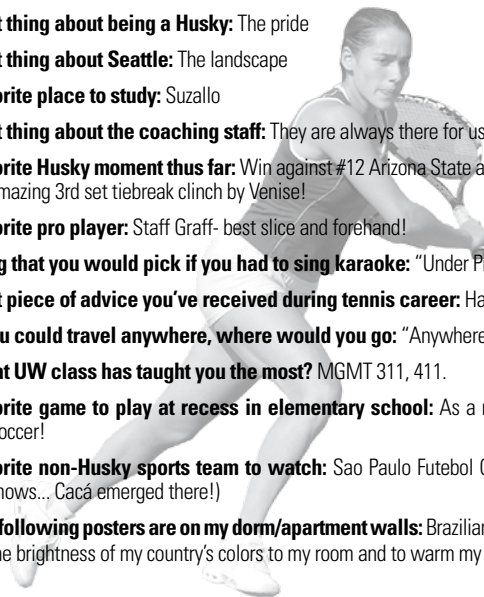

At Washington

Fall: Ranked 28th during the fall ... went 7-2 in singles play and 6-1 in doubles with Denise Dy ... won the SDSU Fall Classic singles title, defeating players from UC Irvine, Colorado, Oklahoma, and teammate Dy in the final ... reached the round of 16 in singles at ITA Regionals and made the quarterfinals with Dy in doubles, falling in a tough 8-6 match to 24th-ranked Ilcinkas and Cossou of Cal ... went 1-1 at ITA All-American Championships, defeating 47th-ranked Nina Much-Soeggard and losing in three sets to 109th-ranked Bianca Eichkorn of Miami ... won the SDSU Fall Classic doubles title with Dy.

2007-08 (Freshman): Turned in one of the best freshman seasons in Husky history and became the first Husky to compete in the NCAA Singles Championship since 2005 ... named to the All-Pac-10 second team ... started every match at No. 1 singles, going 15-6 in the top spot and 21-10 overall in singles ... finished the season ranked 37th in the ITA Rankings after debuting at No. 41 in the rankings on Mar. 4 ... was ranked a season-best 30th on two occasions becoming the first Husky freshman to earn a Top-30 ranking since Claire Carter in 2001 ... based on the final rankings, she defeated nine ranked opponents, four of which were NCAA Singles Tournament entrants ... in the NCAA First Round, lost to Duke's 24th-ranked Reka Zsilinszka, 6-2, 7-5 ... in Washington's NCAA First Round dual against Texas A&M, she defeated Elze Potgieter, 6-4, 6-1, in the top spot for UW's only point ... won 15 of her first 17 matches, including a 12-match win streak from Nov. 9 through Feb. 17 ... named Pac-10 Player of the Week for the week of Feb. 11-17 during which she led UW to wins over Purdue and Illinois ... routed 2006 NCAA Singles Champion, Cal's Susie Babos, 6-0, 6-1 in dual play ... followed that win up with a 4-6, 6-2, (10-6) win over USC's Lindsey Nelson, the defending Pac-10 Champion and NCAA Singles Finalist in 2006 and 2007 ... the highlight of her season, and the team as a whole, came in UW's match against 12th-ranked Arizona State, when she saved match point to prevail 5-7, 6-3, 7-6 (5) against 28th-ranked Nadia Abdala, clinching a 4-3 upset win that propelled UW into the NCAA Championships ... additional wins over ranked opponents included No. 28 Katrina Zheltova of Sacramento State, No. 57 Ekaterina Burduli of Washington State, No. 64 Anastasia Surkova of BYU, No. 74 Celine Rolly of Oregon, and No. 94 Sophie Kobuch of Hawaii ... started at No. 2 doubles in every match with freshman Kelsey Anonsen, going 12-9 in dual play and 13-10 overall

... reached the Pac-10 Quarterfinals with Anonsen, defeating 53rd-ranked Lumpkin and Wetmore of UCLA, 8-4, in the first round ... ended the fall by winning both the Flight I singles and doubles titles at the Husky Invite.
