SENIOR KAITLIN LECK



2003 (JUNIOR): Played in 95 games and all 32 matches, making 23 starts ... averaged 3.09 points per game, 2.44 kills per game and 1.11 digs per game ... ranked second on the team with 0.32 aces per game, while her kpg average ranked fourth ... posted double figure kills 14 times, including all four postseason matches ... had 14 kills against New Hampshire (Aug. 30) and California (Oct. 24) ... posted 13 kills against USC (Oct. 31) and Utah (Dec. 6) ... hit .400 or better five times, including a career-best .650 against Utah in the NCAA second round (Dec. 6) ... notched a career-best nine blocks vs. Oregon State (Oct. 11), while also logging a season-best four aces in that match ... collected seven or more digs five times ... Pac-10 Academic All-Conference honorable mention.
