MCLAUGHLIN ON DANICIC: "Danka has one of the best feels for the game of any player I've coached. She sees things very well and therefore is in the right place at the right time. Her digging is contagious and we score points when she is on the floor. Her passing consistency is improving and she has a great serve but needs to reduce her errors."

MCLAUGHLIN ON MYHRE: "Darla is not afraid to get after it in practice. I think she really enjoys competing. We challenged her to develop her arm speed and she has made progress. It's been hard and taken time but she keeps pushing herself and she is starting to see a return. She needs to address serving the same way and improve her mechanics. In terms of blocking, she should be one of the best, if not the best, in the country."

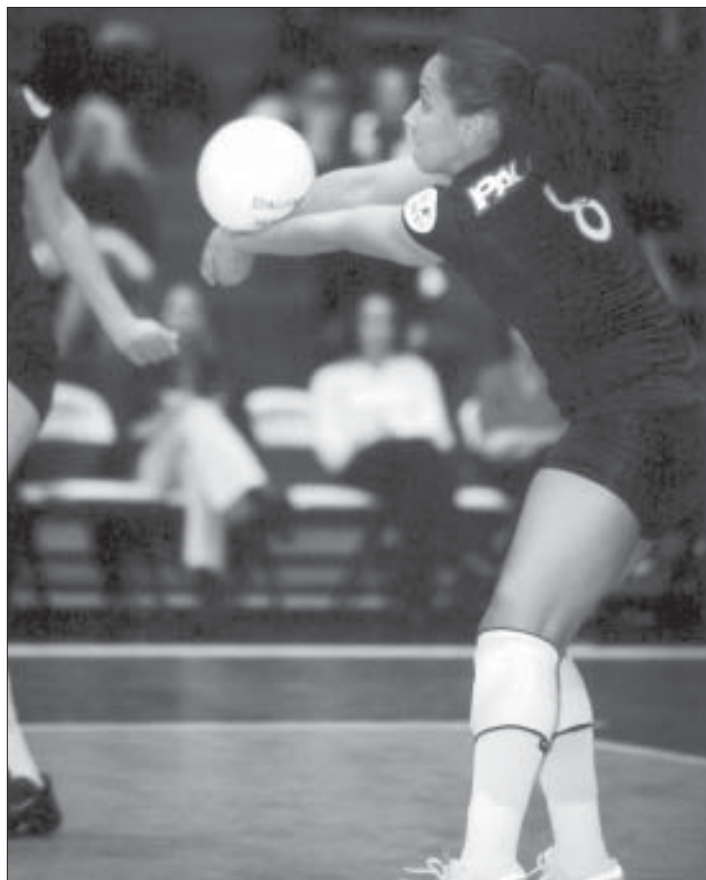

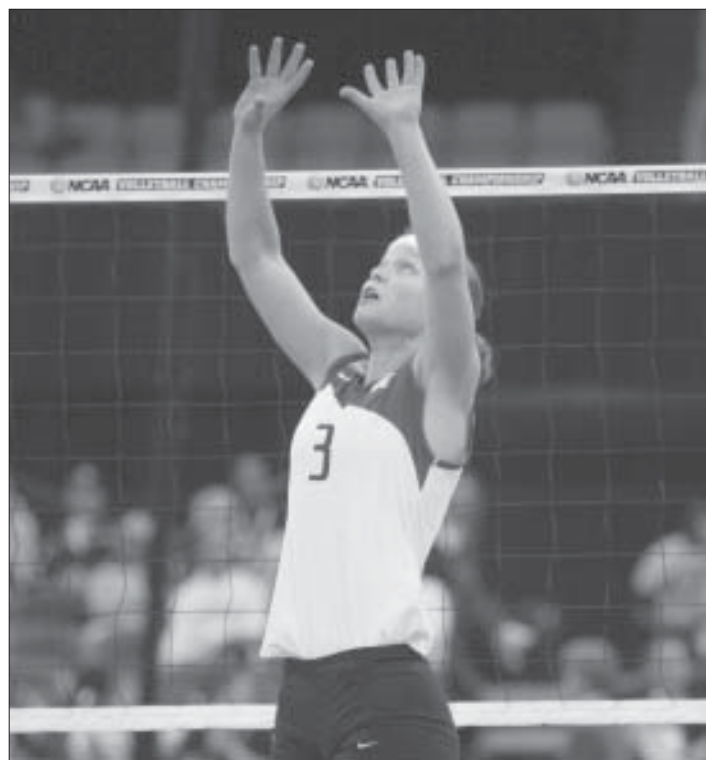
