

# WINDERMERE CUP / OPENING DAY

Washington ushers in the 2000 rowing season with yet another elite international field for the 14th annual Windermere Cup/Opening Day races, on Montlake Cut, May 6. Known in rowing circles as a premier opening day regatta, rowers enjoy spectacular racing and festivities that culminate in one of the most-watched events in the sport.

The feature races' sponsorship by Windermere Real Estate, Inc., which began in 1987, draws major national and international crews each year to the Windermere Cup Races. The Opening Day Regatta has been a traditional part of the opening of yachting

season since 1970, and women's intercollegiate races were added to the schedule in 1976. The regatta is the preliminary event to the annual yacht club parade which signals the beginning of boating season in the Pacific Northwest. Tie-up moorage is available on both sides of Montlake Cut, extending out from the Cut toward the start line of the race in Lake Washington, providing an ideal setting for spectators to view both the regatta and the parade of yachts that follows. Thousands of watersport enthusiasts have lined the Cut in recent years to witness first-hand one of the most exciting sporting events in the region—the Windermere Cup Races and Opening Day activities.

## MEN

The Husky men's varsity eight has won 22 of the 30 Opening Day titles contested. Last year the Husky men's varsity eight rowed to victory, taking its ninth consecutive Windermere Cup title. The men's junior varsity eight has won 21 of 30 Opening Day titles, while the freshman eight has won 21 of 28 titles. Last year the junior varsity eight won the Windermere Cascade Cup Race, after having broken a streak of six straight wins the previous year. The frosh eight took first in its race for the seventh consecutive season.

The Husky women's varsity eight has won 16 of the 23 Opening Day titles. Last year, the women won after having broken a six-year winning streak in 1998. In junior varsity eight races, Washington's women have been victorious in 18 of 21 years, including first-place finishes in the past nine years and seven Windermere Cascade Cup races. The Husky novice eight has 18 victories in 22 races.

# SAN DIEGO CREW CLASSIC

The San Diego Crew Classic started in 1973 with just 11 events on its schedule and has grown to more than three times that size with over 40 races held annually. Women's events were first added to the race program in 1978. The Classic is considered the nation's premier early-

season regatta, with crews from the east coast and midwest making the trip west to Mission Bay. The UW has claimed more titles at the event than any other program.

## MEN

Washington's men's crew swept the varsity, junior varsity and freshman races in the first San Diego Crew Classic. Through the years, the Husky varsity eight has won the Copley Cup 13 times, with the most recent varsity eight win coming in 1998.

### Crew 'Classics'

1973 - Washington sweeps varsity, JV and frosh eights against Navy in the first Crew Classic.

1975 - Led by Olympians Dick Cashin and Al Sheely, Harvard makes first appearance and defeats Washington.

1977 - Penn edges Washington on the final stroke

1983 - Crew Classic becomes one of first major regattas to put women's events on equal footing with men's championship races.

1990 - Washington wins but finishes last in re-row after officials rule race was started before every crew was ready. Appeal to U.S. Rowing Association returns victory to Huskies.

1995 - Huskies sweep all six major men's and women's events.

## MEN'S VARSITY EIGHT

The Washington-California men's varsity eight dual series dates back to 1903, with 89 meetings between the two schools. At stake is the Schoch Cup, named after Delos Schoch of Washington's class of 1936. Schoch lettered three years (1934-36) as a Husky oarsman. Washington currently leads the varsity series 63-24-1.

## Men's Junior Varsity Eight

Washington's junior varsity eight series with California dates back to 1939, with Washington winning 36 of 56 races since that time. There were no races between 1943 and 1946. The Huskies' longest win streak is five wins from 1971 through 1975 and again from 1940 through 1948. California's longest win streak is three wins from 1979 through 1981. The UW has won 10 of the past 16 races, winning back-to-back races in 1993 and 1994 to end a three-year win streak begun by the Bears in 1989.

## Men's Freshman Eight

Washington's freshman eight series with California dates back to 1939, with Washington winning 47 of 56 races since that time. There were no races from 1944 through 1946. The Huskies' longest win streak is 15 consecutive from 1966 through 1980. Prior to last season, California's only back-to-back titles were won in 1981 and 1982, and in 1940 and 1941.

## Women's Junior Varsity Eight

Washington's junior varsity eight series with California dates back to 1975, with Washington winning 20 of 23 races since that time. There was no JV eight race in 1983 or 1995. The Huskies' longest win streak is 10 wins from 1979 through 1989. California has never won back-to-back races. The UW has won 15 of the past 17 races, including the past seven consecutively. Cal's last win was in 1990.

## Women's Novice Eight

Washington's novice eight series with California dates back to 1977, with Washington winning 17 of 22 races since that time. The Huskies' longest win streak is nine straight from 1990-98. California has never won back-to-back titles. The UW has won 14 of the past 16 races, including the last nine consecutively. Cal's last win was in 1989. The novice boats did not race in 1999.

# PACIFIC COAST / PAC-10 CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Pacific-10 Conference Championship is now a separate entity from the Pacific Coast Rowing Championships this year, with the Pacific-10 Champi-

onship Regatta scheduled for Lake Natoma in Sacramento, Calif., May 14.

## MEN

UW has dominated the Pacific Coast / Pacific-10 Rowing Championships, winning 28 varsity eight titles in 40 tries. From 1971 to 1978, the UW won

successive championships in the varsity eight competition. The Huskies equaled the feat with an eighth straight win in 1997.

## WOMEN

Washington first participated in women's crew as an intercollegiate sport in 1976, and competed in the Pacific Coast Championships that year. Complete results for all years are not available. In addition to the titles listed, Washington won lightweight eight championships in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1980. The UW women's varsity eight has dominated the competition at the conference championships, winning its eighth straight title in 1999. In 1999, the Huskies swept all four races for the sixth time in conference history.

Dick Erickson, Washington rowing coach for 20 seasons (1968-87) coached the Huskies to 15 Pacific Coast titles.
