### Setting the Scene: Huskies Travel To Oregon State & Washington State

The Washington men's crew program makes a rare appearance in Oregon on April 9 as the No. 1 Huskies open the intercollegiate portion of their schedule. UW will be taking four boats (varsity 8+, second varsity 8+, varsity 4+ and freshmen 8+) to Dexter Lake in the Willamete Valley to race No. 16 Oregon State at 12:30 p.m.

The event is held in conjunction with the Covered Bridge Regatta, which features masters and juniors competitors from all across the Pacific Northwest.

A few select men's boats will travel to the Palouse to face Washington State's men's club program on the Snake River in Lewiston, Idaho.

### Huskies Coaching Staff

Now in his fourth year as head coach of the men's program, **Michael Callahan** is coming off a season where the Huskies captured their fourth straight Ten Eyck trophy. In 2009, Washington swept all three races at the IRA Regatta (and thereby earning the Ten Eyck Trophy), becoming the first team to accomplish the feat since the Huskies also did so in 1997. Prior to taking over the men's coaching position, Callahan served for three seasons as the Huskies freshmen coach. A 1996 graduate of the University of Washington, Callahan has also been an active member on the international level, where he's competed and coached. **Luke McGee** handles the coaching duties for the freshmen, who are coming off a historic undefeated season in 2009.

### Last Time Out

This marks the first intercollegiate event for the men's crew program this spring. Unofficially, the Huskies began the spring racing season on the Montlake Cut with the 110th Class Day Regatta on March 26. The junior men took advantage of an inadvertant air horn to walk past the seniors in the George M. Varnell eight race.

### Captains

Each year after the Class Day Regatta, the Huskies select two captains to lead their program into the brunt of the spring season. Senior **Maxwell Weaver** will sport the star on Washington's traditional white oars for the men's crew program.

### About Oregon State University

Oregon State Beavers is ranked No. 15 in the nation according to the USRowing Collegiate poll. The Beavers are coached by Steve Todd, who is in his fourth year coaching in Corvallis. Todd is a 2000 graduate of Washington and is a Seattle-area native.

The Beavers competed last week at the San Diego Crew Classic, finishing fourth in the Grand Final battle for the Copley Cup. OSU crossed the finish line with a time of 6:11.10, behind Cal's winning time of 5:54.90.

### Dexter Lake

The 2,000-meter, seven-lane course on Dexter Lake is located on Lowell State Park, which is 22 miles southeast of Eugene, Ore. To reach the course from I-5, take Hwy. 58 eastbound (exit 188A), 13 miles to Dexter Lake.

### Scouting The Huskies

The Huskies, the four-time defending Ten Eyck champions, are ranked No. 1 in the nation to start the season. Washington has eight of nine student-athletes from the varsity 8+ that finished just behind Cal for the National Championship last June at the IRAs.
